EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Technology Team:

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Guiding Philosophy:

We are a service department providing best in class service to students and staff in support of Liberty's strategic plan, mission, and vision. We provide and support technologies that facilitate the teaching of common knowledge, common virtues, and common sense and we are good stewards of Liberty equipment and data. All data is protected and accessible to appropriate personnel.

Key Accomplishments:

- Setup a new server cluster at the Aristotle campus.
 - We purchased a 3-node Scale Computing cluster using CCSP grant funds.
 - o Provides site-site replication and high availability (failover) of server infrastructure between the Aristotle and high school campuses.
- Rebuilt and rearchitected servers at the high school from the ground up.
 - Replaced VMWare virtualization software, which was overly complicated, prone to configuration glitches, and was poorly architected when initially installed and configured.
 - Currently using Microsoft Hyper-V for new virtualization software which is simple to manage and is free to use.
 - o Fixed a major bottleneck between the servers and their storage and from the servers to the network.
 - Freed up the storage server for use with immutable server and file backups.
- Completed installation of new networking equipment and removed remaining old equipment from all campuses.
 - All old and failing network appliances have been removed (previously postponed due to the old server architecture).
 - New 10Gb/s backbone switches have been added to accommodate servers at Aristotle and the HS
 and are configured for high availability and automatic failover.
 - All network switches and servers are now inter-connected via 10Gb/s fiber optic cables to prevent bottlenecks in bandwidth.
- Completed installation of new projectors at Aristotle and High School campuses. Plato to be completed over Summer break.
 - o Old bulb projectors have been replaced with laser projectors for brighter and clearer images.
 - No more bulbs to replace.
 - o Projection software consolidated to one application instead of two.

Completed installation of 6 additional Canon enterprise class printer/copiers.

- o These replaced the old, failing Xerox copiers at the Plato and HS campuses.
- o Plato's Xerox copiers were replaced via a contract buyout using funds provided by Canon.
- HS's Xerox contract expired and was not renewed.
- o The move away from Xerox was primarily related to poor customer service with supplies and repairs.

Electronic door locks installed at Plato.

 Salto electronic door locks have been installed on all exterior doors at the Plato campus. Physical key access has been removed for increased security and logging.

Staff computer refresh.

- \circ We've begun rolling out new Lenovo computers to replace older staff laptops that are at or nearing their end of life (4 7 years old).
- The first batch were replaced at the beginning of this fiscal year (2023). We are planning to replace the remaining end of life/failing computers at the beginning of the 2024 fiscal year.
- o The planned refresh cycle for staff computers will be 5 years.

Hired and trained a new IT Specialist.

o Patrick Nelson has hit the ground running and has been a great to the team. He is currently stationed at the HS campus.

Ran multiple network lines across the HS campus including fiber optics.

- o Provided a direct connection between the A/V equipment in the gym and the new A/V equipment in the cafeteria.
- Provided a connection to the new sports camera in the gym.
- o Provided a 10Gb/s backbone connection to the network switch in the Gym (previously 1Gb/s) shared by A/V, wireless access points, sports cameras, and security cameras.
- o Ran additional ethernet cables for installation of new security cameras, printers, and projectors.

Rebuilt our network monitoring system.

- IT had previously purchased a multiyear license for PRTG network monitoring, but the software was not maintained or functioning fully. We have since rebuilt the PRTG monitoring server and software from the ground up.
- o Allows us visibility into network device uptimes, outages, performance, and irregularities.
- o Allows us to be proactive in detecting problems with the network or network connected equipment including servers.

Set up a network-based, mass-imaging system to allow us to reimage our Windows based computers.

- o We will be using this to reimage our lab computers this Summer as we move to Windows 11.
- Allows us to push out new software and configurations more quickly and consistently to our lab computers.
- Aids us as we replace old staff laptops with new ones so that all staff computers are configured consistently.

• Implemented new features in the notes system.

- o Added Periods to JH/HS Classes
- o Added the ability to Add Co-Teachers.
- Student Plans can now be deactivated but information retained if needed.

Implemented new features in the lottery system.

