

Minutes of the Regular Business meeting of the Board of Education of the Berea City School District held on Monday, February 3, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in Staff Room 1, Berea Board of Education, 390 Fair Street, Berea, Ohio 44017.

A. Opening Meeting

Welcome to the Regular Board Meeting of the Berea City School District on February 3, 2020

This meeting is a meeting of the Board of Education in public for the purpose of conducting the School District's business and is not to be considered a public community meeting. There is a time for public comment during the meeting as indicated in the agenda.

The Board of Education is a decision-making group. The public may express sentiments to assist the members in making decisions, but time spent answering routine questions or criticisms takes time from the Board's business meeting. Questions about operation of the schools should be directed to your child's teacher or the administrator of the school. Items on the agenda normally include reports from the Board and/or from the Superintendent or his/her staff. These reports do not require formal Board action, but they are relevant to the operation of the schools. Action items on the agenda require formal action by the Board. These items are presented to the Board in motions by Board members, or in recommendations by the Superintendent. Routine business - For efficiency of operation, the Board condenses items of routine business into lists or schedules, and presents these for action as consent agenda items. Board members receive their meeting agendas on the Wednesday preceding the meeting. This provides the opportunity for Board members to review all agenda items and associated exhibits well before considering action.

Michael Slivochka gave the Facility Update. A link to view photos of current construction are of the high school and elementary can be accessed on the February 3, 2020 board agenda under agenda item B5- District Facility Update.

High School – Academic Areas - Wrapping up painting, ceiling and permanent cabinetry work and as those items are finished then they will follow up with flooring. In the middle section that has the Administration rooms and media rooms they are finishing up drywall and painting and afterward will begin the flooring. Music area, auditorium and competition gym, interior masonry is completed and working on mechanical and as that is completed then they will continue with the same process.

Board Member Dockman asked about the timeline for the high school.

Mike Slivochka replied, the main sections A, B & C are still August 1, 2020. They are ahead of scheduled potentially and we are still trying to get clarification on how soon they could potentially move up. The auditorium and gym spaces a completion date of December there is potential that it may be earlier and as soon as we have more details that information will be shared.

President Chapman ask for more information of the "swing" space in the advent that we close the current building for the entire school year for the music classrooms.

Potential area of the new building over by Baldwin Wallace for music and gym if it was not finished, the conversation is we would use a portion of the building (music rooms, gym). In the event it happens to be completed and we are able to get out of our current building earlier, that will allow the contractors to being the demolition process faster. We will look at the current spaces that are large enough to house our current music and physical education department and work out a schedule that will work.

Elementary - When they finish an area, mechanical, painting, cabinetry, then they will work on the flooring. the auditorium roof is finished and they just finished the environmental remediation and will soon begin the Mechanical work in that space. The middle section, the main entrance is being enclosed with windows and brick work and the same with the interior. Main office space is painted and light fixtures then you will see the flooring. Classroom space which is Area C - painting is finished and the area flooring is almost finished. The gym floor is being prepped and the gym floor will soon follow. Kitchen equipment is installed and floor is finished. Area D-1st and 2nd grade and the ceiling is painted, floor prep, in D-2 –ceiling is painted and then the flooring. March 24, 2020 is the time line of completion.

The Board recognized Stacey Jennings, Berea-Midpark Middle School Junior Model United Nations adviser and the following 6th - 8th grade Berea-Midpark Middle School students, for their participation in the Cleveland Council on World Affairs annual Henri Pell Junod, Jr., Junior Model United Nations Conference at John Carroll University on January 8 and 9, 2020. Stacey started the Model UN at the middle school in 2013 thanks to an Education Foundation Grant. This is year 7 of running the program and we have a strong program from 6- 12. Ms. Jennings shared a PowerPoint Presentation and students spoke on their experience.

C. Superintendent Recommendations

Superintendent Wheeler and Cristina Capretta visited both buildings today so that they could get updated pictures for the State of the Schools scheduled for February 6, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. Update at Grindstone Elementary. C-1

Before taking the vote for the Consent Agenda, Mr. Dockman asked to say a few words.

Mr. Dockman spoke to the head football coach issue and stated he has struggled with this, and how to cast his vote of approval of the head football coach in recent weeks. He said he wanted to publically put out there that we as a board have had many spirited debates, discussions and questions for the superintendent and assistant superintendent. It bothers him when people say, all they do is rubber stamp decisions by the superintendent and that is just not true. If people knew what goes on in the background,

Consent Agenda C-2 **20-0203-1076** we don't bring that publicly because this discussion was an Executive Session and I'm certainly not going to violate that trust. But there are some very, very spirited discussions especially on this issue, so rubber stamp is far from it and anybody that knows anybody up here knows that we are not afraid to speak our voice and we don't rubber stamp anything.

Speaking for himself, Mr. Dockman tried to look at how this incident was handled by the head coach (we all know what incident we are talking about). Mr. Dockman stated that he has been there in his shoes, he has been a head coach of a varsity sport so he knows how difficult it is to control, for a lack of a better word, young men at the varsity level. Seventeen and eighteen year old kids who are testing boundaries and testing the coach and seeing how much they can get away with, and the peer pressure they are under. It can be a thankless job. Mr. Dockman also wants it to be publically known that he coached with Jonathan's father-in law, Tom Kauth at Padua High School when he was a young 23-24 year old coach and he had a huge influence on his coaching career and considers Tom a very influential person. Mr. Kauth just retired after 50 years at the same high school, and he did a thankless job and a selfless job, he never looked for any credit and I really respected him and the other assistant coaches, Mr. Dockman just wanted that to be made known.

Mr. Dockman stated that the board is tasked to approve Coach Hunek's contract along with a number of others and there comes a point when we all have to do what we think is right, what is fair and also have to be compassionate and he also believes in giving people another chance. We all don't handle things absolutely perfectly, so there has to be compassion as well as fairness and toughness. But as a board member we have to hold people accountable for their actions and inactions, so that has been the difficult decision. I'm only speaking to myself, can I look myself in the mirror with the decision I make and be comfortable with that. I also believe that Tracy and Mike have made it clear to Coach Hunek what our expectations are as a board, as an administration and as parents, students, players and the community and what we expect from the team. Let's face it Ohio football is a high profile sport and the head coach is a high profile individual and I hold them to a higher standard than the other teams so I am going to vote yes to approve Coach Hunek's contract as our head football coach. I trust Tracy and I trust Mike and Jill they have done an amazing job here in the district and I truly mean that. But, I do expect to see significant culture change in that program that I can watch almost every Friday night. I can't emphasize **significant** enough.
