Pittsford Central School District's Assistant Superintendent for Business, Darrin Kenney, has announced his plan to retire on September 15, 2022. The Board of Education accepted Mr. Kenney's letter of retirement at their April 5, 2022 meeting.

Serving as Assistant Superintendent for Business since 2005, Kenney has been responsible for providing overall direction and leadership for the District's Business Office, Operations, Maintenance & Security, Transportation and Food Services. "Mr. Kenney's expertise, dedication and passion for maintaining the fiscal health of Pittsford Central School District will be greatly missed," said PCSD Superintendent Michael Pero, who noted that "Mr. Kenney has created fiscally responsible budgets year after year, maintaining positive comptroller reports, ongoing audits, healthy reserves, and the best possible bond (credit) rating for a school district (Moody's Investor Services)."

Under Kenney's direction, the District has achieved utility and maintenance efficiencies through much needed capital improvements supported by the General Capital Reserve Fund, in turn generating state aid without new taxes. While the effects of COVID-19 significantly impacted NYS and public-school funding processes, PCSD entered the pandemic in its best fiscal health in decades, having never had a history of operating deficits.

Prior to working for Pittsford Schools, Mr. Kenney served as the Assistant Superintendent for Business and Operation in the Springville-Griffith Institute Central School District (2001-2005). Previous positions include Budget Director for the Greece Central School District, Business Administrator for Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES and Staff Accountant/Auditor for Raymond F. Wagner, P.C. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Accounting from Roberts Wesleyan College, a Master of Science in Education Administration, and a Certificate of Advanced Study in School Business Administration from the State University of New York at Brockport.

A graduate of Pittsford Mendon High School, Foote earned a B.S. in Special Education and Elementary Education from SUNY Geneseo; an M.A. in Computing in Education from Teacher's College, Columbia University; and Administrative Certification in Education Leadership from the University of Rochester. He currently resides in Fairport, NY, with his daughters Mallory and Mackenzie, ages 10 and 12. schools based on character, service and scholarship.

The National Merit® Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships that began in 1955. Approximately 1.5 million high school students enter the program each year by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®).

Each two-hour workshop is designed around one of the core principles of the CR-SE framework and has been developed to help participants apply an equity lens to various aspects of their work with students in various settings.



Vaccine Legislation

New York State legislation (Public Health Law 2164) has eliminated religious, non-medical exemptions from school vaccination requirements, effective June 13, 2019. The revised law specifies that children in a public, private or parochial school, without a medical exemption, must receive the required immunizations to attend or remain in school. The District will be required to exclude a child from school if these provisions are not in place.

Middle School Students Earn Top 10 Medals in NYS Science Olympiad

Congratulations to the Barker Road and Calkins Road middle school Science Olympiad teams who competed among 40 teams invited to the New York State competition in Syracuse. The Calkins Road team received two medals for top 10 finishes in "Meteorology" and "Storm the Castle" events, while the Barker Road team received two medals for top 10 finishes in "Crave the Wave" and "Dynamic Planet"



events. Overall, the Calkins Road team placed 26th in the state, and the Barker Road team placed 30th in the state! Each of the students in these top 40 teams that advanced to the NYS competition are considered a top 1.5% competitor for New York State in Science Olympiad.

Pittsford Rotary Club Students Make a Difference

Student members of Pittsford Rotary's Interact Club continued to make a difference in our communities this year! Their numerous activities included the Spread the Word Inclusion Campaign, Erie Canal Path Sweeps, Honor Flight Letters, food and charity drives, special events, the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation Walk, Foodlink Work Day, and the Special Olympics Polar Plunge for which they raised nearly \$6,000 in donations. During the past twenty years, over 1,700 PCSD Interact Club students have logged more than 22,000 hours of community service.





Virtual Tour of Auschwitz-Birkenau Concentration Camp Provides

Unique Learning Experience for Students Eighth-grade students from Barker Road Middle School recently participated in a live virtual tour of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Concentration Camp, presented by Dr. Jerzy Wojcik from Oświęcim, Poland. Offered for the first time to Barker Road students, the virtual tour was part of the Social Studies World War II unit of study as well as the eighth grade English unit, Courage in Life & Literature: Diary of Anne Frank.



