(Note: You may be able to transfer your federal tax return information into your FAFSA using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool.)
- Bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)
- A FSA ID to sign electronically.



Partnering for the Privilege: A Safe Teen Driving Program



Dear Parent or Guardian,

You are receiving this mailing because your son or daughter is currently completing the classroom component of driver education in Health and PE 10. As your teen prepares for the privilege of driving, it's imperative that we do all we can to ensure their safety and the safety of those with whom they share the road. Nine out of ten teen drivers identify their parents as having the greatest influence on their driving behaviors. With that in mind, you and the future teen driver in your home are invited to attend together one of the **Partnering for the Privilege, Safe Teen Driving** presentations offered at the Roanoke County high schools.

These presentations bring together parents, students, schools, law enforcement, and community resources in an effort to promote safe and responsible driving. The programs are open to the public but the target audience includes students who are taking Driver Education or those preparing for the licensing process this school year and their parents/guardians.

The program agenda will include:

- The unique characteristics and risks of teen drivers
- The important role parents play in the teen driving experience
- An overview of the driver education program
- Teen traffic laws and the graduated licensing restrictions
- Insuring the teen driver
- A parent's perspective of a teen crash

You are invited to attend a presentation on any of the following dates. If the meeting at your child's school is not convenient, you are encouraged to attend a meeting at another school. The programs begin at 7:00 p.m. and are approximately ninety minutes long. If your child is unable to attend any of the presentations there will be an alternate assignment given by their teacher so that your child will cover the information presented on these evenings. Parents are encouraged to review the information in that assignment as well.

