
courage you to ask your child(ren) about the STEP process and reinforce it at home too!

The fifth graders had three beautiful days for their trip to Eagle Bluff during the last week of April. About 30 students, 4 staff, and a parent went for Bryn Mawr's first trip to Eagle Bluff and had a great time. Students had the opportunity to try out a high ropes course and every student stepped into their personal "challenge zone" pushing through their fears. It was so fun to see them on the platforms deciding which next challenge to take! Everyone's individual challenge zone meant that for some students getting their harness on and trying ground school was pushing their limits. We are so proud of them!

Several of our classes focused on science themes. Archery engineers had the students learning how to use a bow and arrow, discussing which is faster - cars, airplanes, Usain Bolt, roller coasters, etc. They then got to do experiments with different types of arrows to build the fastest arrow possible. In Animal Signs we went looking for animal tracks, scat, and other signs. We did find some good tracks in the woods. We also got to touch snakes and turtles! We also hung out with a Turkey Vulture while we learned about the physics behind flight!

Our fourth class was all about survival. After learning that we can't survive more than 3 seconds without a positive attitude but could survive for almost 3 weeks without food we went out in the woods. In the woods we built shelters and then tried to get fires started! Some groups had more success than others in fire building and enjoyed some warm lemonade!

Other highlights included s'mores at the bonfire after signing camp songs, free time in the dorms with friends, a night hike where we saw the sunset and full moon rise over the Root River, and delicious food.

It was so fun to see the students out exploring and doing things they've never done before. Some students who don't normally talk at school, were raising their hand with answers and questions!! Everyone was definitely tired but so many good memories were made!! We are very proud of the students who went!! And
