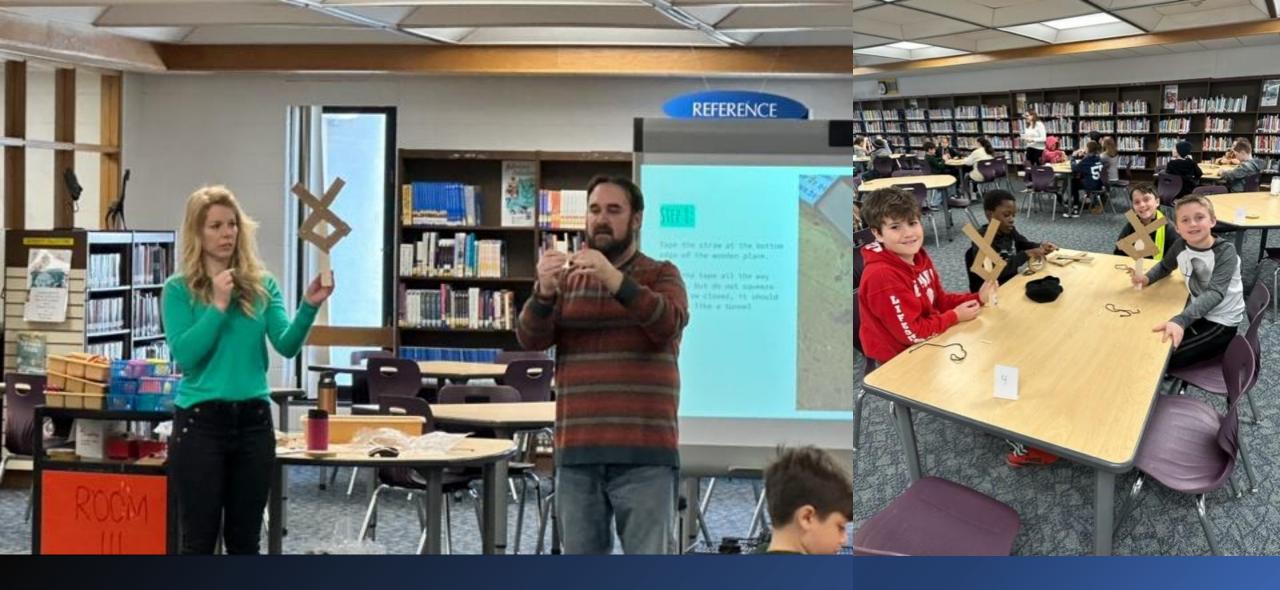

Contingency Budgets: Key Elements of the Law



• School District residents will vote on the Proposed Budget on May 16, 2023;

• Should the budget fail, the Board has the option of putting up the same, or a revised budget, for a revote by June 20, 2023, or adopt a contingent budget;

• If the budget fails twice, the District must adopt a contingent budget with a 'ZERO' percent increase on the current tax levy!

What is a Contingent Budget?

- 1. A contingent budget will only contain legal expenditures authorized by statute and expenditures that maintain educational programs, preserve property, and maintain the health and safety of students and staff.
- 2. A contingent budget includes reductions in staffing, programs, capital items, and non-contingent items such as student supplies, certain equipment, and community use of building and grounds.







Contingency Spending Limits

• Total Spending Limit:

✓ If the budget fails twice, the District must adopt a contingent budget with a 'ZERO' percent increase on the <u>current tax levy!</u>

• Administrative Cap:

- ✓ The ratio between the Administrative and Program Budget components and
- ✓ Must be the 'lesser' of the calculated Administrative Cap for 2022-23 or the defeated 2023-24 budget.

In Summary: Under A Contingent Budget



• Administrative Budget: reduce by \$72,000

• Program Budget: must reduce \$620,823

• Capital Budget: must reduce \$1,118,800

Total Program & Support Reductions of \$1,811,623

Contingency Revenue Budget

Under a Contingency Budget, State Aid, Pilot Payments and Other Income would remain the same as under the defeated budget.

Under a Contingency Budget the District must REDUCE Spending by \$1,811,623. Therefore, in addition to reducing the tax levy by \$1,761,623 to achieve a 0% increase, Fund Balance and Reserves applied would also be reduced from the defeated budget by \$50,000.

