# High School schedule consists of 9 Periods and a lunch

- **English** - Regents English or Honors English
- **Social Studies** - Regents or Honors Global History 9 or Honors World History (WHAP)
- **Math** - Regents Algebra or Regents or Honors Geometry
- **Science** - Regents or Honors Earth Science
- **Earth Science Lab/Physical Education**
- **Foreign Language** - Regents Spanish 2 or Regents French 2
- **Fine Arts** - 1 Credit
- **Health** - half year/other half year elective
- **Extra help period**
- **Lunch**

# Academic Levels

- Honors classes are available in English, Global History, Geometry, and Earth Science.
- In Math, an Algebra I with an additional lab class may be recommended for students who need more in-depth math assistance.
- Placement levels for the major subjects are determined by the student's current academic standing and teacher recommendation
- Questions regarding placements should be directed to your child's teacher.

# THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT A HIGH SCHOOL SCHEDULE

## What is the difference between Regents, Honors or AP courses?

Honors classes require learners to complete more work than Regents level courses, and AP classes can be even more demanding. While honors classes feature advanced high school coursework, AP classes are designed to mirror college-level coursework. In both honors and AP classes, difficulty level varies by subject.

*\*You may need to meet certain grade requirements and earn teacher recommendations to be enrolled in honors or AP classes.*

## What is a high school credit?

Successful completion of a full year high school level course is worth one high school credit, students will need 23 credits to graduate high school.

## What is a high school transcript?

A permanent record of a student's final grades for all completed high school courses.
