

AFTER SCHOOL CREDIT RECOVERY (GRADES 50-69) - SPRING 2024

- Credit Recovery is NOT NCAA eligible
- Credit Recovery courses DO NOT replace the previous class grade.
- AP Classes and audits are not eligible for credit recovery.
- Students can only take one Credit Recovery course at a time.
- Parents will be contacted by the student’s counselor when credit has been earned.

Students who have failed a core course (Math, Science, Language Arts, Social Studies, Spanish, or Health) with a final grade between 50-69 are eligible for our Credit Recovery Program. **A fee of \$50 for each Credit Recovery course must be paid on My Payments Plus in order for a student to be registered for a course. Students may only register for ONE course per session.**

****Create a credit recovery account after payment @ <http://www.gacreditrecovery.org/> Students must have an account to be registered for a course and will need their login and password.**

Students must attend in person after school from 2:30pm - 4:30pm. If they finish before the session ends, then they do not have to stay after school. Students may work on their course anytime. This means they can work on it at home, before school, during lunch, or anytime it is convenient. Again, they must report to the assigned computer lab the week they have signed up for, until it is completed. Students who wish to take courses again due to not finishing a course would need to register and pay again through MyPaymentsPlus.

***Milestone courses for 2nd semester.** Students enrolled in Milestones Semester 2 courses will be required to take the milestone at the end of credit recovery.

MCHS Credit Recovery FAQ

What is Credit Recovery?

- Credit Recovery courses have flexible schedules and are not facilitated by a teacher.
- The Credit Recovery Program allows students, who have completed seat time and calendar requirements, to earn credit based on competency of the content standards.

How do I work through my CR course?

1. Read the welcome and course introduction.
2. Take the unit one pretest.
3. If you score an 85% or higher, you do not have to work through all assignments (Skip to #5).
4. If you score lower than 85%, you must work through all content within the unit.
5. Take the unit post test. You must score 70% or higher on the post test to move on to the next unit.

If the student is engaged in an End of Course assessment (EOC) related Credit Recovery course, must they retake the test?

Yes, regardless of a student's previous End of Course assessment (EOC) score, a requirement of the Credit Recovery program is that each public school student must retake the EOC and the EOC score should be reported on the student transcript and count 20% of the course grade. Private school students need to take the final exam available to them in the credit recovery course and are not required by The Georgia Credit Recovery Program to take an EOC.

How will students participate in the Credit Recovery program?

The Georgia Credit Recovery Program provides online (web based) access and instruction to Georgia students registered for a Credit Recovery course. The prescribed program of instruction begins with a pre-assessment based on the Georgia Performance Standards for a unit of the course. The results of this pre-assessment indicate whether the student has achieved mastery of the objectives or whether he/she needs to spend more time on this particular content. After the student has achieved the desired level of mastery, he/she will take the unit test. The grades for the course are based on the unit test scores combined with a final exam or the state mandated EOC if appropriate. The assigned online modules are designed to be student centered allowing the student to work at a pace consistent with their individual learning style. For enrollment procedures, students should contact their local high school.

MyPaymentsPlus Instructions

- 1. Log in to MyPaymentsPlus**
- 2. Click on events and activities**
- 3. Click on "School Fees"**
- 4. Select the student you wish to enroll into credit recovery**
- 5. Click MCHS FY22 Credit Recovery**
- 6. Read all instructions and information.**
- 7. Select Course, semester, of the course you failed and wish to make-up.**
- 8. Input the grade you failed the course with. Only scores between 50-69 are eligible.**
- 9. Create a student account at gacreditrecovery.org**

- 10. An email will be sent to you the week before your session begins.**
- 11. Courses are face to face after school and run from 2:30-4:30.**
- 12. Students must attend sessions until their course is done. They may work on their course outside of their session time as well. Courses must be completed the Sunday following their session.**
 - a. Students who do not complete their course will be withdrawn and credit will not be earned.**
