Jefferson W. Highfill Field dedication continued:

We honored Coach Highfill, long time educator, football coach and soccer coach at William Byrd High School by naming the turf field Jefferson W Highfill Field.

Coach Highfill, taught math for 35 years, coached football for 38 years, and coached soccer for 35 years, a program he started at William Byrd High School.

He has been recognized as Coach of the Year 32 times. All together he had 657 wins, 48 Championships and 5 Team Sportsmanship Awards. He is recognized in the Virginia High School League Hall of Fame for his achievements as a soccer coach.

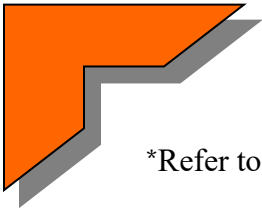

Attendance Procedures

*Refer to RCPS policy for Excused Absences and Tardies

To notify the school of an absence, you may call 562-3700 ext. 24008 and leave a voice message with the students name, grade and reason for absence. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PHONE CALL DOES NOT EXCUSE THE ABSENCE! The call lets us know you are aware of your child's absence and prevents us from calling you. A written acceptable excuse (in compliance with RCPS policy) must be submitted to the attendance office when the student returns to school.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES. Please note that students cannot be checked out of school per a phone call. In order to check your student out, you must use one of the following options:

- 1) Send a written note to the school with the student that indicates the student name, reason for check out and the time to be dismissed along with the parent/guardian's contact number and signature. The note should be turned in to the attendance office when the student arrives at school. At that time, a check out pass will be issued that allows the student to leave at the designated time.
- 2) Send an email to wbhsattendance@rcps.us that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 3) Send a fax to 540-890-7568 that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 4) An authorized emergency contact may come to the school with a PHOTO ID and sign the student out at the attendance window. Only persons listed on the student's emergency card will be allowed to sign the student out.

COLLEGE VISITS/OUT OF TOWN TRIPS. A minimum of two days prior written notice must be submitted to the attendance office for college visits or out of town trips to be considered excused. Once submitted, the student will be issued a Prior Notice Form that must be signed by all teachers and returned to the attendance office prior to the absence. Failure to follow these procedures will result in the absence(s) being unexcused.

STUDENT DRESS CODE

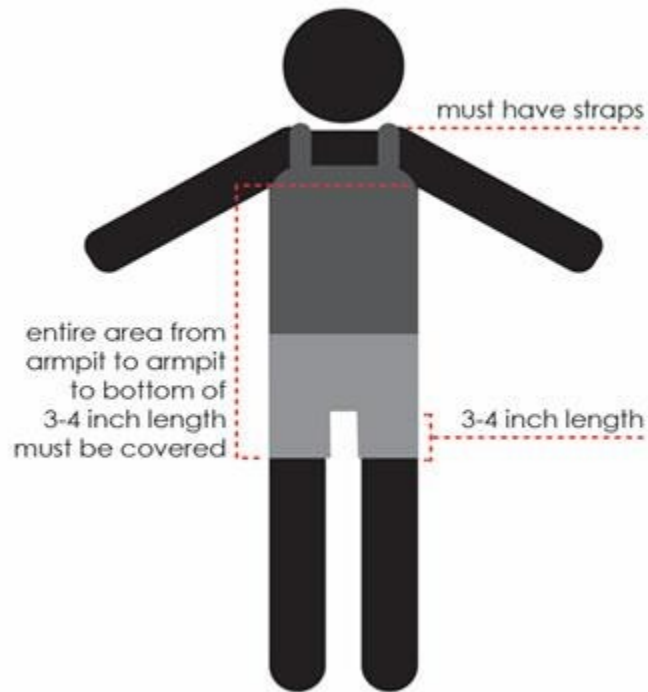
Roanoke County Public Schools respects students' rights to express themselves in the way they dress.

All students who attend Roanoke County Public Schools are also expected to respect the school community by dressing appropriately for a K-12 educational environment. Student attire should facilitate participation in learning as well as the health and safety of students and the adults that supervise them.

