# **Dorian DeLong Arts & Music Scholarship**



Congratulations to Coronado senior **Devon Bignell** who received the Dorian DeLong Arts and Music Scholarship; extra special because **Dorian DeLong was a Coronado graduate, class of 1989.** 

Dorian was an active student of our Performing Arts Department. He combined his love of music, dance and

theater as a member of the Show Choir. While he went on to study History and become a teacher at Thornton High School, he believed in the power of the arts to engage students and transform lives.

As an advocate, Dorian lobbied to introduce House Bill 1273, encouraging all Colorado Public Schools to protect visual and performing arts programs, and directing the State Board of Education to recognize the importance of the arts in the development of graduation guidelines. This bill was signed into law on May 18, 2010.





Over the past eight years, the Dorian DeLong Foundation has honored his life's work by awarding a four-year scholarship to distinguished Colorado graduates, pursuing advanced education in the study of the arts. It is only fitting that a Coronado art student would be the first District 11 student to receive this memorial scholarship.

Devon Bignell is one of two Visual and Performing Arts students in the state to receive this prestigious scholarship. As a four-time Scholastic Award recipient and former member of the Colorado Springs Youth Symphony, Devon excels in both the Visual and Performing Arts. He will be attending CSU in Ft Collins to study Art History with a minor in Visual Arts. His aspiration is to become an Art Conservator.