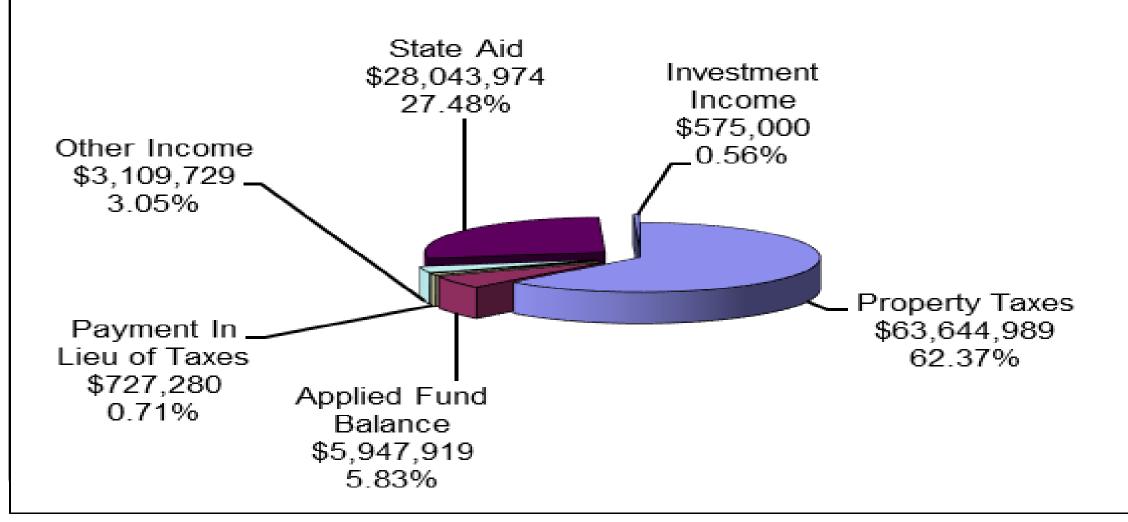

WHAT IS A CAPITAL RESERVE FUND?



- Available for funding project costs for which bonds may be issued. Expenditures must be specific:
 - Examples: purchase of school buses, facility construction, equipment, etc. Annual appropriations to fund reserve(s) further authorized by voters;
- Funds may not be expended without voter approval. The proposition to use these funds must be specific to a set of projects and dollar amounts;
- Funds may be invested in accordance with section 11 of the General Municipal Law, with any interest or capital gain realized accruing to the fund.

Potential Capital Reserve Fund



CAPITAL RESERVE FUND DATA POINTS



- A Capital Reserve Proposition requires voter approval to create a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of completing district-wide renovation and reconstruction projects;
- Existing budget monies would be used to capitalize the new fund. For example, if in any given year, the district spends less money than it had earlier anticipated, these surplus monies may be transferred by BOE into the newly established Capital Reserve Fund;
- The fund could only be used for capital projects, such as: redesign of classrooms (e.g., STEAM labs, Science Labs, Theatre and Stage Lighting, Windows, Doors, Boilers, Electrical, Plumbing, Masonry work, Other facility improvements, etc.;
- The District would also apply for State aid on any capital project completed;
- This fund would utilize existing budget monies and allow the district to avoid borrowing additional funds through bond issuances;
- Passage of this proposition will not increase taxes.

Potential Capital Reserve Resolution



RESOLUTION LANGUAGE



- BE IT RESOLVED, that Board of Education of the Sayville Union Free School District hereby authorizes the following proposition to be placed on the ballot at the Annual Budget Vote and Election on May 16, 2023, and for said proposition to be included in the Annual Notice of said Vote and Election:
- Shall the Board of Education of the Sayville Union Free School District be authorized to establish a Capital Reserve fund pursuant to Section 3651 of the New York Education Law to be known as the Sayville 2023 Capital Reserve Fund for a probable term of eight (8) years in an ultimate amount of ten million (\$10,000,000) Dollars, whose purpose shall be to fund, in whole or in part, capital improvements to the facilities and *instructional spaces* of the District, including but not limited to, reconstruction and renovation of current facilities and *instructional spaces*, pavements and grounds, asbestos abatement, heating/ventilation, plumbing, masonry work, structural repairs and replacements of doors, windows, floors and roofs, site work, and other facility and *instructional-spaces* related work, with such funds to be obtained from end of year budget surplus funds and/or other funds that may be legally appropriated; and the interest accrued on such funds over the term of the Capital Reserve fund.



In Summary.....

- The 2023-24 Proposed Budget is \$102,048,891;
- Represents a spending increase of \$2,746,734 or 2.77%;
- Carries a proposed tax rate increase of 2.85%;
- Estimated annual \$ increase of \$228, or \$19/month;
- Is over/under the Property Tax Levy Cap by \$0.