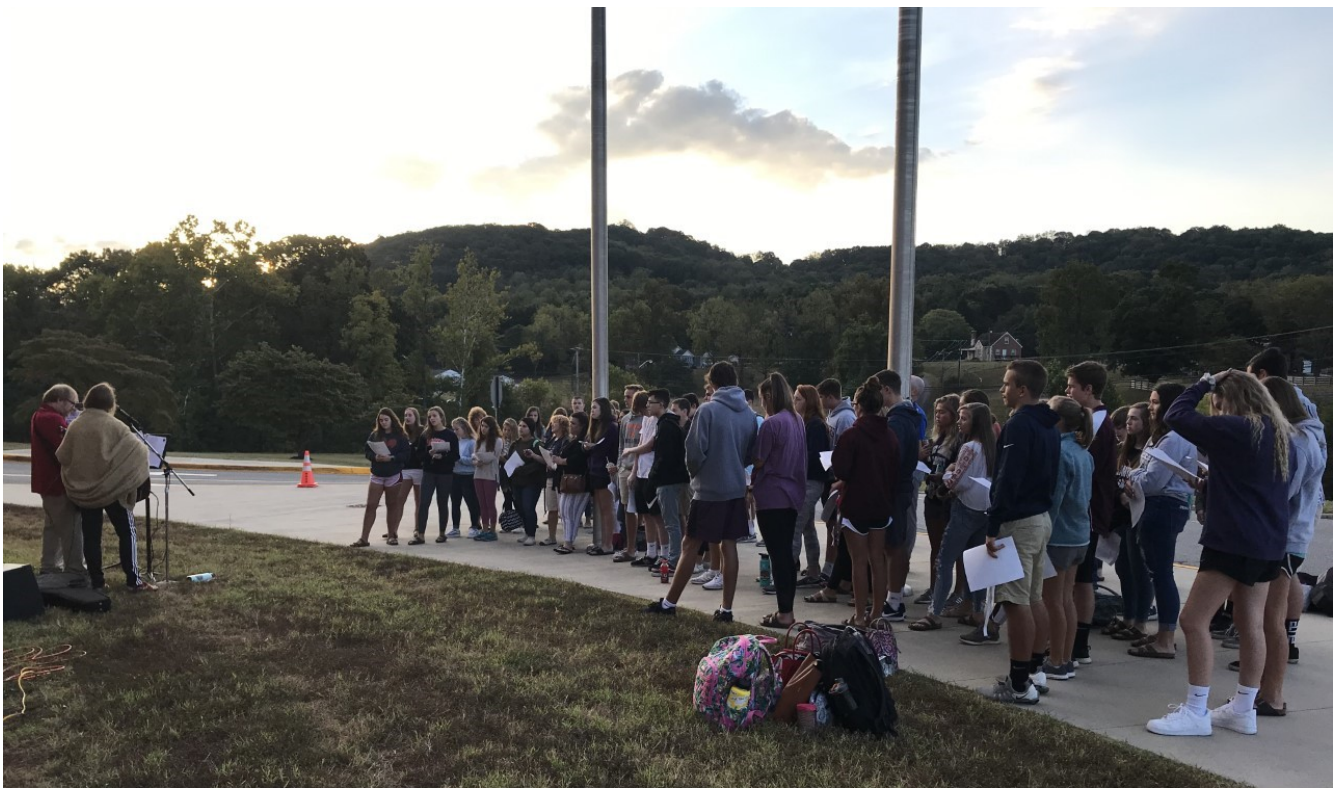

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Who is eligible to apply for CCAP?

- Spring 2020 graduating seniors from Botetourt County, Craig County, Franklin County, Roanoke City, Roanoke County, and Salem City Public High Schools
- Homeschool and private school 2020 graduating seniors from Botetourt County, Franklin County, Roanoke County or Salem City
- Graduating seniors must have resided in their school district and attended their division's high school during their junior and senior years. (CCAP will not pay out-of-state tuition.)
- **NEW!** Roanoke County residents graduating from any high school in the six localities served by Virginia Western may apply for CCAP.
- CCAP applicants should anticipate finishing high school with a minimum cumulative 2.5 grade point average (GPA). A minimum 2.5 GPA is required on final high school transcript. In Roanoke City, a 2.0 cumulative GPA is required on final high school transcript.

Submit a Virginia Western application at <http://www.viriniawestern.edu> ☐ You must qualify for Virginia in-state resident status.

- **YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN)** must be included on the Virginia Western application.
- Have you taken dual-enrolled classes? **YOU must contact the VWCC Recruitment team, Allison Dooley at adooley@viriniawestern.edu or Rebecca Kraemer at rkraemer@viriniawestern.edu** to confirm your Virginia Western application is active, your Social Security Number (SSN) is on your application and to submit a Program/Plan Change form.

Submit a 2020 – 2021 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by February 1, 2020 deadline.

- Submit 2020-2021 FAFSA at <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa>
- Select Virginia Western (federal code: 003760) on the FAFSA as a school to receive your FAFSA information. FAFSA help is at 1-800-4FED-AID.
- All financial aid information will be communicated through the Virginia Western student's account Message Center. The Virginia Western Office of Financial Aid **WILL NOT** contact you via phone or mail about your financial aid application. Questions for Virginia Western financial aid staff? Call 1-855-874-6690.
- **2020-2021 FAFSA must be submitted by February 1, 2020** in order for the financial aid review process to begin.
- The financial aid review process must be completed by March 13, 2020 for CCAP eligibility.
- Failure to submit FAFSA by stated deadline and failure to complete financial aid process by stated deadline will result in ineligibility for CCAP. **No exceptions.**

Meet academic placement measures OR pass minimum placement tests by February 1, 2020.

- Take English and Math placement tests and meet minimum test requirements for CCAP acceptance.
- Minimum Requirements: **English test**—Pass ENF 2 or better / **Math test**—pass at least 3 out of 9 sections.
- Minimum Placement Measures: **high school transcript may reflect 3.0 GPA or 2.7 GPA and completion of Algebra 2.**
- Or student may pass **Math SAT** with 510 / **ACT** with 19, **English SAT ERW** with 460 / **ACT** with 15.
- **YOU** must confirm with the VWCC Recruitment team, Allison Dooley or Rebecca Kraemer, that you meet the testing requirement or the alternative placement measures before the application deadline to ensure success.
- How to confirm?

Attend your high school's VWCC Advising Day. Visit www.viriniawestern.edu/recruitment for schedule. Sign up for an appointment in your high school Guidance Office. Email Allison Dooley at adooley@viriniawestern.edu or Rebecca Kraemer at rkraemer@viriniawestern.edu to ask them to review your record to confirm placement measure requirements are met for CCAP.

Complete the online CCAP Application at viriniawestern.edu/ccap, October 1, 2019 - February 1, 2020.

