Graduation Requirements

English	60 units
Mathematics	60 units including one course beyond Algebra II
Science	45 units including Biology, Chemistry, and Physics
Social Studies	45 units including World History, U.S. History, U.S. Government, and Economics
Foreign Language	30 units including two years of same language in 9th-12th grades
Theology	40 units Two terms per year
Business, Computer Science, & Engineering	10 units Two terms, one may be fulfilled in 7th and 8th grades*
Fine Arts	5 units
Physical Education/ Health	15 units including Body Conditioning (9th grade) and Health & Wellness (10th grade)
Community Service	40 hours direct service to others

^{*}High school courses taken in 8th grade do not appear on transcripts.

Curriculum Rigor

Most difficult schedules include the following:

9th Grade	1 AP and/or 1—3 Honors courses
10th Grade	1—2 APs and/or 2—3 Honors courses
11th Grade	3 APs or 4 total of APs and Honors courses
12th Grade	3 APs or 4 total of APs and Honors courses

Please note that juniors and seniors are limited to three AP courses in each academic year.

Grading Scale

All grades on transcripts are unweighted.

A	90-100

In the weighted average calculation, grades in AP courses receive an additional seven (7) points, and grades in honors courses receive an additional three (3) points.

For the convenience of college admissions offices that do not recalculate GPA, an additional 4-point weighted GPA is supplied, based upon the following scale: A = 4.0, B = 3.0, C = 2.0, D = 1.0. With this calculation, college prep courses are weighted by .2, honors courses by .5, and AP courses by .8.
