

The 2019-2020 Boys Varsity Fencing Team had a great year. We had a winning record of 8-5 and had several finalists in every tournament. Our foil squad lead the way this year, winning the most bouts for the team in our meets and competitions. Foil took second place in the Huntington Relay Tournament and all 3 athletes were finalists at the Suffolk County Tournament.

This year's Most Valuable Player award goes to Aidan Montalbine. Aidan has been traveling all over the country fencing in national tournaments and participating in classes and lessons at Mission Fencing Club. At the Brentwood Holiday Tournament in December Aidan came in third place on Long Island, second place in Suffolk County, earning his D national rating - distinguishing him among his teammates and competitors across the country.

Aidan had an overall meet record of 29 wins and seven losses. Aidan received All-County and All-League awards and helped bring his team into 3rd place in our league.

At the Huntington Relay Tournament Aidan was the last athlete in the final round, and picked up over 15 points for his teammates, bringing his squad in to second place and missing first place by 3 points. This was the first time Sayville made it into the finals at this tournament. Aidan had a fence off for first place at the County Tournament in February and took home the silver medal.




