Board members receive their meeting agendas on the Wednesday preceding the meeting. This provides the opportunity for Board members to review all agenda items and associated exhibits well before considering action.

Section 1: The firms of Squire, Patton, Boggs; Peters Kalail & Markakis Co., LPA; Walter & Haverfield; DK Smith Law, LLC David Kane Smith; and The Riley Law Firm; be and are hereby retained, such legal services to be in the nature of legal representation, including, but not limited to, appearances in court, advice, opinions, and/or all phases of labor negotiations, appearances before the State Employment Relations Board and recommendations that may from time to time be requested by this Board or the Superintendent concerning legal matters relating to education and the operation of the school district. In rendering such legal services, as an independent contractor and in an attorney-client relationship, said firms, Squire, Patton, Boggs; and Peters Kalail & Markakis Co., LPA; Walter & Haverfield,; DK Smith Law, LLC David Kane Smith; and The Riley Law Firm; shall not exercise any administrative discretion on behalf of this Board in the formulation of public policy, expenditure of public funds, enforcement of laws, rules and regulations of the State, any county or city or of this Board, or the execution of public trusts. Such services may be terminated at any time by the Board or the firms Squire, Patton & Boggs; Peters Kalail & Markakis Co., LPA; Walter Haverfield; DK Smith Law, LLC David Kane Smith; and The Riley Law Firm; and by written notice to the other.

Section 2: For such legal consultative services, the firms of Squire, Patton & Boggs; and Peters Kalail & Markakis Co., LPA, Walter & Haverfield; DK Smith Law, LLC David Kane Smith; and The Riley Law Firm; shall be paid reasonable fees as approved by the Board, and shall be reimbursed for actual out-of-pocket expenses (including, but not limited to, travel, long distance telephone expenses, and duplicating expenses) incurred in rendering such services, from time to time for such purpose.
