Communicated with counselors from both high schools to review the survey process



Overall, this represents a 13% response rate.


239 potential Mendon students +208 potential Sutherland students =

447 (60/447=.1342)



### Class of 2019 Gender Responses (Optional question)










### Class of 2019 Race Responses














Attending a 4-year college program in NY











If employed, what do you do for work?"







## "Have you changed jobs since graduation?"







## "What technology tools do you currently use/access most?"

Themes that emerged:

25 out of 51 responses mentioned they use Microsoft Office similar to previous classes. In fact, usage was up 14% from class of 2018

5 mentioned Google tools.

14 out of 51 responses mentioned a personal computer.

**5** graduates listed a phone similar to previous classes. Down 5% from class of 2018

12 mentioned programming languages. (MATLAB, Python, VS Code)


7 mentioned computer aided design.(New this year)

4 mentioned Adobe programs which is a noticeable decline from past years. (Bounced back up after dropping last year)

2 mentioned ChatGPT (New this year)

## "What advice would you give to a high school student today?" Themes that emerged from responses:

#### Explore interests and different coursework; you have choices and options. 17 Graduates

e.g., "Take advantage of the elective and/or AP classes it can help give you an idea what you want to major in or give you some pre-existing knowledge. Additionally, the relationships you make are important- get in the habit of communicating with teachers so it is more of a habit to do so with professors."

"Relax," "Slow down," "Be Happy," or "Enjoy it." Focus on life balance and mental health. 9 Graduates e.g., "Focus on your emotional health and mental well-being above all. Grades can feel like they are everything and the determining factor for your future but how you are emotionally is just as important to you being successful and happy. Don't sacrifice your mentality for an impressive high school career, you will get into a good school with the education you receive."

#### Good study skills and work hard pay off in college; you will be well prepared. 6 Graduates


e.g., "I would say that taking your studies seriously will pay off, no matter what people say about the value of the grades that you achieve. Going through the exercise of taking responsibility for your own learning, setting goals for yourself, and working to meet your own expectations, even if what you're learning feels useless, will help you immensely. Plus, the stuff you learn in classes almost always is applicable or helpful in the real world."

#### Build relationships and network. 3 Graduates

e.g., "Putting in the time and effort at Sutherland will put you miles ahead of your peers upon graduation. However, it's equally important to choose the people around you who make you the person you want to be, challenge you to do better,

and support you when you fail. You've got this:)"