This policy is intended to provide guidance for students, staff, and parents.

Minimum Requirements:

1. Clothing must cover areas from one armpit across to the other armpit, down to approximately 3 to 4 inches in length on the upper thighs (see images below). Tops must have shoulder straps. Rips or tears in clothing should be lower than the 3 to 4 inches in length.
2. Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the school environment (pajamas, bedroom shoes or slippers shall not be worn, except for school activities approved by the principal).
3. See-through or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of the dress code.
4. Headgear including hats, hoodies, and caps are not allowed unless permitted for religious, medical, or other reason by school administration.
5. Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.



Additional Requirements:

1. Clothing may not depict, imply, advertise, or advocate illegal, violent, or lewd conduct, weapons, or the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.
2. Clothing may not depict or imply pornography, nudity, or sexual acts.
3. Clothing may not display or imply vulgar, discriminatory, or obscene language or images.
4. Clothing may not state, imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected classification.
5. Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building.
6. Clothing and accessories that endanger student or staff safety may not be worn.
7. Apparel, jewelry, accessories, tattoos, or manner of grooming that, by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a gang that advocates illegal or disruptive behavior is prohibited.

The administration at each school reserves the right to determine what constitutes appropriate dress. Students who do not adhere to these guidelines will not be allowed to attend class. Parents will be called if appropriate clothing is not available or the student refuses dress-code appropriate clothing.

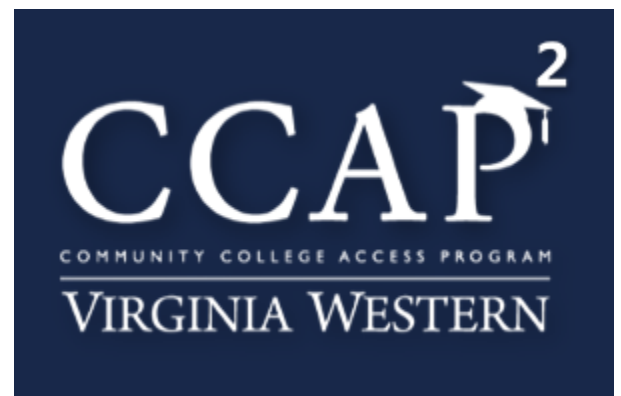
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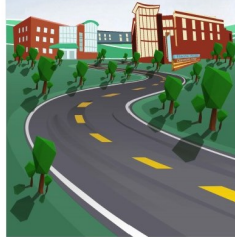

SENIORS and SENIOR PARENTS: Seniors if you are applying to college and need to order transcripts through Parchment, please pay attention to deadlines! If you have schools with an early January deadline, you need to request those by December 9th to make sure we get them to colleges before break. Get started on your FAFSA! It opened on October 1st and schools set their own priority deadlines.

SENIORS and SENIOR PARENTS: CCAP (Community College Access Program) applications opened on October 1st and must be completed by February 1st. Information Meetings are scheduled for November 10, December 8, January 10, and January 19 in Whitman Theater on the ground floor of the Hall Family Business Science Building from 6:00 – 7:00 PM.

2023 CCAP CHECKLIST

Who may apply for CCAP?

- Spring 2023 graduating seniors from Botetourt County, Craig County, Franklin County, Roanoke City, Roanoke County, and Salem City Public High Schools
- Homeschool and private school 2023 graduating seniors from Botetourt County, Craig County, Franklin County, Roanoke County or Salem City
- Graduating seniors must have resided in their school district and attended their division's high school during their junior and senior years. (*CCAP will not pay out-of-state tuition.*)
- Roanoke County residents graduating from any high school in the six localities served by Virginia Western may apply for CCAP.
- CCAP applicants must finish high school with a specific minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA). A minimum 2.5 GPA is required on final high school transcript. In Roanoke City, a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA is required on final high school transcript.

CCAP APPLICATION

OPENS: OCTOBER 1, 2022 • CLOSES: FEBRUARY 1, 2023

1. SUBMIT VIRGINIA WESTERN APPLICATION at <http://www.viriniawestern.edu> before February 1, 2023.

You must include **YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN)** on the Virginia Western application.