- o Parents have accounts where they can login to add or see the status of students currently in the lottery.
- Lottery now will collect information that will help with registration including relationships to students.
- o Lottery Draws will have the ability to show current priority lists during a draw and will be listed in the order of the priority lists followed by the normal lottery.
- o A new archiving feature will be added to keep track of enrolled students from the lottery.

- Implemented a Bus violation System for the Aristotle Campus.
 - Modified the High School violation system to enforce bus rules.

Financial Aspects:

We strive to keep projects and work in house to save money as well as to improve our knowledge and skill sets for professional development. The more intimately we know the systems and how they work, the more quickly and effectively we're able to troubleshoot or repair them should the need arise. Performing the work ourselves also keeps the costs and reliance on 3rd party support and contractors down.

- The I.T. Team continues to perform the majority of all installations, repairs, and configurations of I.T. equipment and software whenever possible. This allows for professional development and expands the skillsets of each team member while keeping costs for 3rd party support and contractors down. This works includes:
 - o Running and installing our own ethernet and fiber optic lines throughout the campuses.
 - o Building, configuring, and maintaining our entire server infrastructure.
 - Installing and configuring all network appliances including firewalls, switches, wireless access points, and security cameras.
 - Repairing out of warranty computers.
 - o Monitoring, mitigating, and responding to cyber security vulnerabilities and threats.
- We continue to develop and use our own custom-built notes system savings of \$5,000/year plus added security of hosting it on our own servers in-house.
- The IT staff spends money prudently, taking into consideration which avenues will yield the best results (repair vs replace) while also making sure the services and equipment purchased will improve the effectiveness and efficiency of the school.

Next Year's Goals:

The technology team has accomplished a great deal this last year alone, but there are still many areas that we wish to improve upon. We have been working to streamline our systems and services so they are consistent, more secure, and more reliable between all campuses. This will greatly aid us in our future endeavors for expansion as our equipment and configurations will be consistent and easy to replicate.

- Finish adding all technology devices and grant-purchased equipment to inventory for accurate reporting.
- Finish installation of new projectors at the Plato campus over the Summer. HS and Aristotle campuses are complete.
- Continue to replace aging/failing staff computers as part of our staff computer refresh.
- Plan IT needs for Jr. High expansion.

Top Concerns

- Email security is limited to what Google provides. We are currently looking at 3rd party software solutions that will provide us with additional controls and intelligent filtering of unwanted or malicious emails.
 - o Google Workspace's email, Gmail, is lacking in terms of built in security.
 - Sophisticated email attacks are becoming more prevalent.

- Vulnerabilities due to outdated software. We are planning to implement a patch management solution to automatically keep all software applications up to date with the latest software versions on staff and student computers.
 - Windows based computers currently require manual intervention to apply 3rd party software updates.
 - Outdated software poses a security risk as they do not have the lasts security patches installed.
- Professional development opportunities.
 - o IT typically differs from teaching professional development or continuing education.
 - o Ability to attend conferences for technology in education (ISTE, FETC, TCEA, etc.).
 - o Testing materials and support for IT certifications (CompTIA, CCNP, CySA+, CDPSE, etc.).





Q5 How would you rate your overall experience at LCS?





Q6 How would you rate the curriculum at LCS?








Q8 How would you rate your ability to effectively find information you need on Liberty's website?





Agenda Item:	Review of Bullying Policies
Purpose:	To review Liberty Common School's polices regarding bullying, and make recommendations to the board.
Submitted by:	Patrick Albright

BACKGROUND

- At the February 2024 regular board meeting, board member Patrick Albright was appointed to review school policies related to bullying.
- Review of policies showed the following:
 - Board policies do not directly address bullying.
 Policy 5.2 addresses student accountability in a general manner.
 Policy 5.4 addresses student discipline and refers to the parent/student handbook.
 Policy 5.9 addresses sexual harassment, not bullying in a more general manner.
 - The student/parent handbook for all three campuses contains a bullying policy (High school handbook section 4.8, elementary school handbooks section 3.8). The policy as written in the handbooks addresses the following:
 - 1. Explicit and thorough definition of bullying
 - 2. Cites relevant state law
 - 3. Defines procedures for dealing with bullying for staff, students, and administration--including follow up.
 - 4. Defines when and where the school has jurisdiction over student behavior.
 - 5. Includes cyber-bullying to make certain that remote bullying is taken as seriously as in-person bullying.
 - 6. Explicitly connects our capstone virtues and foundation stones to the reasons bullying is not permitted or tolerated at Liberty.

