

The Community Christmas Store—2021 ***Must reside in ROANOKE COUNTY, SALEM, VINTON, or CRAIG COUNTY.

Those families who qualify for Food Stamps and/or receiving free meals will qualify for our store. Our program is completely free to qualifying families. They will receive food, new clothing, and new toys for their children birth through 17 years of age. (still in high school).

Families must apply in person and bring the following when signing up:

- * Picture ID with current address
- * Proof of income
- * Social Security card for all listed on application for verification
- * Proof of Current Residency such as a Most recent utility bill, copy of l ease, etc.
- * Know clothing sizes at Christmas for all eligible applications

RCPS students, staff, and visitors will be required to wear masks indoors in schools, beginning August 12.

Schedule of Student Fees for 2021-2022

The Code of Virginia (8VAC20-720-80) states that "no fees or charges may be levied on any pupil by any school board unless authorized by regulation of the Board of Education or by the General Assembly." The following schedule of fees are authorized by 8VAC20-720-80 and have been approved by the Roanoke County School Board in accordance with Policy 4.12. Requests for reduction or waiver fees are via the school principal.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 12TH GRADE STUDENTS



April 9, 2021

Dear Parent/Guardian of 12th Grade Students for School Year 2021-22,

The Virginia General Assembly passed House Bill 1090 which effectively requires Virginia's immunization recommendations and requirements to coincide with the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP). This legislation becomes effective July 1, 2021 and amends the Code of Virginia § 32.1-46.A.4.

Students entering 12th grade can meet the vaccination requirement by presenting proof of a booster dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MenAcWY). Even though your child may have had a dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine at 11 years of age, they will still need to have the second dose at age 16 or older.

You can make an appointment with your child's healthcare provider. The local health departments will administer school required vaccines at no charge. The health department requires a copy of your child's immunization record. Roanoke County Health Department information follows:

Regardless of the chosen location to receive the vaccines, please obtain documentation and take it to your child's current school.

This will be your only notification regarding the required vaccinations. Contact your child's school nurse with questions. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.



STUDENT DRESS CODE

Roanoke County Public Schools respects students' rights to express themselves in the way they dress. All students who attend Roanoke County Public Schools are also expected to respect the school community by dressing appropriately for a K-12 educational environment. Student attire should facilitate participation in learning as well as the health and safety of students and the adults that supervise them. This policy is intended to provide guidance for students, staff, and parents.

Minimum Requirements:

- 1. Clothing must cover areas from one armpit across to the other armpit, down to approximately 3 to 4 inches in length on the upper thighs (see images below). Tops must have shoulder straps. Rips or tears in clothing should be lower than the 3 to 4 inches in length.
- 2. Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the school environment (pajamas, bedroom shoes or slippers shall not be worn, except for school activities approved by the principal).
- 3. See-through or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that meet the minimum requirements of the dress code.
- 4. Headgear including hats, hoodies, and caps are not allowed unless permitted for religious, medical, or other reason by school administration.



5. Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.

Additional Requirements:

- 1. Clothing may not depict, imply, advertise, or advocate illegal, violent, or lewd conduct, weapons, or the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.
- 2. Clothing may not depict or imply pornography, nudity, or sexual acts.
- 3. Clothing may not display or imply vulgar, discriminatory, or obscene language or images.
- 4. Clothing may not state, imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected classification.
- 5. Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building.
- 6. Clothing and accessories that endanger student or staff safety may not be worn.
- 7. Apparel, jewelry, accessories, tattoos, or manner of grooming that, by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a gang that advocates illegal or disruptive behavior is prohibited.

The administration at each school reserves the right to determine what constitutes appropriate dress. Students who do not adhere to these guidelines will not be allowed to attend class. Parents will be called if appropriate clothing is not available or the student refuses dress-code appropriate clothing.



Thank you for completing your 1st Day School Forms on-line. If you have not completed these forms, please do so immediately. Remember forms are to be completed on all students including Academy students, all day BCAT students, private day students, etc. If you are considered a William Byrd High School Student you should complete these

forms on-line.

Once forms are completed, we will make arrangements for you to get your computer.

New students to WBHS that did not have a SnapCode at the beginning of the year can now be given a SnapCode for you to check the data to be sure it was entered correctly and complete any form you may have not have been given when you enrolled.

FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH APPLICATIONS

Our SY 2021-2022 free and reduced meal application is now available.

The online application is the fastest way for parents to apply. It can be located on the Quick Links section of the RCPS homepage, under Free/Reduced Meals Online Application. The online application is available in several languages.

All students will be able to eat breakfast and lunch at no charge this year due to federal funding. We are still processing applications in order to help families qualify for other services that may be extended under COVID relief, such as SNAP benefits, free internet and dual enrollment fees. In addition, it will give eligible students 30 days of free or reduced-price meals in SY 2022-2023, preventing any meal charges from accruing. We encourage families to apply.

