Barbers Hill Summer School Programs are designed to provide educational opportunities to our students during the month of June. Barbers Hill Summer school programs generally fit into one of the following areas: credit recovery, enrichment, or extended-year for students with special needs.

Barbers Hill Credit Recovery serves students who have difficulty mastering required core content and skills. These students have not mastered the prerequisites and/or skills required for promotion, or they lack the required credits to graduate from high school. They may also have failed one or more STAAR Tests required for promotion and/or graduation.

In Elementary and Middle School, credit recovery consists of remediation in the areas of Mathematics and Language Arts.

At the Secondary Level the courses consist of Algebra, Geometry, Biology, World Geography, and English. Other courses can be added based on demand and/or need.

Barbers Hill Enrichment classes are offered in a variety of designs. Some programs follow the same format as remedial programs, only they are designed to assist a student in accelerating their learning in a smaller scope of time. An example of this are our EB (Emergent Bilingual) program at the elementary level and the Government/Economics Courses for initial credit at the secondary level. Other programs emphasize a particular curricular area, such as reading for our Title I students in grades 1 and 2.

Barbers Hill Extended-Year Services allow the district to serve students with special needs according to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The students ARD (Admission, Review, and Dismissal) Committee, consisting of parents, school personnel, and in many cases the student, develop a plan for summer learning. The student's IEP (Individualized Education Plan) will detail the goals the student will work on during the summer service period.

Accelerated Instruction classes are offered to help our students meet STAAR requirements. This proactive approach gives our students the opportunity to earn up to 24 hours of targeted instruction in each of their deficit areas.
