- 3. What do you wonder?







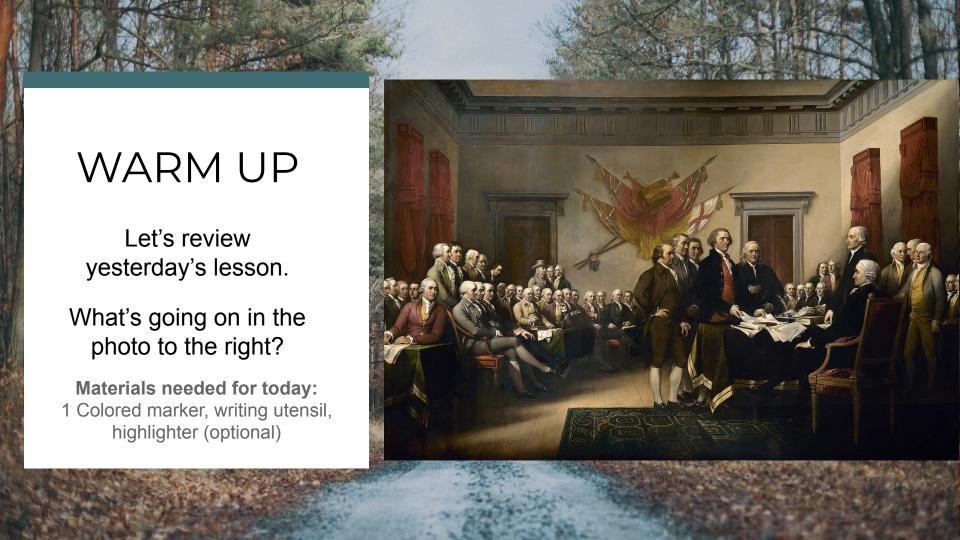

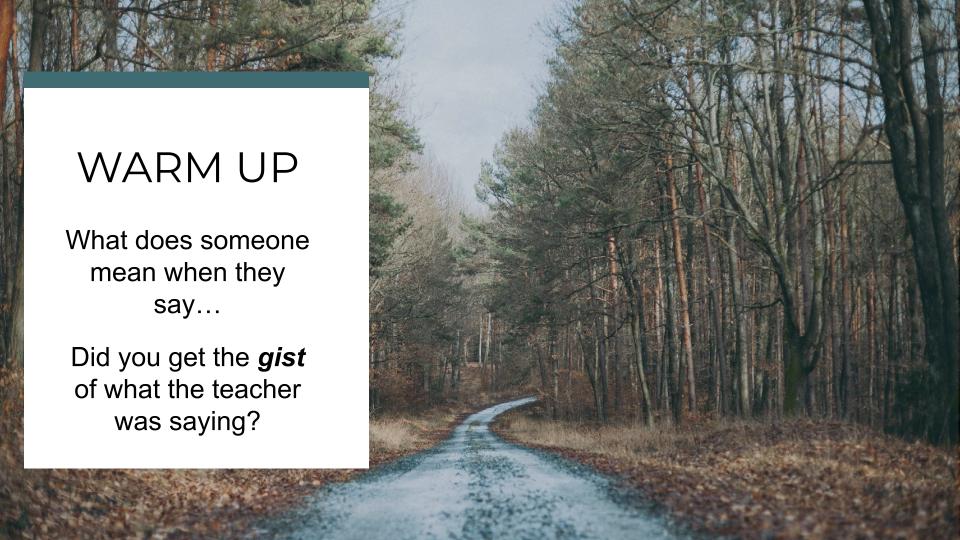

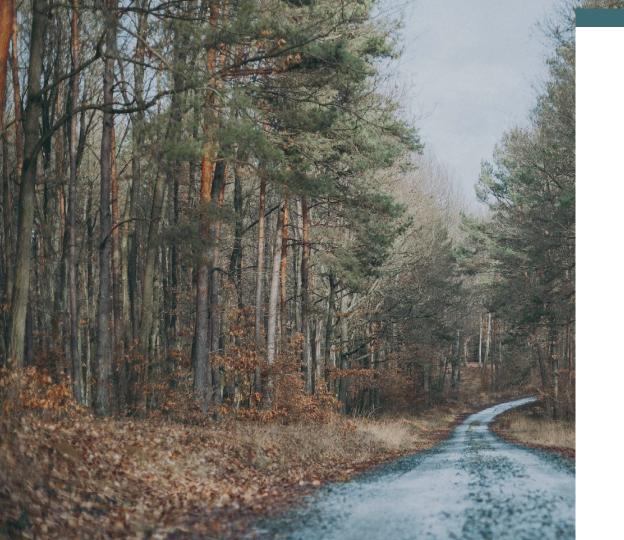
