BIG FIRST INNING CARRIES CROCKETT DIAMONDERS; LADY CAV TENNIS TOPS DYER COUNTY

Hindsight, it is said, is always 20/20.

And - in hindsight - perhaps Chester County baseball coach Mike Goff wishes he had penciled in Caleb Cole as his starting pitcher Wednesday against Crockett County.

Cole, a junior, stifled the Cavaliers on just two hits over the game's final six innings, holding Coach Brent Fronabarger's club scoreless.

The problem for the Eagles was that Cole didn't pitch the first frame. Dhanin Patel did. And Crockett took advantage of his four walks by lighting him up for four other hits, producing a six-run rally that carried the Cavs to a 6-3 victory in a game played in a Jackson South Side tournament.

By the time Blaine Nichols - batting for the second time in the opening inning - smashed a hard ground ball up the middle for a single that plated the final two runs of the uprising, Patel had thrown 42 pitches and the Cavs had matched their highest run total for one frame since an eight-tally outburst against Halls on April 5.

Nichols actually grounded out to third on the game's second pitch, but then Patel began to have trouble locating his throws. He walked Reed Ingram and Brady Fronabarger before Carter Winders singled to load the bases. Patel then walked Joseph Gould to force in the contest's first run, and it caved in on him from there.

Callan Willis lined a single to center to score Fronabarger and Landon Wicker singled to right to plate courtesy runner Preston Lambert for a 3-0 lead. Another four-pitch walk to Grayson Lambert forced in the fourth tally before the second out was finally recorded. But before Patel could catch his breath, Nichols belted his next toss into center to make it 6-0, Cavaliers.

Crockett's Tyler Rathbun made it stand up, going the distance on the mound for the winners although touched for runs in the first and third. But he effectively scattered the eight hits and three walks he allowed, with catcher Winders doing him a huge favor by picking a runner off third base in the midst of a two-run Eagle rally.

Rathbun pitched around a leadoff double in the fourth, a two-out walk in the fifth, a first-batter error in the sixth, and a one-out single in the seventh to boost Crockett's overall record to 11-9.

Willis and Winders had two hits apiece for the Cavs, supporting Nichols' big tworun single. Hunter McLemore was the lone Chester County player to collected more than one safety.

Crockett will face Jackson Christian School Thursday afternoon at 4:00 as the South Side tournament continues in Jackson.



TENNIS: It took eight days to complete, but Crockett's tennis teams finished a weather-interrupted match with Dyer County in Alamo Wednesday afternoon with the girls posting a 5-2 victory but the boys dropping a 4-2 decision, with one doubles match not contested.

Crockett's #1 doubles team of Izzy Yearwood and Brennan Morris blitzed Dyer's Ashlynn Poe and Aylin Ramirez 8-0 and Miley Silva posted an 8-4 triumph at #5 singles to complete the Lady Cavs' victory. The #2 doubles unit of Ashley Boone and Casey Thornton dropped a close 8-6 decision to Dyer County.

In singles battles finished on the day the match actually began - April 16 - Yearwood beat Poe 8-0 at #1; Thornton topped Ramirez 8-1 at #2; Morris dropped an extended duel with Abair 9-7 at #3; and Boone bested Emma Hilliard 8-4 at #4. With Silva adding her win Wednesday, Crockett claimed four of the five singles wins to clinch the match.

On the boys side, Dyer County had already claimed three of the first four singles encounters. Bo Dodds knocked off Crockett's Baker Jones 8-5 at #1; the Cavs' Miles McCarter took down Dyer's Mason Adkins 8-4 at #2, but was unavailable for doubles play Wednesday because of a foot injury; the Choctaws' Seth LaRue won 8-4 at #3 over Haydan Castillo; and Dyer's Clay Dodds defeated Crockett's Lance Yearwood 8-0 at #4. In the #5 match completed Wednesday, Dver's Drayce Wright outlasted Crockett's Adam Booker 8-4.

Since the Choctaws had already scored enough points to win the team match, #2 doubles wasn't played. But in the #1 doubles contest, Crockett's Jones and Jack Sanders downed Dyer's Dodds and Adkins 8-5.

Both Crockett teams will be beginning district tournament play next week. Brackets and site locations will be decided on Friday. Sarah Kennedy is coaching the Crockett squads with the assistance of Susie Randall.
