Welcome to new members:

Review of committee norms: The committee revisited the norms for understanding and edits/additions.

After the committee survey discussion, it was decided to add to one of the norms. Stick to the agreed upon items to be shared out and respect the confidentiality of conversations.

Review and discussion of DPT Survey:

Takeaways:

- o The committee considered comments about communication between the buildings/constituents and ILC. Members agreed to keep the focus on the work their building ILT is doing. Information about Social Emotional Learning can come from the Student Services Director. The committee will continue to identify what is appropriate to share with the buildings/constituents. If time allows, a roundtable sharing of other items can take place at the end of each meeting.
- Subcommittees are well received as a way to move ILC projects forward.
- o Everyone's opinion matters. It is important to keep in mind that ILC is a safe place for discussion.
- A good amount of time is spent reviewing and assessing high school curriculum. Something to think about.

- It is impressive to see the functionality of a committee this large. Survey comments note a well-structured and functioning committee. Well done by this group and its facilitators.
- o The ILC structure is a model for other committees to be successful. Our time is well spent here.

Critical feedback from the survey serves to make the committee better.

ILC Goal Setting Work: Establishing the next phase of goals for this group.

Members watched an informative video and consulted the District Vision Statement, ILC charter and committee feedback to inform goal setting for the next several years. ILC is the vision group that will guide the future growth of Pittsford Schools.