You must qualify for Virginia in-state resident status.

Have you taken dual-enrolled classes? Email Allison Dooley at adooley@viriniawestern.edu in the Virginia Western Recruitment Department to confirm your Virginia Western application is active and your Social Security Number (SSN) is on your application.

2. SUBMIT the 2023 – 2024 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) before the February 1, 2023 CCAP deadline at <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>.

Your **SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN) on the FAFSA MUST MATCH THE SSN** on your Virginia Western application.

Select Virginia Western (federal code: 003760) on the FAFSA as a school to receive your FAFSA information.

IMPORTANT: Submitting your FAFSA does not mean it is complete. The VWCC Office of Financial Aid may have follow-up questions or requests for documentation for you or your parents/guardians to answer before determining the amount of financial aid you will be awarded. Determination of your financial aid award is a required part of the CCAP application process.

Starting February 1, 2023, check messages and status of your VWCC financial aid application:

Log into your MyVWCC account at <https://vw.my.vccs.edu>.

Click on the Student Information Center (SIS) icon.

Click on Student Center>Student Message Center for communication from VWCC Office of Financial Aid.

Review and resolve items in your To Do List in the Student Message Center.

When complete, you receive a "Financial Aid Award Determination" in your Student Message Center.

ALL questions/items related to your FAFSA and VWCC financial aid process must be resolved by June 1, 2023 for your CCAP application to be considered complete.

3. COMPLETE Direct Enrollment Survey for academic placement by February 1, 2023 CCAP deadline.

After you submit the Virginia Western application (no. 1 above), go to desurvey.vccs.edu and log on using your MyVWCC username and password to complete survey.

4. COMPLETE CCAP APPLICATION at viriniawestern.edu/ccap between **October 1, 2022 and February 1, 2023.**

- Use your **“MyVWC ” login and password to access the application** .

(Note: the Virginia Western application and the CCAP application are two different applications. Both must be submitted for C CA consideration.)

DEADLINE FOR ALL CCAP APPLICATION STEPS: FEBRUARY 1, 2023



The Community College Access Program (CCAP) is a public/private tuition funding program offered and administered by Virginia Western Community College Educational Foundation, Inc. Current-year high school graduates who meet program guidelines receive a combination of federal/state financial aid and donor funding up to the cost of tuition. **The program covers the cost of tuition for degree or certificate completion or a maximum of three (3) years** at Virginia Western Community College for all accepted students. CCAP supports as many students as possible, based on student need and funds available for the program, but does not guarantee acceptance to every applicant. **Textbooks, class-specific fees and IncludedED fees are not included.**

IMPORTANCE OF CHECKING EMAIL & MESSAGE CENTER

Students are required to provide a personal email address on the Virginia Western application.

Incoming students do not have access to their Virginia Western email until they enroll in fall semester classes.

CCAP applicants should frequently check for email communications from the Virginia Western Educational Foundation.

Once the FAFSA has been submitted, CCAP applicants should check their VWCC student account Message Center and personal email account listed on the VWCC application for communications from the Office of Financial Aid.

Failure to complete requests from the Office of Financial Aid will prevent financial aid review process to continue (or complete).

Students will be notified of conditional CCAP acceptance by the Virginia Western Educational Foundation through their personal email.

CCAP PERFORMANCE/ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

New CCAP students are required to complete the Virginia Western Discover orientation and the online CCAP CSI Survey in the summer after high school graduation before fall classes start.

CCAP students must maintain a minimum Virginia Western **cumulative 2.5 GPA (2.0 GPA for Roanoke City)**. Students who do not maintain the minimum cumulative GPA at the end of any semester will not be eligible to receive CCAP funds during any future semester.

