PR Credits	24 credits with 4 credits required in English; 3 credits in Soc. St./Science/Math; 1 additional core credit (math, science or SS); 1 credit in Health/PE; 9 elective credits (see AR 217 for details)
Keystone Exams	Algebra 1 Biology Literature
Retake Recommendation	Yes. General education students must retake twice in the following year during the winter window and if necessary, spring window (Total of 3). This is a local recommendation.
Supplemental Instruction	Available through Supplemental Course or Subject-Specific Asynchronous Resources
Special Education	For an IEP team decision, the following options exist, (1) student retests (if close), (2) student participates in other pathway options, (3) demonstrates proficiency through IEP goals, or (4) waiver in rare cases. PVAAS projections may be used to help inform the decision-making process. Act 6 CTE options exist for special education students.
