Such services may be terminated at any time by the Board or the firms Squire, Sanders & Dempsey; Peters Kalail & Markakis Co., LPA; Walter Haverfield; DK Smith Law, LLC David Kane Smith; and Riley & Associates; and by written notice to the other.

Section 2: For such legal consultative services, the firms of Squire, Sanders & Dempsey; and Peters Kalail & Markakis Co., LPA, Walter & Haverfield; DK Smith Law, LLC David Kane Smith; and Riley & Associates; shall be paid reasonable fees as approved by the Board, and shall be reimbursed for actual out-of-pocket expenses (including, but not limited to, travel, long distance telephone expenses, and duplicating expenses) incurred in rendering such services, from time to time for such purpose.
