Was the outcome/goal of this Collegial Circle met? Explain.

Yes, we were able to develop a simple text coding system that the students are able to use to mark text indicating their understanding of main ideas, important words, things they don't understand and questions they may have. We were also able to focus on pieces of text we already use and develop some questioning to go along with them that will force the students to think more critically about the stories. The teachers were able to set up the situations where students listened to text and then went back to the text to see what words the author used to help answer their questions. They were able to go back to the text a second time and look again for main ideas, questions and things that confused them.

How did the Collegial Circle assess whether the outcome was met?

We tried out the methods and ideas that we discussed and developed in our meetings on our new class of students. We met after trying out the text coding and question development to assess how our students performed.

The simple coding gives the students an individual way to communicate how they are understanding the text. The students are able to show their thinking in a new way. They also have a way to record their thinking that they can go back to more than once in order to fully understand the text.