This policy is very clear and thorough, and addresses all of the points the reviewer believes the policy should address—particularly its connection to the school's capstone virtues.

RECOMMENDATION

• I recommend that the Liberty Common School Board of Directors votes to adopt the bullying policy below as section 5.11 of the board's policy manual. This action will take an existing policy that the administration is currently enforcing and explicitly place the weight of the board's support behind this policy, making this a statement of values that the board of directors hold.

5.11 Bullying

Bullying is not tolerated at Liberty Common School (LCS). In accordance with Section **22-32-109** (2)(a)(I) through (X), C.R.S (2002), LCS promotes prevention

and effective, consistent responses to incidents of bullying. This policy complies with all applicable state laws, rules, and school-district policies.

Bullying betrays Respect, Citizenship, Self-Control, and Responsibility as set forth in the school's Foundation Stones; and, Justice and Temperance as set forth in the school's Capstone Virtues. Bystanders who fail to take action in the presence of bullying betray the Capstone Virtues of Fortitude, Gratitude, Prudence, and Patriotism. The purpose of this policy (Policy) is to make clear Liberty Common School's position on all forms of bullying, observations of bullying, and to establish procedures to be followed where bullying is known or alleged to have occurred.

This Policy specifically addresses bullying by LCS students and students visiting from other schools. Incidents of bullying shall be treated with the seriousness they deserve, promptly and fairly for the benefit of all parties concerned. Students shall not engage in any form of bullying as defined by law or in this Policy.

LCS is committed to providing a safe place for learning, teaching, and gathering free from unlawful harassment and power-imbalances that result from bullying. The adoption and enforcement of the provisions of this Policy are in keeping with this commitment.

5.11.1 Bullying is hereby defined as:

- 1. Any written or verbal expression, or physical or electronic act or gesture, or a pattern thereof, that is intended to coerce, intimidate, or cause any physical, mental, or emotional harm to any student; or,
- 2. Aggressive behavior that results in an imbalance of power, such as but not limited to a student's use of physical strength, a credible threat to use force or coercion, access to embarrassing information, and/or popularity to control or harm others.

5.11.2 Scope of policy

This Policy applies to conduct occurring on LCS property and at LCS-sanctioned events or programs off school property, such as study-abroad programs, fieldtrips, or internship programs. Liberty Common School (LCS) or "the school," as used in this Policy, applies to students in all grades kindergarten through twelfth grade.

5.11.3 Related definitions

- Complainant. Any LCS student seeking resources, support, and/or a formal disciplinary process in response to bullying.
- 2. **Respondent.** Any LCS student who has been alleged to have violated this policy.
- 3. **Bystander.** Any student who witnesses bullying in any of the forms described herein.

4. Pattern. Any bullying behavior that happens more than once

5.11.4 Procedure

- It is the responsibility of Liberty Common School to insist all students and faculty set a positive example by not engaging in bullying. LCS will take action by:
 - a. Providing procedures to address bullying reports and accusations to all students and parents;
 - b. Encouraging the reporting of all accusations that meet this Policy's definition;
 - c. Reporting results of any bullying investigation to law enforcement in a timely manner as specified below;
 - d. Following-up with complainant to ensure the behavior has stopped, and that he/she has not experienced any retaliation or reprisal.
 - e. Having any additional adults present during conversations between administrators and students as the principal deems necessary.
- 2. If a student thinks he/she is a victim of bullying, he/she is encouraged to first speak to the alleged bully and insist the behavior be stopped. If the behavior continues, the alleged victim will report the bullying to any LCS faculty, staff member, or administrator. However, if the alleged victim feels he/she is unable to safely approach the alleged bully, he/she will immediately report the incident to any LCS faculty, staff member, or administrator.
- 3. Reporting by faculty, staff, or administrator. It cannot be controlled if a complaint will be made or to whom the complainant will first speak. It is important all school employees understand that reports of incidents that meet the bullying definition of this Policy are to be immediately channeled to a school administrator. Reports of bullying should never be taken lightly or disregarded and allowed to circulate without concern for the integrity and reputation of the accused, the accuser, the school, and the greater community.
 - a. Upon the reporting of any bullying allegation, LCS will take immediate action to eliminate the misconduct, prevent its recurrence, and address its effects.
 - b. As soon as the school administration knows, or reasonably should know about a possible bullying event, there should be a prompt investigation to determine relevant facts such as they may be reasonably ascertained. The investigation should be prompt, thorough, and impartial.
 - c. Promptly upon completing the investigation and determining what occurred, the school administration should determine if the bullying incident meets the criteria of any specific criminal violation according to Colorado criminal statute, including, but not limited to, physical assault, stalking, threat with a deadly weapon, taking a thing of value, etc.

