Meeting minutes approved for February 7, 2019 with updates to reflect the concerns voiced by the middle schools and struggles that the high schools are reporting around the grading non-negotiables implemented this year.

Constituency sharing related to ILC/ILT work:

<u>Standards Leader feedback for ILC goals work</u>: When setting goals, be mindful of how much work can be feasibly done.

BRMS embarked on the first WIN (What I Need) day and will have a partner day in the next week.

BRMS: Social emotional activities in memory of the student that passed away are taking place in the building.

Update re: Elementary Report Card work:

Report card drafts were shared with teachers through conference days, surveys, steering and building meetings. Parents have given feedback through district meetings, survey and PTSA representatives. Responses from those groups have resulted in multiple revised versions that were then presented to Elementary Academic Council and Instructional Leadership Council for their feedback.

In February, a draft of the report card was finalized. This is the best work done by the <u>Elementary Report Card Committee</u> with input from many stakeholder groups. It accomplishes the goals set, which were to produce a tool for teachers to communicate with parents that is clear for parents to understand, more efficient for teachers to fill out, and reflective of the standards.

The ILC studied the finalized elementary report card and discussed plans for next steps to support teachers in its use for the 2019-2020 school year. Parents will be supported as the primary audience in future steps.

 Superintendent's conference day (April 8th) will be devoted to working in district grade levels for teachers to develop resources for alignment and consistency of reporting indicators.

- ILC made suggestions and gave input for a Guidance Document Draft for teachers and a video communication for the conference day work.

ILC Goal Setting Work:

Large Framing Five Year Goal: ILC investigates and champions collaborative instructional systems that drive dynamic, innovative and responsive educational experiences for all learners.

We utilize current research and best practices in:

- Curriculum and assessment
- Instruction practices
- Educational structures
- Community partnerships

The committee considered the IlC Goal grids that were created from the group thinking from previous meetings.

The grids note areas of focus, work on that area in process, and approximate timeline (1, 3, 5 years).

Discussed revisions will be updated on grids for the next ILC meeting.

Next Generation Skills Work:

Goal: Create rubrics as a tool to help teachers embed and assess NGS skills in their learning plans.

Previous work at ILC led to the creation of a model rubric. The Next Generation Skills sub-committee continued the work and set up rubrics for the commencement level students in each of the skill areas outlined and templates for the intermediate and elementary grades.
