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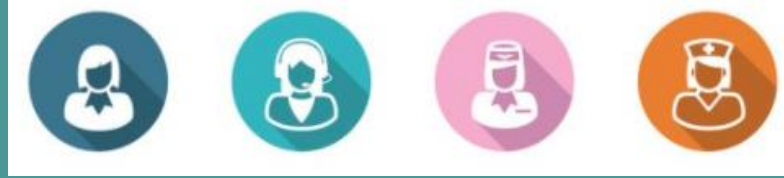

Naviance Student is a comprehensive 7-12 college and career readiness platform that enables self-discovery, career exploration, academic planning, and college preparation.

Through Naviance, each student creates an electronic portfolio of college and career experiences to help make post-secondary decisions that align with his/her talents, interest and aspirations.

PRHS also uses Naviance to electronically send documents to colleges, technical schools and the NCAA Clearinghouse.





Naviance Student is accessible anywhere. While many of the features are familiar, it has been redesigned to provide students the opportunity to engage in college and career planning more effectively and on any of their devices.



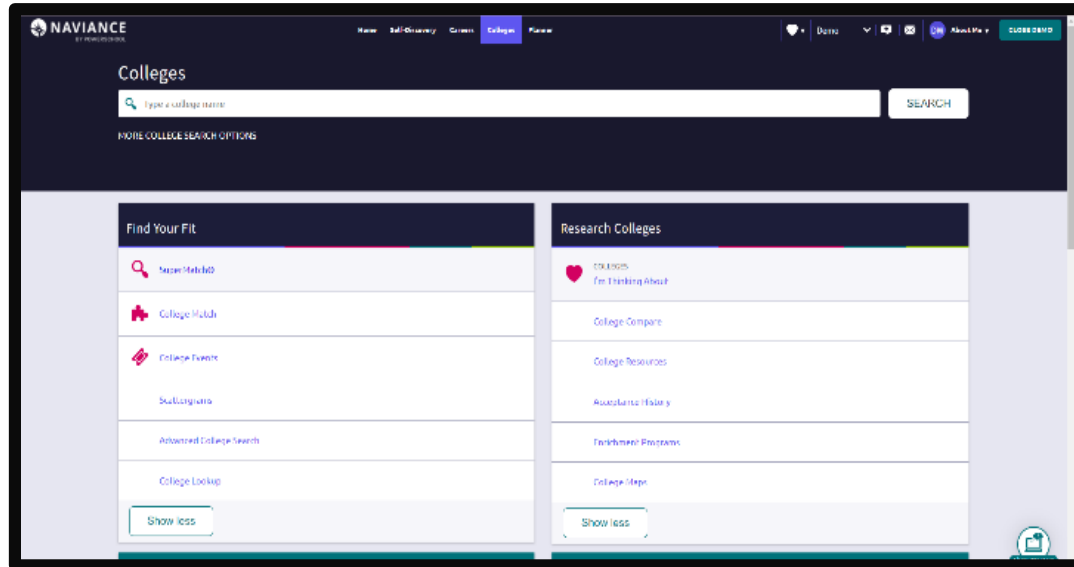

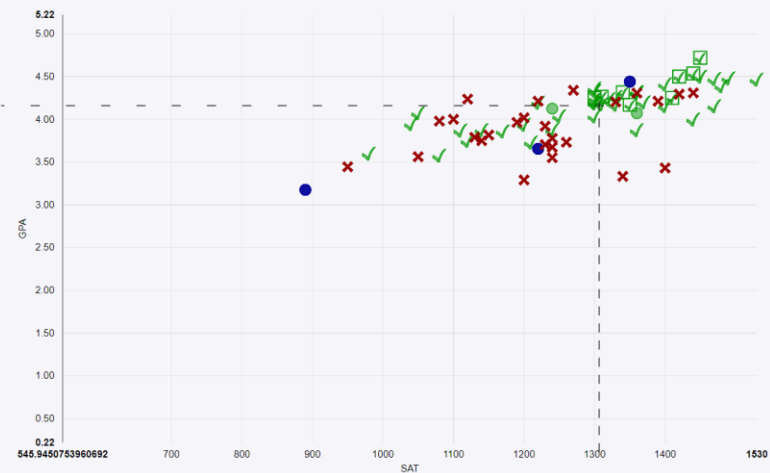

The school counseling office uses Naviance to electronically send the PRHS Profile, student transcripts, teacher letters of recommendation, senior year schedules, mid-year grades, and final transcripts to colleges and technical schools.

Students and parents can monitor requests by checking their accounts. Naviance does not send SAT, ACT or AP scores. Most colleges require students send scores directly from the testing agency.

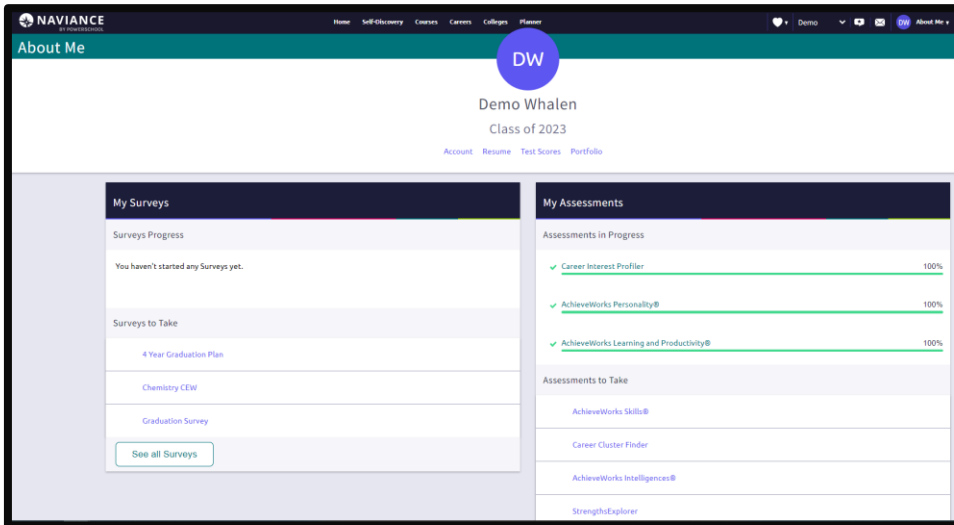
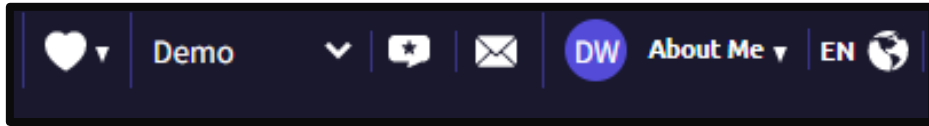
