- BOCES services to support regular teaching and summer school

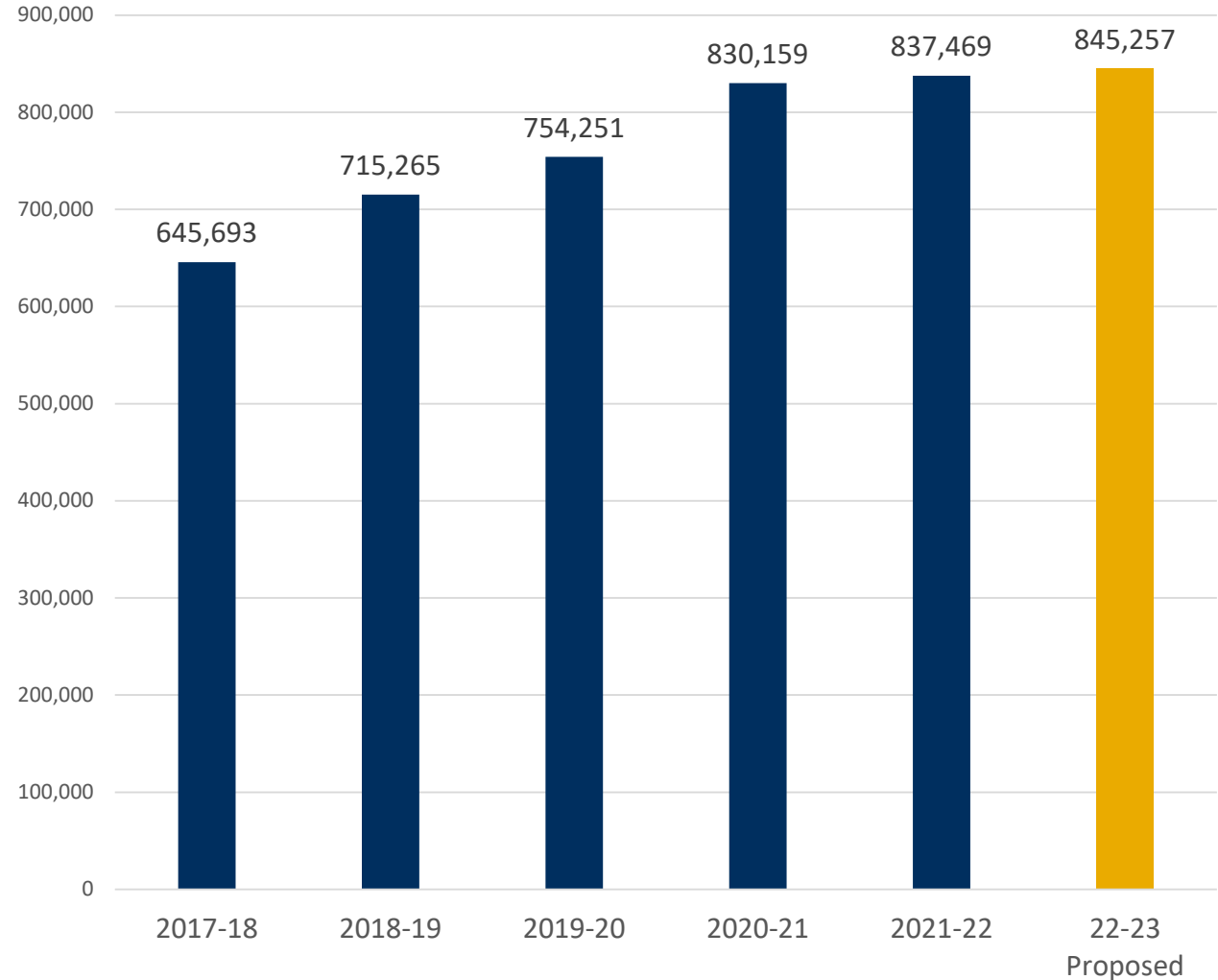
Budget History

- BOCES services – Project Lead the Way, 3-8 Assessment Scoring, select software applications, professional learning