Use your **"MyVWCC" login and password to access the application.**

(Note: the Virginia Western application and the CCAP application are two different applications. Both must be submitted.)



DEADLINE FOR ALL APPLICATION MATERIALS: FEBRUARY 1, 2020

The Community College Access Program (CCAP) is a public/private tuition funding program offered and administered by Virginia Western Community College Educational Foundation, Inc. CCAP allows current-year high school graduates, who meet program guidelines, to receive a combination of federal/state financial aid and donor funding up to the cost of tuition. **The program covers the cost of tuition for up to three (3) years** at Virginia Western Community College for all accepted students. CCAP supports as many students as possible, based on student need and funds available for the program, but does not guarantee acceptance to every applicant. **Textbooks are not included. Course fees and IncludedED fees are not included.**

IMPORTANCE OF CHECKING EMAIL & MESSAGE CENTER

- Students are required to **provide a personal email address** on the Virginia Western application and the CCAP application.
- CCAP applicants should frequently check for email communications from the Virginia Western Educational Foundation.
- Once the FAFSA has been submitted, CCAP applicants should check their VWCC student account Message Center and personal email account listed on the VWCC application for communications from the Office of Financial Aid.
- Failure to complete requests from the Office of Financial Aid will prevent financial aid review process to continue (or complete).
- Students will be notified of conditional CCAP acceptance by the Virginia Western Educational Foundation through their personal email.

CCAP PERFORMANCE/ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

- New CCAP students are required to attend a Virginia Western Discover orientation session in summer after high school graduation and complete the online CCAP CSI Survey.
- CCAP students must maintain a minimum Virginia Western **cumulative 2.5 GPA (2.0 GPA for Roanoke City)**. Students who do not maintain the minimum cumulative GPA at the end of any semester will not be eligible to receive CCAP funds during any future semester.
- *Note: CCAP will pay for up to 8 credits of developmental coursework, if needed, during the first year of study at Virginia Western. CCAP will not pay for developmental coursework after the second semester of the first year.*
- Students must enroll in and stay enrolled in a **minimum of 9 credit hours** in a specific program of study each semester of CCAP eligibility. CCAP will pay for up to 15 credits if there is not sufficient financial aid to pay tuition. **CCAP will only pay tuition for eligible courses in a student's program of study.** If funding is available, students may enroll in a maximum of 6 credits during summer semester after their first year in CCAP. Students who do not maintain the minimum cumulative GPA at end of summer semester will not be eligible to receive CCAP funds during any subsequent semester.
- Students participating in CCAP are required to participate in a **4 hour service learning opportunity** each fall and spring semester. Failure to fulfill this requirement may result in the student being ineligible to receive future CCAP funding.
- **2nd Year & 3rd Year CCAP Acceptance:** 1st Year CCAP students MUST submit a 2nd Year CCAP application and FAFSA for their second academic year. 2nd Year CCAP students MUST submit a 3rd Year CCAP application and FAFSA for their third academic year. The Educational Foundation will send an email to the student's email address with application and deadline information in late fall of the student's first semester.

Attendance Procedures

*Refer to RCPS policy for Excused Absences and Tardies

To notify the school of an absence, you may call 562-3700 ext. 24008 and leave a voice message with the students name, grade and reason for absence. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PHONE CALL DOES NOT EXCUSE THE ABSENCE! The call lets us know you are aware of your child's absence and prevents us from calling you. A written acceptable excuse (in compliance with RCPS policy) must be submitted to the attendance office when the student returns to school. **You may also email the attendance office at wbhsattendance@rcps.us**

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Please note that students cannot be checked out of school per a phone call. In order to check your student out, you must use one of the following options:

- 1) Send a written note to the school with the student that indicates the student name, reason for check out and the time to be dismissed along with the parent/guardian's contact number and signature. The note should be turned in to the attendance office when the student arrives at school. At that time, a check out pass will be issued that allows the student to leave at the designated time.
- 2) Send an email to wbhsattendance@rcps.us that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 3) Send a fax to 540-890-7568 that includes the information in bullet #1.
- 4) An authorized emergency contact may come to the school with a PHOTO ID and sign the student out at the attendance window. Only persons listed on the student's emergency card will be allowed to sign the student out.

