#### School Business Administrator's Report - Mr. Gordon Gibbs

Reported on the approval to submit the preliminary 2024-2025 budget in the amount of \$53,809,471, with a school tax levy of a 2.86% increase from the current year, using the State regulated banked cap of \$331,911, due to the increase in health care costs as well as the zero percent increase in state aid for general education appropriations. Announced that the 2024-2025 budget presentation will take place at the April 29th board meeting. Reported that the new carpet installation in the PTHS auditorium and the beam replacement in the media center will begin on March 18th. The RFP for attorney will be advertised next week with a response date of March 29, 2024. Reminded administrators and board members to complete their financial disclosure statements. Announced that the ninth Zoning Board of Adjustment meeting will take place at the high school on Tuesday, April 30th.