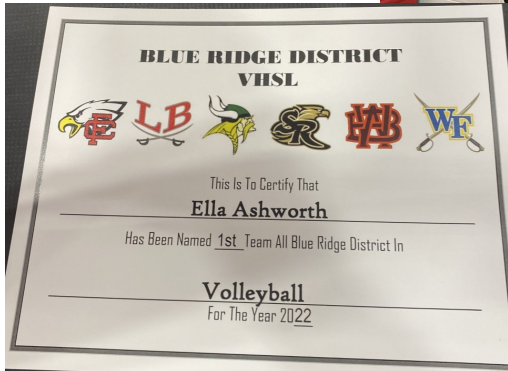
CCAP will pay for up to **9 credits of developmental coursework**, if needed, during the first year of study at Virginia Western. CCAP will not pay for developmental coursework after the second semester of the first year.

Students must enroll in and complete a **minimum of 9 credit hours** in their program of study each semester of CCAP eligibility (not including summer). CCAP will pay for up to 15 credits if there is not sufficient financial aid to pay tuition. **CCAP will only pay tuition (up to 15 credits) for aid-eligible courses in a student's program of study.** CCAP does not pay for textbooks, class-specific fees or IncludedED (Follett Access) course fees.

If funding is available, students may enroll in a maximum of 6 credits during summer semester between first and 2nd year in CCAP. Students who do not maintain the minimum cumulative GPA at end of summer semester will not be eligible to receive CCAP funds during any subsequent semester.

Students participating in CCAP are required to complete a minimum **4-hour service learning opportunity** each fall and spring semester. Failure to fulfill this requirement may result in the loss of the CCAP scholarship.

