

PROPOSED DRAFT BYLAW-TAG SALES

Sec. 1. The purpose of this bylaw is to provide residents guidance and requirements for holding tag, garage, yard and estate sales.

Sec. 2. Definitions:

TAG SALE: This term is used interchangeably with garage sale and yard sale and is intended to be a periodic, short-term event for the sale of normal household items, clothing, and small yard equipment, usually displayed on the owner's lawn and/or driveway.

COMMUNITY TAG SALE: Several households in a neighborhood may join together to have a tag sale the same day with prospective buyers going to each house.

ESTATE SALE: These types of sales are a one-time event for the liquidation of the belongings of an estate or contents of a home and may occur within the home or have items displayed outdoors.

Sec. 3. A permit is required in all instances and may be obtained from the Town Clerk's office at Town Hall during regular business hours.

- The fee for a tag sale is \$5.00.
- The fee for a community tag sale is \$10.
- The fee for an estate sale is \$25.00.

Sec. 4. Sales may take place on weekends or up to three consecutive days.

At the end of the sale, all unsold items must be disposed of properly. All signage advertising the sale must be removed within 24 hours of the end of any such sale.

Sec. 5. When conducting a sale, homeowners and the general public must respect traffic rules in town.

Illegal Parking: No person shall park, allow, or permit a vehicle to be parked in any of the following places:

- upon any public way where the location of the parked vehicle obstructs the view or line of sight of vehicular traffic so as to not

leave a clear and unobstructed view for approaching or intersecting vehicles;

- in front of a public or private driveway without the consent of the owner;
- within 10 feet from a fire hydrant, whether on a public or private way or location;
- upon a sidewalk or upon a crosswalk;
- parked in the opposite direction of the travel lane, whereas a vehicle's passenger side wheels are not closest to the curb or roadway shoulder; and,
- in a restricted areas where parking is prohibited by posted signs.

Sec. 6. Enforcement: The Chief of Police or his designee are the designated enforcers of this bylaw.
