Principal Updates:

- STAR Results goal is for 75% growth. Teachers do STAR assessments in between the Fall, Winter, and Spring and this makes the percentages adjust. Computer based all grades are tested except Pre-K. The Star test adapts to student responses which makes each test individual to the student. The current numbers represent growth from the fall. The data is being examined for opportunities to make improvement.
- **Homework School** "bubble" kids are identified, these are students on the cusp of reaching goals. 20 will need to be identified to join this program for additional support. Spring Star scores determine the CRP students in September.

- SC Report Card Results 2021-2022 52% Average (this is one point away from Good)
 - <u>Academic Achievement</u> comes from SC Ready Average
 - <u>Preparing for Success</u> Comes from the 4th grade SC Pass Science (Below Average) To address this area there has been a big push for science in the 4th grade. Thinking

about how to spiral concepts and revisit earlier topics to ensure students are refreshed with the material prior to testing.

- <u>EL Progress</u> Good this is the Access score.
- Student Progress Average
- <u>School Climate</u> Average comes from end of year survey.
- <u>Teacher Survey</u> 56 responses from faculty and staff. The highest level of Likert scale 4 and 5 responses were to being comfortable sharing ideas with the team, the remaining questions showed around 50% at the 4 and 5 level of satisfaction, 15-20% at the 3 level, the remaining are scoring 1 and 2. Principal Cook is talking with faculty and the district to address concerns to ensure teacher and staff retention.

• PTO Updates:

- Heart Hop was a huge success!
- PTO cleaned the garden area by the kindergarten classes.
- PDQ fundraisers are going on this month.

• <u>Teachers</u>

- Noted that they are analyzing results of the STAR test and SC Report Card to find strengths in their teaching and use those strengths to innovate.
- Kindergarten lead teachers have met and are planning to have the "Welcome to Kindergarten" event.

Parents and Community –

- Both parents and community SIC members discussed the safety of the school. There is
 a request to ensure the glass surrounding the office and Ms. Kendrick are bullet proof.
 In addition, there are concerns about the windows facing the streets being bullet proof
 and how safe the portables are in case of emergency. Principal Cook will be raising
 these concerns. It was also suggested to have a security walk through the building.
- Community members asked about the debris in the dirt parking lot and the asbestos protocol from the recent treatment.
