FINAL REFLECTIONS

Was the goal of your Collegial Circle met? Please explain.

Yes. We compared many types of assessments and interpreted the results looking at both anecdotal and test scores. We created review materials for the midterm that filled gaps in the midterm, and in doing so discovered and shared resources that we discovered mostly on the internet. Some of the researching for materials led to implementation of other resources which were shared.

How did the members of this Collegial Circle assess whether the outcome was met? What evidence was utilized to assess your progress?

During meetings participants discussed assessments and practices that were working. We also analyzed areas of past weaknesses and discussed strategies to improve the results and outcomes from using those strategies.

Our worked helped us use the strategies better. We commented that sequences went better than in past years because of the strategies we used.