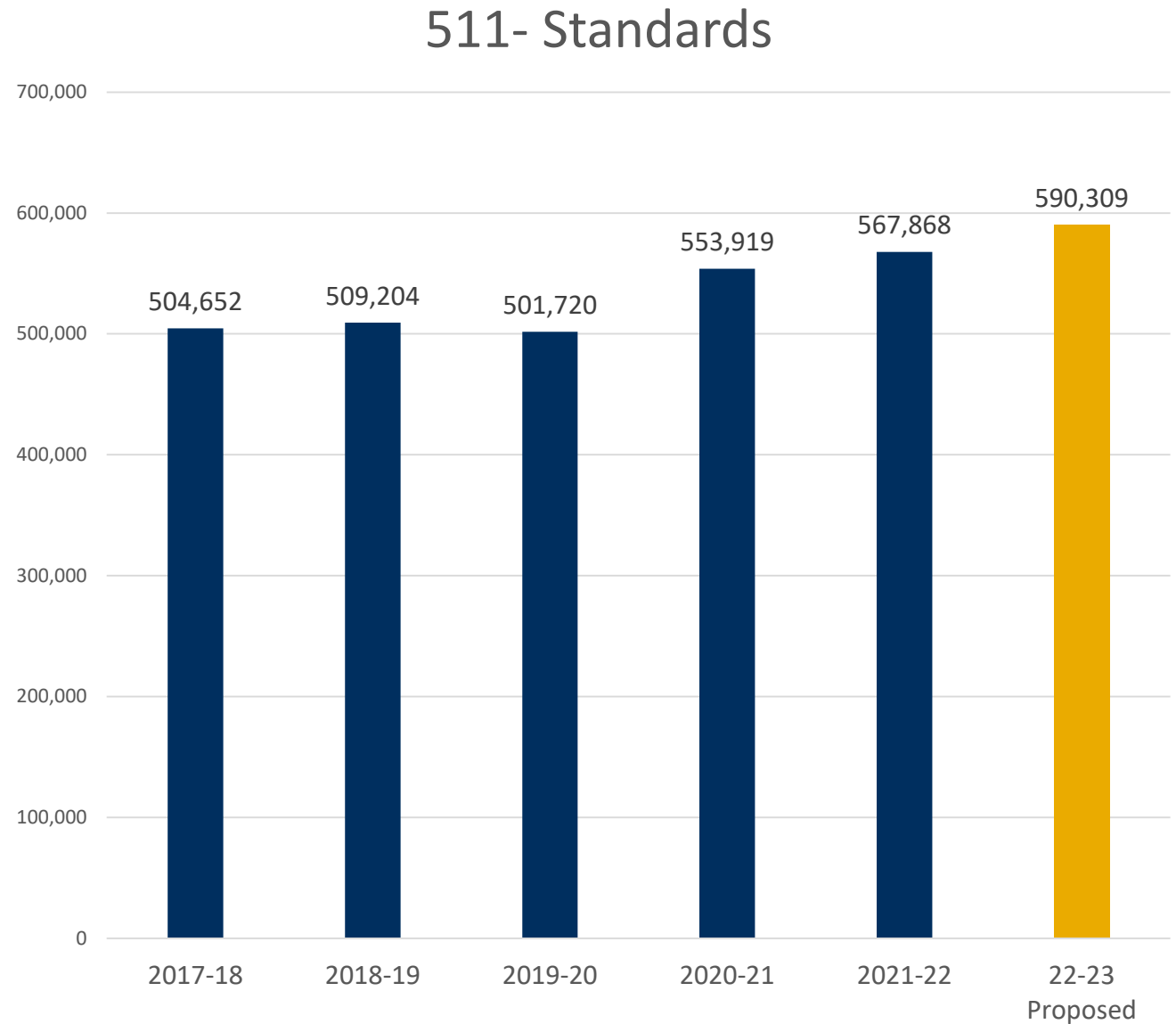

Standards Leaders are teacher leaders with responsibility for overseeing curriculum and assessment development and implementation within each of the disciplines.

