## Was the outcome/goal of this Collegial Circle met? Explain.

Our outcome/goals of this collegial circle were met and more.

- 1. We learned how turnitin services could be utilized and realized it was not an effective way to administer, collect or grade SLO assessment in Physical Education class.
- 2. We developed a greater understanding of the rubrics from literacy design. This basic understanding guided our development and implementation of many of our units this year including the weight training unit and review sessions.
- 3. Through our work in the collegial circle we gained additional exposure to the grading rubrics for assessing student written work. We generated and adopted writing exemplars to clearly delineate student work of all levels. These exemplars were also uses as teaching aids during the review sessions.
- 4. We generated an effective plan for administering the SLO assessment and local exam to all students, while addressing individual accommodations. We created a chart that includes: class periods, teachers teaching, a breakdown of students in each class by teacher, computer labs

available in the building, and number of computers available in each lab. This chart serves as a tool for the effective implementation of the SLO and an action plan for reserving computer labs. We also generated an action plan for meeting the needs of all students, including those with testing accommodations. We developed a bank of multiple choice questions for each of the 12 terms cover in the 11/12 curriculum. We then worked to develop a better understanding of how to create higher level thinking by reading and reviewing documents like, "14 Rules for Writing Multiple-Choice Questions." The knowledge gained from these documents was used as a guide to edit and revise all questions used for the local exam that was administered on May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Throughout the course of the final units, mini quizzes were given at the beginning of classes to assess student understanding. The data collected from these mini quizzes was utilized to guide our focus of the 2-day review session.

#### How did the Collegial Circle assess whether the outcome was met?

Our group knew the Collegial Circle outcomes were met through our successful administration and completion of the SLO assessment and local exams.

# How did your work impact teaching/learning? Include student work samples, lesson plans, peer reviews, etc.

Our understanding of the rubrics from literacy design collaborative and how to grade written work help to guide the development and implementation of a number of lesson plans. Charts were created to aid in the successful implementation of the SLO and local exam. Mini quizzes with higher order thinking were used to assess student understanding and the data collected was used to guide review sessions.
