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Your child's success  
begins with attendance  
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Our students are important to us in Klein ISD, and we want them to be with us each school day. Texas School Law requires that children age 6 until their 19th birthday attend each school day for the entire period the program is offered. For students with excessive absences, the law allows for legal action against the student and/or parent. Once enrolled, pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students will be under the same attendance law.

### Parents and families can help in the following ways: \_\_\_\_\_

- ▶ Make getting to school on time every day a high priority in your family.
- ▶ Talk with your child about the importance of regular attendance. Students who miss class, miss out on learning. Having good attendance will help students learn and develop the skills and attitudes essential for success in school and life.
- ▶ Have an alternate plan for getting your child to and from school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- ▶ Post the school calendar, and plan your vacations and appointments outside of school time.
- ▶ Monitor your child's attendance through the Klein ISD's Skyward Family/Student Access portal from the district homepage, [www.kleinisd.net](http://www.kleinisd.net).
- ▶ Send a written note explaining the date(s) and the reason for your child's absence or report the absence through the parent's Skyward Family Access account. Remember, the Attendance Office must receive this notification from you within **five (5) days** of the absence.
