The SHAC meeting was called to order at 1:37 by Abigail Trevino. She welcomed all in attendance and discussed the agenda for the SHAC meeting. Reviewed agenda items for today's meeting.

The meeting minutes from November 28, 2023 were reviewed and approved.

Roles and Responsibilities of SHAC: Mission-Vision- Goals, review the roles and responsibilities in slides.

Health Services:

Ana Encinas spoke about updates in the clinic and the most common positives and negatives regarding Strep, Covid and Flu, most visits were for strep. She had a timeline to show utilization trends, visit reasons and testing results. Clinic has been seeing new patients, which means word is going around and new people are learning about our district clinic.

Counseling, Psychological & Social Services:

Kelly Sopchak, a guest from ATM presented the TCHAT/Healthy Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine. This program creates a legislatively funded telemedicine program for identifying and assessing mental health needs, it provides access to mental health services in school. Students are welcome to use telemedicine or telehealth

programs to help identify and assess the behavioral health needs of students that need mental health services.

Mental health care is based in schools in 5 sections. The school is in charge of telehealth with students with parent approval, no wait list students get help right away after getting in parent's approval. Psychiatric also has bilingual services. This program is state funded. Also if 5 or more sections are needed, It will go based on the family income, if they need the assistant because they don't have a way to pay, then the student will get the help they need. Also sections get extended if suicidal or real need care is need it. School counselor will be the one in contact with the to help students. Program is for prek-12.

YAM program for grades 8-12, reduced medical suicide under 18 kids.

HB 3908 Tucker's Law Chief Payovich:

Fentapill Lesson Plan have to be presented to grades 6-12, there is no date set yet, Chief Payovich will find out if there is a date that the lesson needs to be done by.

Fentanyl is a potent prescription synthetic opioid drug approved by FDA for pain relief, and students are taking this pill without knowing that it can cause their death.

Nutritional Services:

Abigail Trevino: TDA Administrative Review Results

Correct of action document was done for the AR, explaining the finding for the application review and determining official. She explained that the correct action will be on CN training our maintenance secretary to help process applications when necessary. She recapped the visit from Chef Tavel to the highschool on monday Feb 5th. She explained how all students were learning a lot from him about food recycling and were really into all he had to say.

Sharon Haney: Chartwells offered samples for SHAC night, samples consisted of a chicken salad wrap, chicken salad sandwich, turkey sandwich with cheese, and a ham & cheese sandwich. Chartwells meal box will consist of a sandwich of preference, cookie, fresh fruit(apple or orange), bag of chips and a bottle of water, price per box is \$10.

Parent/Community Involvement: *Reach Johnson County Prom pop-up:* Nikki Bowman spoke about a Prom pop-up event that will take place on Feb 26-27 in Waxahachie & Feb 29th-March 1st in Burleson, and added a date for Cleburne on March 4th & 5th. There have been over 4000 gowns donated and they also have better selections on plus sizes now. She also suggested that if we can provide transportation for our local students that don't have a way of transportation, like having a bus pick up students from their houses

and taking them to the prom pop-up that is least farther for our students, or having students meet at a local campus and from there take them to the location.

SHAC Family Night-Lori Nunez:

Lori Nunez: Started by saying that we have the funds to continue doing the SHAC night the same way as it has been for the past 2 years. Passed out sticky notes and tell us to write down what we think is not negotiable for the family night. Most thought food, bounce houses, and vendors were not negotiable. Also there was an idea of playing stories on the board screen displayed while parents walk with their kids around the field. SHAC will be on March 28th from 5pm to 7pm.

Physical Education: Coach Welch talked about the Kids Heart Challenge has started and will go on for 2 more weeks, any donations are welcome.

-Intermediate is participating in the Cleaning Out Your Closet Challenge for shoe donations. Funds will help them with PE equipment. –extended challenge thru February, they have collected 65 bags of pairs of shoes. North will be hosting a color run on March 8th as a fundraiser.
