More 140th birthday history...In 1903 the furnishings of the Reading Room supported by the D.A.R. in a room under Carroll's Drug Store was joined with the library in its new home. The D.A.R. paid for part of the rent for 3 years and furnished the magazines and papers until 1916. Books which had been in the reading room were also given to the library. The D.A.R. also joined an art society and exhibited a new collection of photographs each month which aroused much interest. Sometime before or around the removal of the library to the Court House Block the town had commenced making annual appropriations, \$600 in 1904. Many of us remember that pleasant room so conveniently located that it was much enjoyed and used. Miss Emma Kinney became librarian at this time continuing until 1932, when she resigned because of ill health. The continued progress of the library is largely due to her faithful and efficient service for 30 years.




