	<ul> <li>can we provide follow up opportunities for people who need additional support?</li> <li>The timeliness of when someone attends an activity is going to impact their ability to apply it. Having a Microsoft Team that houses PTC activities is a great way to provide support for people who need to go back to the learning when they are ready to use it.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>People need time to digest the learning and then time to implement it. We can consider asking provocative questions in our follow-ups and seek examples of people taking the learning to the application level in their practice.</li> <li>Are there opportunities to provide the same activity in different formats to meet people where they are? Some people are comfortable with asynchronous learning but others need live support via Zoom or face-to-face. Can we differentiate delivery methods to give people the best format for their learning?</li> </ul>
	We will continue to have discussions related to ways in which we can improve the professional learning we provide to teachers – specifically in the area of follow-up surveys related to impact and implementation of the learning.
	Feedback from this article was positive and PB members agreed they would like to read another article from the February 2021 issue of <i>Education Leadership</i> at a future meeting.