COLLEGE VISITS/OUT OF TOWN TRIPS

A minimum of two days prior written notice must be submitted to the attendance office for college visits or out of town trips to be considered excused. Once submitted, the student will be issued a Prior Notice Form that must be signed by all teachers and returned to the attendance office prior to the absence. Failure to follow these procedures will result in the absence(s) being unexcused.

GIFTED STUDENT IDENTIFICATION PROCESS

Referral

Students in kindergarten through twelfth grade can be referred for screening for the gifted program from August through September and January through February of each school year. Students can be directly referred by any interested individual, including parents, guardians, teachers, administrators, or community members. To request a referral packet, contact the guidance counselor at the student's school or the gifted office at 562-3900, ext. 10222.

In order to assure that no student is excluded from screening based on gender, cultural diversity, socioeconomic status, learning exceptionality or other factors, teachers are required to observe their students during the first nine weeks of the school year. From the onset of school through the second week of October teachers make focused observations in the classroom.

Students in grades K - 1 are evaluated for the gifted program through the use of a "profile" that includes ability test data, rating scales, and portfolio materials. Students in grades 2 - 12 are evaluated for the gifted program using achievement and ability test data, grades, and rating scales.

Any students who either have transferred into the Roanoke County Public Schools after the regular screening process has begun, or have transferred from another gifted program, are eligible for screening upon their entrance to the school system.

Identification

Several types of data are collected by the school guidance counselor and the gifted specialist in order to evaluate students for the gifted program. Types of data may include, but are not limited to:

- Nationally-normed standardized achievement test scores
- Nationally-normed standardized ability test scores
- Grades
- Parent-completed rating scales
- Teacher-completed rating scales
- Observational check lists
- Portfolio products
- Performance-based assessment products
- All data is compiled by the division Gifted Screening Coordinator and decisions regarding placement are made by a division Gifted Screening Committee. Decisions regarding gifted placement may be appealed.

No single criterion can be used to include or exclude a student from access to the gifted program.

Visual Art Aptitude

Referral

Students in grades two through eight can be referred for screening for the gifted art program from February to March of each school year. Students can be directly referred by parents, classroom teachers, art teachers or community members. Referral forms are distributed to the schools in February of each year.

Identification

Several types of data are collected by the gifted specialist in order to evaluate students for the gifted program. Types of data may include, but are not limited to:

- Performance-based assessment products

Recommendations

All data is compiled by the division Gifted Art Screening Coordinator and decisions regarding placement are made by a division Gifted Art Screening Committee. Decisions regarding gifted art placement may be appealed.

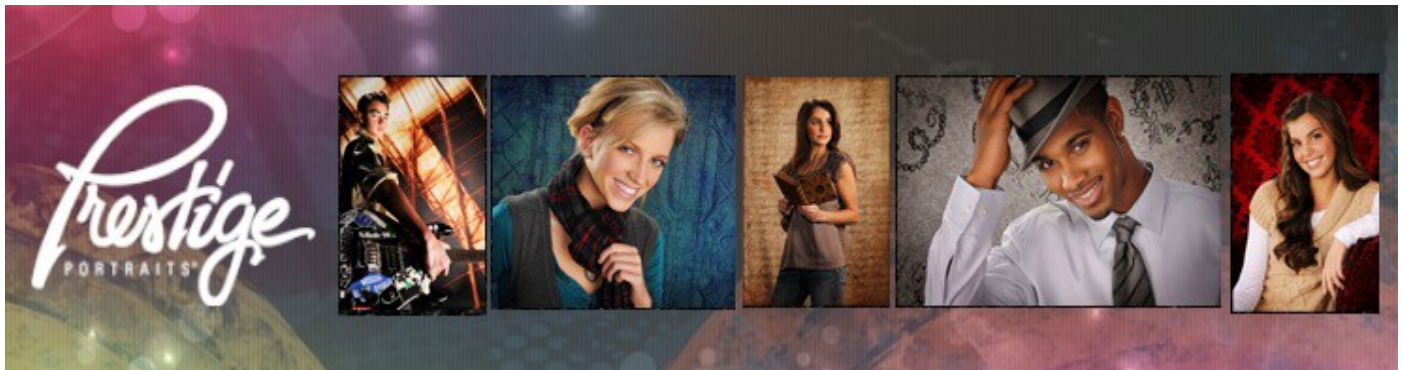
