Committee goals

- 1. Sharing success statement
- 2. Educating school community (the committee recognizes that our initial focus should be on the success statement until we have results from the culture survey)

Educating our community

 Students- SLT (secondary leadership team) to look at student groups to bring the success statement to; athletic teams- involve Scott Barker; Clubs; empowering student leaders; recognition that each building has its own SEL characterization (ie- Thornell Road Way, ACES, Core principles, etc)

Recommendations:

- a. Student groups to be brainstormed at SLT- student leader groups- effective roll-out ideas for success statement
- b. Teams and clubs/extracurriculars, student councils, Superintendent's Cabinet, WEB LINK crew to include elements of success statement in trainings
- <u>Community-</u> monitors in our schools; banners; PTSA events (Fun Nights, etc) should consider inclusivity in training and recruitment <u>Recommendations:</u>
 - a. PAC group presentation on success statement
 - b. PTSA groups presentation on success statement
- 3. **Staff-** Making it meaningful for teachers so that they make it meaningful for staff; *Success statement activities* (*Superintendent's Day; faculty meetings; ILT; Standards meetings*); *should this all be at the same time and place? Super Day in the fall?* Opening Day activities- The committee understands that there are many structures in the district that can be utilized to share a common message. Likewise, there should be some autonomy in each building so that the message can be shared in a way that aligns with their individual culture and/or goals.

Recommendations:

- a. First 'package' of training- success statement activities for staff
- b. Next 'package'- based on results of culture survey

Other ideas to consider:

- 1. Creation of a video to bring success statement to life- showing all students and staff and their experiences with feelings of 'being left out'
- 2. Should we have a theme or focus on inclusivity for Pittsford Pride or other building level awards
- 3. Can success statement be on the planners that students get?
- 4. Guiding principles, references, etc to give to all groups to guide conversations
- 5. Theme for the year? CAP goals to integrate inclusivity
- 6. How to get the success statement in the hands of the kids
- 7. End of year culminating activities surrounding inclusivity
- 8. Designated success statement liaison?
- 9. Continue to gather information about upcoming trainings
