Roll Call

The Director of Pupil Services, Sabrina Scott gave a presentation to the Board of Education that described the Presentations functions of the Pupil Services Department, she explained how they interact with students, staff and parents, as well as, discussed the state and federal requirements/laws that their department are required to comply. Lisa Cistolo and Tammy Klammer followed with a presentation of the department goals. Those goals included closing the achievement gap, providing professional development, training and resources to staff, implementation of components of the IEP to establish consistency, the implementation of the least restrictive environment and specifically designed Instruction and the development of consistent procedures (forms and H. B. 410 for Pre-K through 12th grade students. Scott Barber described to the Board of Education the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support Program and how the goal for that program promote positive mental health in the district. Mr. Barber reviewed each Tier of the program and the goals for each Tier.

Members of the Board asked questions pertaining to the number of identified students, students that have the potential to be identified and the process to identify students.

District Facility Superintendent Sheppard reviewed the progress of meetings with the new elementary school and high school large groups and with the small group meetings. These meetings include talking with individual Update grade levels and departments to get their ideas. He also talked about how the district is updating the website A-3 as soon as possible and while ideas are being discussed, they are not final decisions on the buildings. Mr. Sheppard also reviewed the progress that has been made on the renovation work at the Middleburg Heights Junior High, Middlebrook Education Center and Big Creek Elementary Schools.