- All bullying cases that violate an existing Colorado criminal statue will be reported to law enforcement in accordance with state statute and this policy.
- ii. If upon completing the investigation the school administration is unsure whether the complaint meets the criteria of a Colorado criminal statute, it will report the incident to local law enforcement.
- iii. If upon completing the investigation the school administration determines the incident does not meet the definition of a Colorado criminal statute, disciplinary procedures outlined elsewhere in the Student/Parent Handbook, with a reasonable balance between the pattern and severity of the bullying behavior, will be applicable.
- iv. During the time which the school administration communicates disciplinary procedures to the respondent, a discussion reinforcing acceptable behavior expectations will also occur.
- d. The LCS Board of Directors will be notified of any incident in which law enforcement becomes involved.
- 4. Student bystanders and witnesses to bullying. Bystanders who witness acts of bullying which meet the definition of this Policy have moral obligations in accordance with the School's Foundation Stones and Capstone Virtues:
 - a. Never laugh or engage in any behavior that might encourage the bully.
 - b. Do not become an audience for the bully.
 - c. Privately reach out to the victim to offer friendship and support. Encourage the victim to respond in accordance with this policy.
 - d. Include the victim in activities with you and/or your friends.
- 5. Administration follow-up: After an investigation has occurred and the reporting to law enforcement has been completed in accordance with this policy, the school administration will follow up with all parties involved.
 - a. The school administration will meet or speak with the complainant and his/her parents, informing them that appropriate disciplinary actions have been taken, and any reports filed with law enforcement when applicable. Due to the School's legal obligations to protect the privacy of all students, it is possible details of disciplinary actions or non-public student records are unable to be disclosed or discussed with persons other than the student's parents. The school administration will communicate any new information received from law enforcement, or any other source, pertaining to the incident and/or the after effects of the incident as appropriate.
 - b. The school administration will meet or speak with the respondent(s) and his/her parents to implement discipline, and inform of any reports filed with law enforcement when applicable. The school administration will communicate any new information received from law enforcement,

or any other source, pertaining to the incident and/or the after effects of the incident as appropriate.

5.11.5 Cyberbullying

Liberty's electronic devices, computer networks, or other property, whether accessed on campus or off, during or after school hours, may not be used for the purpose of harassment. All forms of harassment over the Internet, commonly referred to as "cyberbullying," are unacceptable and viewed as a violation of Liberty's acceptable computer-use policy and procedures.

Malicious use of Liberty's computer system to develop programs or to institute practices that harass other users or gain unauthorized access to any entity on the system and/or damage the components of an entity on the network is prohibited. Users are responsible for the appropriateness of the material they transmit over the system.

Hate mail, harassment, discriminatory remarks or other antisocial behaviors are expressly prohibited. Cyber-bullying includes, but is not limited to the following misuses of school technology: Harassing, teasing, intimidating, threatening or terrorizing another person by sending or posting inappropriate and hurtful e-mail messages, instant messages, text messages, digital pictures or images, or website postings, including blogs. It is also recognized that the author (poster or sender) of inappropriate material is often disguised (logged on) as someone else.

Students and community members who believe they have been the victim of such misuses of Liberty-owned technology, as described herein, should not erase the offending material from the system. A copy of the material should be printed or otherwise preserved and brought to the attention of the Administration.

