



What's on the May 7th Ballot?

Voters in the Walled Lake **Consolidated School District will** consider a bond proposal focused on creating a modern learning environment for students along with updating our facilities related to health, safety, security, energy conservation, and more.

The proposal authorizes the issuance of \$250 million in bonds, touching every building in our District, while decreasing our bond debt millage rate.

Program Enhancements

Goals of **Bond 2024**

- Continue safety and security upgrades throughout the district
- Upgrade our schools to support expanded learning opportunities
- Increase operational efficiencies and reduce energy and utility costs
- Upgrade current technology
- Implement major capital improvements while reducing the current debt millage rate by 0.08 mills

Elementary Upgrades

- Playground equipment enhancement
- New digital signs
- New flag poles and lights
- Paving, sidewalks, and roadway upgrades
- Replacement of North Entry Canopy at Glengary
- Interior renovations (ceilings, carpet, LED lights where needed) and HVAC/electrical upgrades at multiple buildings



- Upgrade and enhance existing video surveillance system
- Upgrade and enhance existing electronic door controls throughout the district

Safety & Security

- Enhance public address systems across the district
- Improved emergency responder systems
- Hardening of physical buildings using up-to-date technologies





Technology

- Fiber optic network updates across the District

- Updated networking equipment to further facilitate high-speed network connectivity within and between buildings

- New video displays and audio systems in each classroom for brighter and higher resolution

New Wixom Elementary



Originally built in 1949, Wixom Elementary will be replaced on a new site owned by the District. It will result in a state-of-the-art facility as well as improved storm water management measures, right of way improvements, and traffic safety devices.

Alignment at our Middle Schools

Consolidation of 4 schools into 3 allows equitable spaces for enriched programming at each location while meeting the District's Strategic Plan. The District will study middle school alignment to assure the most optimum solution for our students and staff. With passage of the bond, money would be allocated to the repurposing of one of our middle schools.

Financial & Election Info

Tax Impact of Bond 2024

Bond 2024, estimated at \$250 million will not increase the tax rate. If the bond passes, our annual debt millage is expected to decrease by .08 mills. This decrease is achievable by restructuring the debt and extending the millage rate. This keeps the WLCSD bond debt rate among the lowest in the area.

Debt Millage Comparison



Walled Lake ranks 23rd lowest of 28 Oakland County Districts for bond debt millage rate.



Nationwide research has shown that improving school district facilities may:

- Protect and improve property values
- Create a positive impact on student enrollment

Savings Provided by Bond 2024

- HVAC system upgrades provide more efficient systems and operational cost savings
- Replacing existing lighting with LED fixtures provides considerable energy cost savings
- Emergency backup generators will allow the District to continue instruction when there is a power outage
- Significant service and repair costs will be saved with the new technology systems, the multi-function copiers, and most other new systems
- Upgraded energy management systems will conserve energy and significantly reduce energy and utility costs

Early Voting on Site

Early voting is open nine (9) consecutive days beginning on the second Saturday before the election and ending on the Sunday before the election. Early voting is from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. except on Thursday when the hours are noon to 8:00 p.m.
