

### Welcome to a new school year!

This is a dance for high school students and recent graduates. Middle school students (6th thru 8th) and persons 21 years or older are not permitted to attend with a current WBHS student. Each WBHS student attending the dance is allowed ONE guest that does not attend WBHS. All school obligations, class dues and detentions must be satisfied before the dance to attend.




# STUDENT DRESS CODE

Roanoke County Public Schools respects students' rights to express themselves in the way they dress. All students who attend Roanoke County Public Schools are also expected to respect the school community by dressing appropriately for a K-12 educational environment. Student attire should facilitate participation in learning as well as the health and safety of students and the adults that supervise them. This policy is intended to provide guidance for students, staff, and parents.

### Minimum Requirements:

- 1. Clothing must cover areas from one armpit across to the other armpit, down to approximately 3 to 4 inches in length on the upper thighs (see images below). Tops must have shoulder straps. Rips or tears in clothing should be lower than the 3 to 4 inches in length.
- 2. Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the school environment (pajamas, bedroom shoes or slippers shall not be worn, except for school activities approved by the principal).
- 3. See-through or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of the dress code.
- 4. Headgear including hats, hoodies, and caps are not allowed unless permitted for religious, medical, or other reason by school administration.



5. Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.

### Additional Requirements:

- 1. Clothing may not depict, imply, advertise, or advocate illegal, violent, or lewd conduct, weapons, or the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.
- 2. Clothing may not depict or imply pornography, nudity, or sexual acts.
- 3. Clothing may not display or imply vulgar, discriminatory, or obscene language or images.
- 4. Clothing may not state, imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected classification.
- 5. Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building.
- 6. Clothing and accessories that endanger student or staff safety may not be worn.
- 7. Apparel, jewelry, accessories, tattoos, or manner of grooming that, by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a gang that advocates illegal or disruptive behavior is prohibited.

The administration at each school reserves the right to determine what constitutes appropriate dress. Students who do not adhere to these guidelines will not be allowed to attend class. Parents will be called if appropriate clothing is not available or the student refuses dress-code appropriate clothing.

## **Attendance Procedures**

\*Refer to RCPS policy for Excused Absences and Tardies

To notify the school of an absence, you may call 562-3700 ext. 24008 and leave a voice message with the students name, grade and reason for absence. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PHONE CALL DOES NOT EXCUSE THE ABSENCE! The call lets us know you are aware of your child's absence and prevents us from calling you. A written acceptable excuse (in compliance with RCPS policy) must be submitted to the attendance office when the student returns to school.

You may also email the attendance office at wbhsattendance@rcps.us

**CHECK OUT PROCEDURES.** Please note that students cannot be checked out of school per a phone call. In order to check your student out, you must use one of the following options:

- 1) Send a written note to the school with the student that indicates the student name, reason for check out and the time to be dismissed along with the parent/guardian's contact number and signature. The note should be turned in to the attendance office when the student arrives at school. At that time, a check out pass will be issued that allows the student to leave at the designated time.
- 2) Send an email to wbhsattendance@rcps.us that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 3) Send a fax to 540-890-7568 that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 4) An authorized emergency contact may come to the school with a PHOTO ID and sign the student out at the attendance window. Only persons listed on the student's emergency card will be allowed to sign the student out.

COLLEGE VISITS/OUT OF TOWN TRIPS. A minimum of two days prior written notice must be submitted to the attendance office for college visits or out of town trips to be considered excused. Once submitted, the student will be issued a Prior Notice Form that must be signed by all teachers and returned to the attendance office prior to the absence. Failure to follow these procedures will result in the absence(s) being unexcused.



As your teen prepares for the privilege of driving, it's imperative that we do all we can to ensure their safety and the safety of those with whom they share the road. Nine out of ten teen drivers identify their parents as having the greatest influence on their driving behaviors. With that in mind, you and the future teen driver in your home are invited to attend together one of the **Partners for Safe** 



driver in your home are invited to attend together one of the **Partners for Safe Teen Driving** presentations offered at the Roanoke County high schools.

These presentations bring together parents, students, schools, law enforcement, and community resources to promote safe and responsible driving. The programs are open to the public, but the target audience includes students who are taking Driver Education or those preparing for the licensing process this school year and their parents/ guardians. Offering this program to every student is now state legislation.

The program agenda will include:

- The unique characteristics and risks of teen drivers
- The important role parents play in the teen driving experience
- An overview of the driver education program
- Teen traffic laws and the graduated licensing restrictions
- Insuring the teen driver
- A parent's perspective of a teen crash



### Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports

William Byrd High School has been implementing **PBIS** (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) since the start of the 2019-20 school year. PBIS is an evidence-based framework that helps support and improve students' academic, behavioral, and social-emotional well-being. Through creating shared school values, known as the **Terrier Way** (Be Safe, Be Respectful, and Be Responsible), collecting and analyzing behavioral data, providing behavior specific feedback, and recognizing students, the staff at WBHS is committed to creating the optimal learning and social environment for all our students. As part of our commitment to recognize students and staff, twice a month students and staff nominate individuals to be recognized as **Terriers of the Month**. Students nominate teachers who have had a positive impact in their lives and the staff nominate students who exemplify the **Terrier Way**. A total of four teachers and eight students are recognized each month, and all are featured in our monthly newsletter.



### School Nutrition

It is our goal to balance providing appealing and nutritious daily meal choices to students and staff and the operation of a financially sound school nutrition program that complies with state and federal school lunch regulations.

As of June 30, 2022, the federal government is no longer allowing all schools to serve free meals to all students. Free and reduced meals are available to those who qualify but you must apply for benefits.

The School Nutrition Department is accepting applications for part-time or substitute Nutrition Associates. One large benefit of the position is the ability to work in a cafeteria and be home when your child gets home. For additional information and application you may call (540) 562-3788 for more information.

### Free and Reduced Meal Programs

Meal applications for school year 2022-2023 are now being accepted!

Online applications are available on the Roanoke Country Schools website under Student Nutrition.

Paper applications will be available at school sites starting August 11, 2022.

All students enrolled at Burlington Elementary, Herman L. Horn Elementary, Masons Cove Elementary, Mount Pleasant Elementary, Mountain View Elementary and W.E. Cundiff Elementary will eat for free as part of the Community Eligibility Provision as implemented under the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010. Households with students attending these schools will not be required to submit a meal application form for these students to receive meals at no charge.
