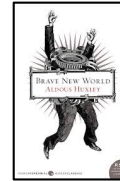

John the Savage: Mark **three** different actions or words of John the Savage that show his “savage” side.

Ford as God: Mark **three** passages that show Ford to be the god of this brave, new world. (for example, times when he has control or authority, passes judgment, etc.)

Lenina Content (or Lenina Unhappy): At times, Lenina seems content with her world and at other times, she seems obviously unhappy. Mark **two** passages where she seems content and **two** passages where she seems unhappy. Mark “content” or “unhappy” on your post-it note.