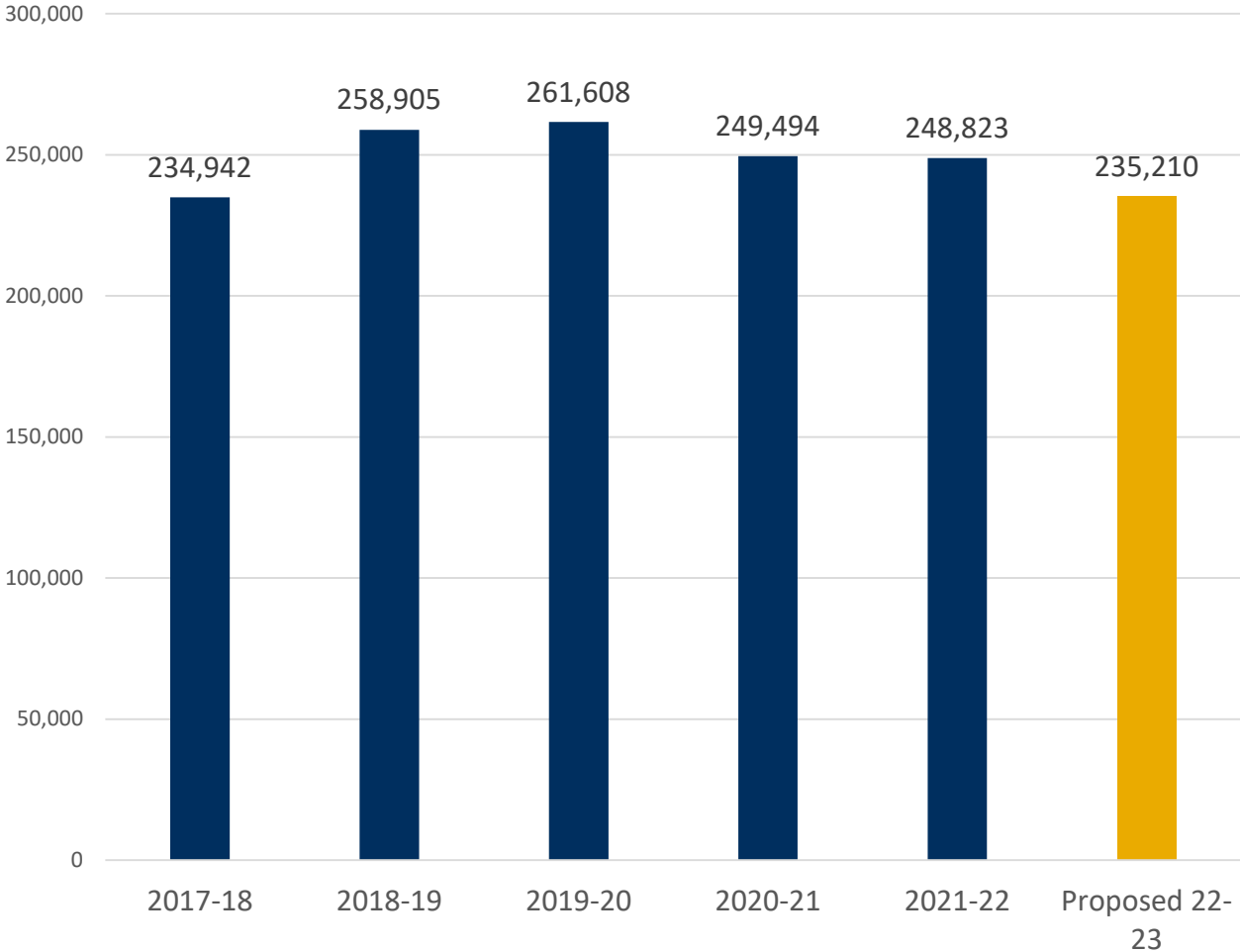

This budget category supports the office of the Teacher Center Director; professional learning opportunities are supported by multiple other budget codes, the NYS Teacher Center Grant, and the Title II Grant

The Teacher Center coordinates all in-house professional learning, including Induction and Mentoring for teachers new to Pittsford.

