Transform your World (Background Mural)

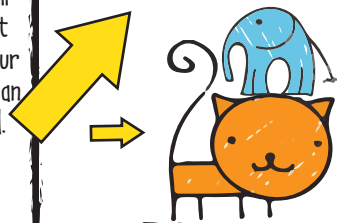
