

SENIOR YEAR PLANNING CHECKLIST



FALL

- Create a personal email address that can be used for post-high school planning. Your school district email should not be used.
- Review your senior year schedule with your counselor and confirm that you are meeting all graduation requirements. Continue to challenge yourself with a rigorous schedule.
- Continue participation in school activities, volunteering, and community service opportunities.
- In September, if you will be requesting your Counselor to write a Letter of Recommendation or to complete a form, complete/update the following surveys on Naviance:
 - Post High School Planning Reflection
 - Activities Record
 - Parent Information Sheet (should be completed by your parent/guardian)
- Sign up to take the SAT and/or ACT in the Fall.
 - For the SAT: register online at www.collegeboard.org. Fee waivers are available for students who meet College Board's eligibility requirements.
 - For the ACT: register online at www.actstudent.org. Fee waivers are available for students who meet ACT eligibility requirements.
- Continue exploring and narrowing down your post-high school options by gathering information. Meet with your Counselor, use Naviance, look at websites, and talk to friends, family, teachers, and recent grads of Haverford to gather more information on careers, majors, schools, and scholarships.
- Log in to Naviance:
 - Go to: <http://Launchpad.classlink.com/haverfordsd>
 - Click "Sign in with Google"
 - Select your Haverfordsd.net email address
 - Click the Naviance icon
- Check postings on Naviance to find out when college/career representatives will be visiting Haverford and attend their presentations.
- Continue visiting schools that you are interested in.
- Develop a list of schools that you will apply to.



FALL (continued)

- Visit the website of each school to view their online application or visit <https://www.commonapp.org/apply/first-time-students> if the school you are applying to accepts the Common Application. Check important deadline dates.
- Apply online.
- Have your test scores sent directly from the CollegeBoard or ACT.
- To have your Transcript sent: follow the Transcript Request Instructions for Post High School Applications that can be found on the HHS Counseling Website under Forms. Keep deadline dates in mind and remember to allow the Counseling Office at least 15 school days to process your Transcript Request.
- Teacher letters of recommendation – please follow step #7 on the Transcript Request Instructions.
- If applicable, continue to gather material for a portfolio (drama, music, art, sports, etc.).
- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available for completion online at <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>.
- Contact the school's financial aid office to see if financial aid programs exist on a state or campus level. These programs may involve forms and deadlines that exist independently from federal programs and may require additional applications or information from you or your parents.
- If you are enrolled in Advanced Placement courses, register for the AP Exams that are given in May.

WINTER

- Submit all the necessary paperwork/applications for any private or outside scholarships. Please review on Naviance the list of Scholarships that HHS has been made aware of.
- Send Mid-Year Transcripts, if required by the school you are applying to. The Mid-Year Transcript Request Instructions for Post High School Applications are available on the HHS Counseling Website under Forms.
- Maintain your grades, as all colleges require a final transcript before enrolling

SPRING

- Apply for Local Scholarships and Awards that are offered through HHS, information is available on the HHS Counseling Website under Local Scholarships and Awards.
- Complete the HHS Senior Survey on Naviance in May. This form needs to be completed for State Reporting purposes and to ensure that your final transcript is sent to the school you will be attending.
