We felt that, as a group, we held meaningful conversations which led to sometimes a change in practice based on the lessons presented in the book as well as teaching students and practicing ourselves, reading through different lens. We felt that although the book examples were geared to an older audience (middle/high school) there was still much we could glean from it and incorporate in our own classroom practices.
