#### **Career and College Planning with Minnesota Career Information System (MCIS)**

MCIS is an online career and college tool ISD 728 is using to help students build their Personal Learning Plan. Students will work on their MCIS Grade Level Checklists throughout the year during Advisory, but planning doesn't need to stop there! Students are encouraged to continue utilizing MCIS throughout their year and even at home! This is a valuable online tool that learners can use for standardized test preparation, researching undergraduate and graduate programs, finding tuition assistance, personal budgeting, college savings information, and inventories to help students plan their next steps. Additionally, users will find advice on resumes, cover letters, interviewing, networking, and more!

Especially exciting for students who are planning to take an ACT or SAT is the *FREE on-demand test prep!* Intuitive practice tests let students retake tests, track progress over time, view grade averages, and create task lists. Dear Families.

Ensuring the safety of our students and staff is our highest priority. We are pleased to announce a collaborative effort between the Sherburne County Sheriff's Office, the Wright County Sheriff's Office, Rogers Police Department, Elk River Police Department, and Elk River Public Schools to share a crucial message regarding proper gun storage and safety.

Last year, 156 children in the U.S. gained access to a firearm and experienced unintentional shootings. In Minnesota alone, an average of 41 children and teens lose their lives to gun-related incidents each year, with 58% of these tragic events being suicides. The importance of proper gun storage cannot be overstated, as improper handling may lead to devastating consequences—ranging from accidental injuries to intentional harm.

Preventing children from accessing unsecured firearms is required under Minnesota Statute Section 609.666: "A person is guilty of a gross misdemeanor who negligently stores or leaves a loaded firearm in a location where the person knows, or reasonably should know, that a child is likely to gain access, unless reasonable action is taken to secure the firearm against access by the child."

We ask that you consider following the **Be SMART** message in your home. It emphasizes the importance of secure gun storage. Consider secure gun storage as an important step you can take to help protect your family, school and community. **Be SMART** stands for:

Secure all guns in your homes and vehicles.

Model responsible behavior around guns.

Ask about unsecured guns in other homes.

Recognize the role of guns in suicide.

Tell your peers to Be SMART.

In addition to following the Be SMART message, you can take action by visiting the besmartforkids.org website to watch and share the Be SMART educational video and access Be SMART printable resources.

#### From the Health Office......

All students going home ill during the school day MUST be seen in Health Services in order for their absence to be excused:

#### **Communicable Disease & Infections:**

Influenza season is just around the corner and as we know, illnesses are prevalent in our schools. Health Services offices are structured to keep students in school as much as possible so they can meet their educational goals. Unfortunately, there are times when students *need* to stay home to get well in order to prevent exposure and the spread of illness to others. If your child has been diagnosed with a communicable disease, such as influenza, strep throat, COVID-19, please report these confirmations to the Health Services Personnel in your child's school building. Reporting forms are no longer available on the district website for COVID-19.

#### Scents and Essential Oils

Many people (students and staff) have allergies and reactions to scents. Please avoid using products with strong scents or fragrances which include perfumes, colognes and heavily scented deodorants. Essential oils can also cause allergic reactions to students and staff members. See ISD 728 Guidelines:

Essential oils are concentrated volatile liquids that give plants their characteristic scents and are isolated from the plant by mechanical means. They are used primarily in perfumes and flavorings, and for aromatherapy. When used in diffusers the essential oil is being distributed to every person breathing that air.

Essential oils are not without risk, especially for children. In a typical classroom of students, we have some who are immunocompromised, have ADHD, seizures, taking numerous medications, have allergies, and respiratory conditions such as asthma. Use of essential oils could cause life threatening reactions in these students.

Essential oils, in the pure form, may be used as follows:

- Diluted in a solution to clean yoga mats with the following prescribed ratio:
  - a. Fill spray bottle with cold water
  - b. Add 1-2 Tablespoons of white vinegar (antibacterial agent)
  - Add 3-4 droplets of essential oil lavender (anti-bacterial) or tree oil or peppermint, or lemongrass (anti-fungal & anti-bacterial)
- For therapeutic reasons, a written consent must be provided by a Health Care provider and cleared through a Licensed School Nurse (LSN)
- Personal, controlled use by a student, staff member or visitor that does not distract others or put another's health at risk

Essential oils may not be used as follows:

- In diffusers
- Applied to any student, even if the parent requests staff to administer, without a Health Care Provider order
- In professional development sessions
- Any circumstance that is disruptive or puts another's health at risk

#### If essential oils are found:

- In diffusers:
  - Diffuser is removed and disposed of properly
- On students/staff which are disruptive or putting another's health at risk
  - Do not use water to wash off as it may increase irritation by spreading the oils.
  - o Offer clean clothing, as needed and as available
  - Notify parent, if necessary