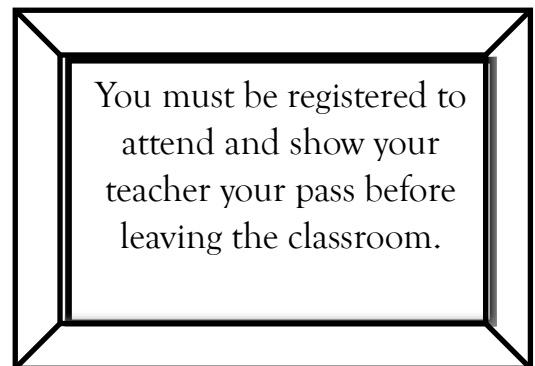

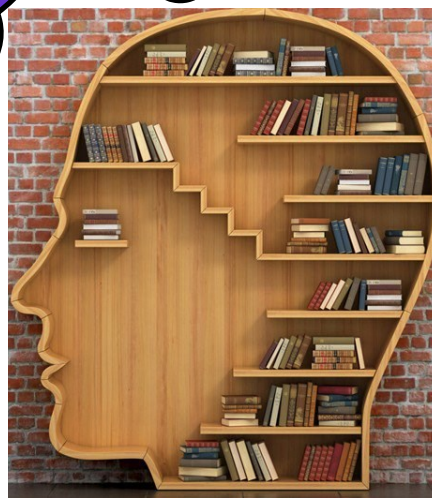

Liz Dixon

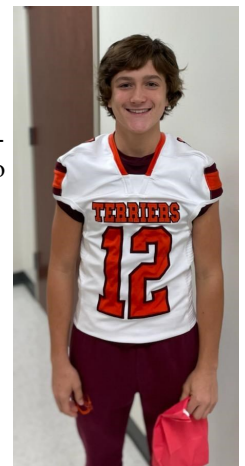

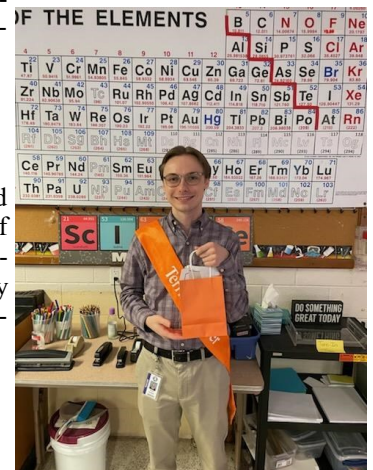


Mr. Bartley

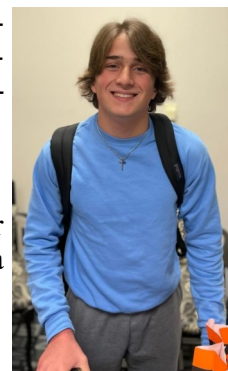


Savanah Gibson

WBHS STUDENTS WIN 2021-22 W!SE FINANCIAL LITERACY BLUE STAR SCHOOL AWARD

The Economics and Personal Finance course is a statewide graduation requirement in which students must also pass the W!SE Financial Literacy Test. This national standardized test is administered to students after a course or unit on personal finance. Students who pass the Test become Certified Financially Literate™ and earn a W!se CFL™, demonstrating that they have developed sound financial knowledge and skills.



To earn the coveted Blue Star School Award, a school must achieve an 80% pass rate on the W!SE Financial Literacy Certification Test and have either a majority of students on a given grade level take the test or have the students who took it achieve an average score of 85% or higher. Not only did WBHS earn the Blue Start School Award last academic year, but our enrolled students achieved a 100% pass rate. We are so proud of them and their hard work in completing assignments, projects, and engaging in class!

Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports

Behavior-Specific Feedback

The 4:1 ratio is a simple enough premise, but it comes with a caveat: **praise needs to be specific**. It's not enough to simply tell a student, "well done," and offer no context. Such praise is meaningless to the student, who may not understand why they are being praised. Offering a few specific details along with the praise provides the feedback necessary to help reinforce desired behaviors.

Consider, instead, the benefits of behavior-specific praise. **Behavior-specific praise** meets two criteria:

1. The student behavior is observable (i.e., walking quietly in the hall)
2. The one giving praise tells the student how this behavior affects them (i.e., "I feel" statements)

The result of this type of praise is often twofold: it reinforces desirable and appropriate student behavior as well as building **positive teacher-student relationships**.

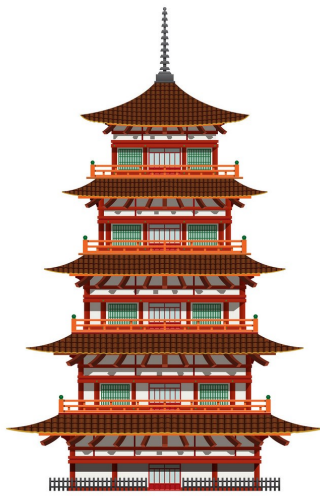

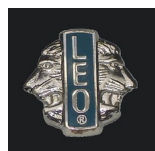

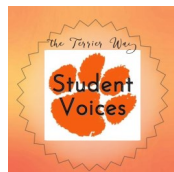

Cadets from the William Byrd High School Navy National Defense Corps (NNDCC) traveled to Bedford to visit the National D-Day Memorial on Thursday, 27 October 2022.

The cadets were able to learn about the events that led up to the epic invasion named OPERATION OVERLOAD to overthrow Hitler; ending Hitler's dream of Nazi domination of Europe. Overlord was the largest air, land, and sea operation undertaken before or since June 6, 1944. The landing included over 5,000 ships, 11,000 airplanes, and over 150,000 service men.

The field trip lasted approximately two hours in length and the D-Day Memorial offered a hands-on interactive learning experience for the cadets. The tour began in the Q-hut where the cadets were able to interact with artifacts from the period as they learn about the experience of a D-Day soldier. The cadets were given a first-hand account of what it was like to serve in the United States Marine Corps during this time by Retired Marine Sgt. Daniel Villareal who served in the late 1940's and currently volunteers at the memorial in Bedford.

Cadets were provided a guided walking tour around the grounds of the memorial. They were able to visit and learn about Reynolds Garden. The Richard S. Reynolds Sr. Garden, a stylized English garden, connects the Memorial with England, where planning and preparation for the Normandy invasion occurred, Gray Plaza The Elmon T. Gray Plaza symbolizes the channel crossing and landing through a variety of features and sculptures, and Estes Plaza The Robey W. Estes Sr. Plaza celebrates the success of the Normandy landing and the international effort that made it possible while recognizing the operation's human toll.