For situations in which cyber-bullying originates from a non-school computer, and is brought to the attention of school officials, any disciplinary action shall be based upon whether the conduct is determined to be severely disruptive of the educational process so that it markedly interrupts or severely impedes the day-to-day operations of the school and is in violation of a publicized school policy. Such conduct includes, but is not limited to, threats, or making a threat off school grounds, to harm an employee, student or Member of the Board of Directors of The Liberty Common School. Disciplinary action may include, but is not limited to, loss of computer privileges, detention, suspension or expulsion for verified perpetrators of cyber-bullying.

5.11.6 Copy of Policy

A copy of this policy shall be kept in the parent/student handbooks. Whenever this policy is updated, so too shall the parent/student handbooks be updated.

Purpose:	To adopt the grievance policy as part of the board policy manual.

BACKGROUND

- When parental grievances are communicated to the board, it is important that the board is aligned with a specific process for how grievances are handled.
- The grievance process is described in the parent/student handbooks, but not in board policy.
- It is desirable that the grievance policy be adopted as board policies so that it is readily available for review by board members when a grievance is received, and carries the weight of board support behind it.
- Additionally, a section has been added to give guidance to board members whenever a
 grievance is received—referencing the board chairman's role as the spokesperson for the
 board, a reminder to adhere to open meetings laws, and a reminder of the policy and
 procedures whenever a grievance is received by the board.

RECOMMENDATION

• I recommend that the Liberty Common School Board of Directors votes to adopt the following grievance policy in the board policy manual.

2.23 Grievance Policy

2.23.1 Grievance Procedures for Parents of Students

Liberty Common School values opinions, perspectives, and ideas of the parents of students at the school, as well as the importance of being accountable to parents for the educational program for their children.

An important element of institutional accountability is to provide avenues for parent suggestions and grievances that both satisfy parents, and improve the operation of the school. The sequence for raising parent suggestions and grievances is prioritized as follows.

Sequence for Expressing Parental Concern:

1. Teacher appointment — If a concern exists regarding specifics of the classroom, the teacher, or relevant support-staff member may be contacted directly for an appointment. We recommend parents work directly with the teacher to resolve concerns for which teachers are responsible. Parents should be mindful of the

- time constraints of teachers. Please do not interrupt a teacher's lunch, or grading time.
- 2. Principal appointments If a concern exists regarding a specific area of school administration, or if a parent has been unable to satisfactorily address a concern by working directly with the teacher regarding classroom issues, the principal (or an assistant principal) may be contacted directly for an appointment. Parents utilizing this avenue can expect a response from the principal as soon as practical.
- 3. Personal Appointments If there exists a concern of a personal nature involving a particular member of the LCS staff, or Board of Directors, the individual may be contacted directly for an appointment. Parents should be careful to respect the time, and privacy of those they need to contact.
- 4. If a parent has pursued all available options, yet issues remain unresolved, a formal grievance may be summarized and submitted in writing to the Board of Directors. The Board will review the summary, and make one of the following determinations: The Board may sustain a previous administrative decision. The Board may appoint up to two of its members to investigate the matter. The Board may address the matter in an open Board format. The Board may address the matter in an executive session.
- 5. BOD Meeting Parent grievances may be raised during the community comment portion of any BOD meeting.
- 6. If there is a concern related to sexual harassment involving any member of the Liberty Common School community which impedes access to the school's educational programming, refer to grievance procedures in the LCS Title IX Policy.

Proposed Action to BOD: Parents should refer to the board policy manual, section 2.5: ACTION BY PARENT/STAFF INITIATIVE for the process of proposing specific action to the board for consideration of adoption.

2.23.2 Grievance Handling by Board Members

- 1. A copy of the policy 2.23.1 shall be kept in the parent/student handbooks. Whenever this policy is updated, so too shall the parent/student handbooks be updated.
- 2. For grievances directed to the board as a whole, refer to policy 2.8 Board Officers and Responsibilities, Board President, subsection 8 detailing the board president's role as spokesperson for the board.
- 3. Board members shall be mindful of open meetings laws when discussing the grievance, as they should be for all discussions.
- 4. When a grievance is sent to the board as a whole, the board president shall send a copy of this grievance policy to all board members and the headmaster as a reminder of the proper procedures in handling grievances.