In written reflections, students expressed how the virtual

tour impacted them: "I feel very grateful for everything I have;" "Future generations need to always see this;" "I do not have good enough words to explain how I feel. Awful is an understatement. I know we must see this information in order to prevent another Holocaust."

Mendon and Sutherland High Schools Among Best High Schools in U.S. News & World Report's 2022 National Rankings

In the number one and two spots among all Rochester area public high schools, Pittsford Mendon and Sutherland high schools again ranked in the top 2% nationwide according to U.S. News & World Report's 2022 Best High Schools rankings. Including nearly every public high school in the United States, the rankings evaluated 17,843 schools at the national, state and local level.

Mendon and Sutherland high schools were ranked number one and two among Rochester area high schools, respectively. The 2022 rankings reflect a consistent top 2% national ranking for both high schools over the past several years and a consistent overall score above 98/100.

U.S. News & World Report's ranking methodology focuses on six factors: college readiness, reading and math proficiency, reading and math performance, underserved student performance, college curriculum breadth and graduation rates. According to U.S. News & World Report, college readiness specifically measures participation and performance on Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate exams, and underserved student performance focuses on students who are Black, Hispanic, or from low-income households. The minority enrollment statistics in the report were listed at 25% for MHS and 28.5% for SHS. Science proficiency and performance were incorporated for the first time into the methodology.

Congratulations to Winter/Spring Athletes and Teams!

Pittsford athletes wrapped up the Winter and Spring Seasons with multiple Section V Titles, a NYS Title, and the honor of having all teams recognized as Scholar Athlete Teams by the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA). To receive Scholar-Athlete Team recognition, the team's average GPA must be greater than or equal to 90.0 for 75% of the roster. Individual student athletes earning a minimum GPA of 90.0 are recognized as Individual Scholar-Athletes even if their team did not qualify for an award.

John Santowski Named NIAAA Scholar Athlete of the Year



Mendon High School senior John Santowski was named Scholar Athlete of the Year, earning Student Athlete Scholarships from the National Interscholastic Athletic Administration Association's (NIAAA) Chapter 5, New York State and Region 1. Student athletes across New York State compete for these scholarships that recognize distinguished scholastic achievement, leadership and sportsmanship.

As a three-sport athlete with a grade point

average of 97.8, Santowski earned these awards for his dedication and leadership as team captain on Mendon High School's soccer, wrestling and lacrosse teams, and for a work ethic that has also led to excellence in academics. He is eligible for the NIAAA national award, which will be announced in July.

In reflecting on the success he has achieved as a student athlete, Santowski said he feels fortunate to have been team captain for multiple teams, but felt most impacted when he was chosen to wear the Todd Pelino #9 Jersey in honor of a former soccer player who lost his life in the World Trade Center on 9/11. "Being selected to wear the #9 Jersey has pushed me to be better in every aspect of life. With it being a well-known award in the community, I knew that not only would my teammates and coaches be looking up to me but also younger players that strive to be the best in all that they can do," he said.

"I am proud of John and all he has achieved," said Superintendent Pero. "Wearing the #9 Jersey and earning these impressive scholar athlete awards recognizes hard work and leadership, but it is also a reflection of John's character and the kind of leadership and character Todd Pelino demonstrated as a student athlete himself."

Safety and Security at Pittsford Schools

The recent tragedies in Buffalo and Texas are further reminders of the importance of a safety-first mentality in our schools. While there is no singular preventative measure for stopping harm, know that PCSD continuously looks to best practices and routinely works with experts in the field to maximize student, staff and visitor safety. School safety is often described in terms of layers. The more layers that are in place, the deeper the District's protection and safety.

Some of these layers include emergency alert buttons in every school, phones with enhanced security features, intruder locks on classroom doors, Mobilize Rescue Units, single point entry at all buildings, a computer-based visitor photo badge system, and security video equipment and personnel. In addition to these measures, the District engages in continuous emergency preparedness training, safety drills, and collaborates with the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, Town of Pittsford Fire Department, and Pittsford Ambulance. PCSD also puts considerable emphasis on prevention through mental health programs and services, threat assessment teams, the Code of Conduct and the "See Something, Say Something" national campaign to raise awareness about the importance of reporting


