The following discipline matrix forms the basis for determination of consequences for misbehavior at each elementary school. Students who are not safe or productive in the classroom setting will have the opportunity to go to a safe place until they can learn to work in the classroom. The continuum for B.I.S.T will be followed using safe places such as Safe Seat, Buddy Room, Focus Room or Principal's office. The Principal may administer alternative consequences appropriate to the behavior and/or student situation.

## Level 4: Behaviors/Consequences requiring PRINCIPAL INTERVENTION:

The principal may administer alternative consequences appropriate to behavior and student situation.

Any behaviors listed below will result in immediate short-term out of school suspension (OSS) which may lead to long-term suspension. District Policies for Student Rights and Privileges, Violence and Drug and Alcohol Abuse will be followed. State and Federal law will be implemented where required.