Assessment of Students for the Gifted Program, Grades K-12

The gifted screening process is underway for students in grades K-12. All second-grade students will be administered in Naglieri Non-Verbal Abilities Test



(NNAT3), and all fifth-grade students will be administered the Otis Lennon School Abilities Test. These tests will be administered in October, and the results will be reviewed to find students who score within the exceptional range. Those students will be referred for gifted screening by school personnel. Parents who feel their child should be screened for placement in the gifted program should contact the school's guidance counselor to request a referral packed.

Attendance Procedures

To notify the school of an absence, you may call 562-3700 ext. 24008 and leave a voice message with the students name, grade and reason for absence. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PHONE CALL DOES NOT EXCUSE THE ABSENCE! The call lets us know you are aware of your child's absence and prevents us from calling you. A written acceptable excuse (in compliance with RCPS policy) must be submitted to the attendance office when the student returns to school.


CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Please note that students cannot be checked out of school per a phone call. In order to check your student out, you must use one of the following options:

- 1) Send a written note to the school with the student that indicates the student name, reason for check out and the time to be dismissed along with the parent/guardian's contact number and signature. The note should be turned in to the attendance office when the student arrives at school. At that time, a check out pass will be issued that allows the student to leave at the designated time.
- 2) Send an email to wbhsattendance@rcps.us that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 3) Send a fax to 540-890-7568 that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 4) An authorized emergency contact may come to the school with a PHOTO ID and sign the student out at the attendance window. Only persons listed on the student's emergency card will be allowed to sign the student out.

COLLEGE VISITS/OUT OF TOWN TRIPS

A minimum of two days prior written notice must be submitted to the attendance office for college visits or out of town trips to be considered excused. Once submitted, the student will be issued a Prior Notice Form that must be signed by all teachers and returned to the attendance office prior to the absence. Failure to follow these procedures will result in the absence(s) being unexcused.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

If you are NEW to Dual Enrollment your first step is to apply to VWCC: Visit website. Create username and password for application only. Remember to indicate that your student will be a dual enrolled high school student.

Please record the student's username, password, and EMPLID (Student ID #) when you complete the application and keep this in a safe place. You will need their student ID # to fill out the parent permission form at the beginning of school.

Testing/Prerequisites

We have received confirmation from VWCC that we are determining placement in DE courses based upon GPA (3.0 or above) and grades in certain courses. Counselors will review the GPA and course grade (as needed) and will send a follow up email to families whose students do not meet the criteria to enroll in DE classes with options for a schedule adjustment. If you do not hear from your students' counselor in a separate email or phone call, then your child has met the prerequisite and will remain in the Dual Enrollment course.

Cost/Payment

The tuition for DE is \$43 per credit hour. Please refer to the tuition chart below for the cost of each course. Payment is expected in full by **September 3, 2021**. Failure to pay by the deadline will mean that your child is switched to the AP section of the course, if available, or to a non-DE course.

Welcome to the School Counselor's Corner



Welcome to the Counselor's Corner! Ms. Gunn, the Life Counselor will be starting small group counseling in September. Groups run 6-8 weeks and can repeat. Groups are 30-45 minutes and meeting during study hall or lunch. Student schedules are highly taken into consideration. Here are the groups being offered this school year:

- 1. Life Skills—to help students tackle general high school issues and adolescent milestones. Topics will be based on what the group would like to talk about and/or have more understanding of.
- 2. Conflict Resolution—explores various types of conflict, management styles, developing skills, develop effective relationships, and resolve differences.
- 3. Study Skill/Organization—is to help student develop coping techniques to deal with, is designed to empower students to understand their individual learning styles and to identify studying techniques that appeal to their learning styles as well as to promote beneficial study, homework, test preparation and test-taking skills in high school students.
- 4. Social Skills/Friendship—help students learn joint attention, problem solving, and how to handle the challenges of social situations while having positive and fun social experiences with peers. Topics of discussion include identifying feelings, communicating effectively, problem-solving, and dealing with difficult emotions.
- 5. Coping Skills—designed to teach the core skills of mindfulness, emotion regulation, interpersonal effectiveness, and distress tolerance by a series of numerous coping strategies based on feelings of anxiety and/or depression.
 - a. Anxiety focused
 - b. Depression focused
- 6. Come as you are Identity Group—provide a safe space for students who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, questioning, asexual, or any other orientation or gender identity may find that the social stigma of living as a minority. Topics focus on the unique challenges these students face.
- 7. Wellness—is a combined cognitive-behavioral therapy (CBT) approach that employs relaxation, cognitive, and communication skills interventions. Participants draw on these different interventions to develop individualized anger control plans. Key components of the anger management treatment are monitoring anger using cues and developing cognitive-behavioral strategies in the form of anger control plans.
- 8. Substance Use—to help students who are policy violators develop coping techniques to deal with . Provide an opportunity for students to examine their use of alcohol and other drugs, along with the latest research on the resulting effects. Students will learn about the legal ramification related to involvement with illegal substance use and alternative methods, and skills for enhancing positive choices.