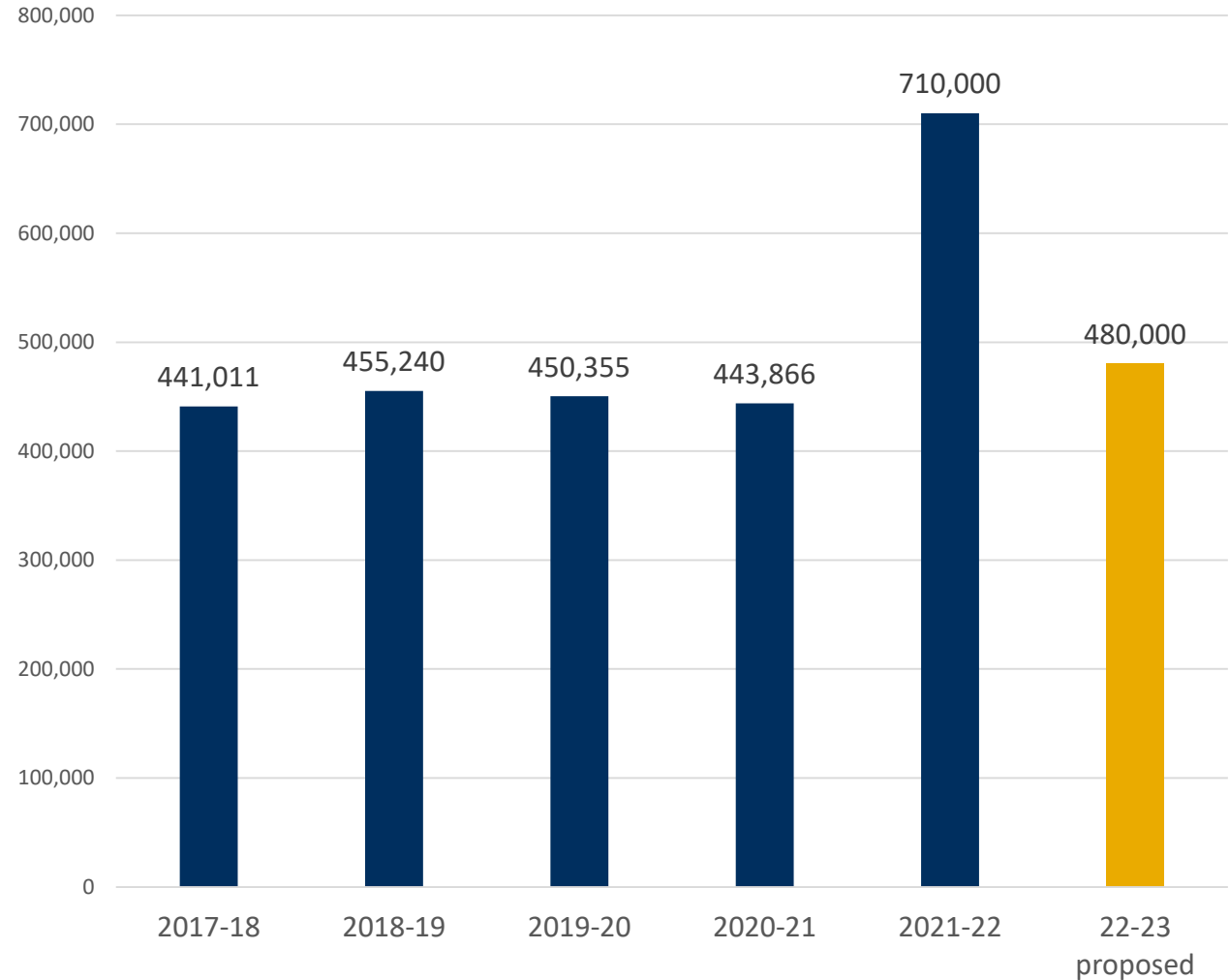

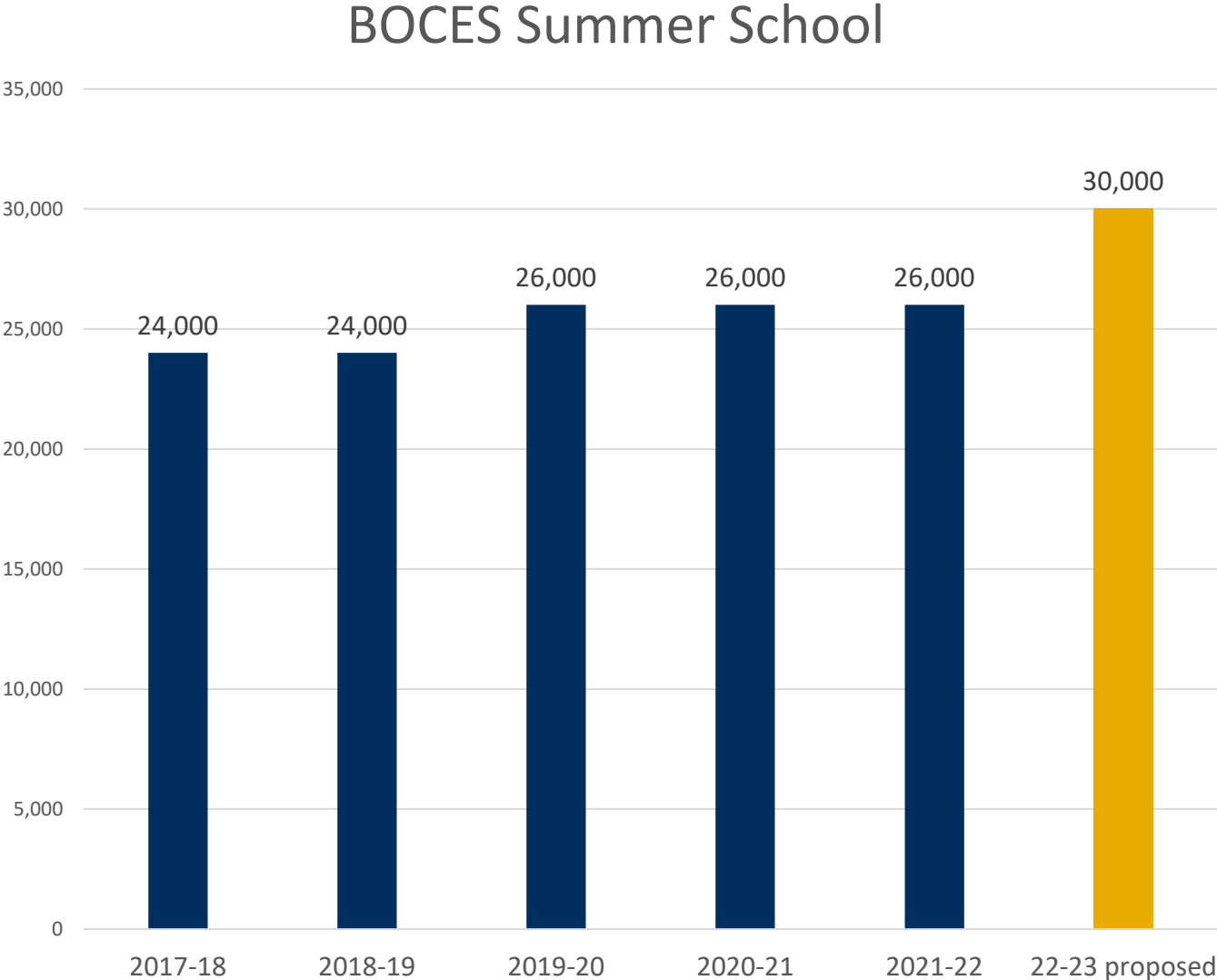

- Cooperative summer school for credit-recovery or Regents exam re-takes

Proposed 15.38% increase; anticipating some additional need for summer school support for students based on Covid impacts

Celebrations

- Greater **alignment of essential curriculum and instruction** across grade levels and buildings than in previous years
- Significant work being done in the areas of English/Language Arts and Social Studies to better reflect **NYSED Culturally Responsive-Sustaining Education Framework**
- Begun the work of integrating the **NYS Social Emotional Learning Benchmarks** and the **NYS Computer Science/Digital Fluency Standards** into curriculum and instruction, K-12
- Substantial work done on protocols for the **review of all instructional materials**, to include comprehensive review for diversity and representation

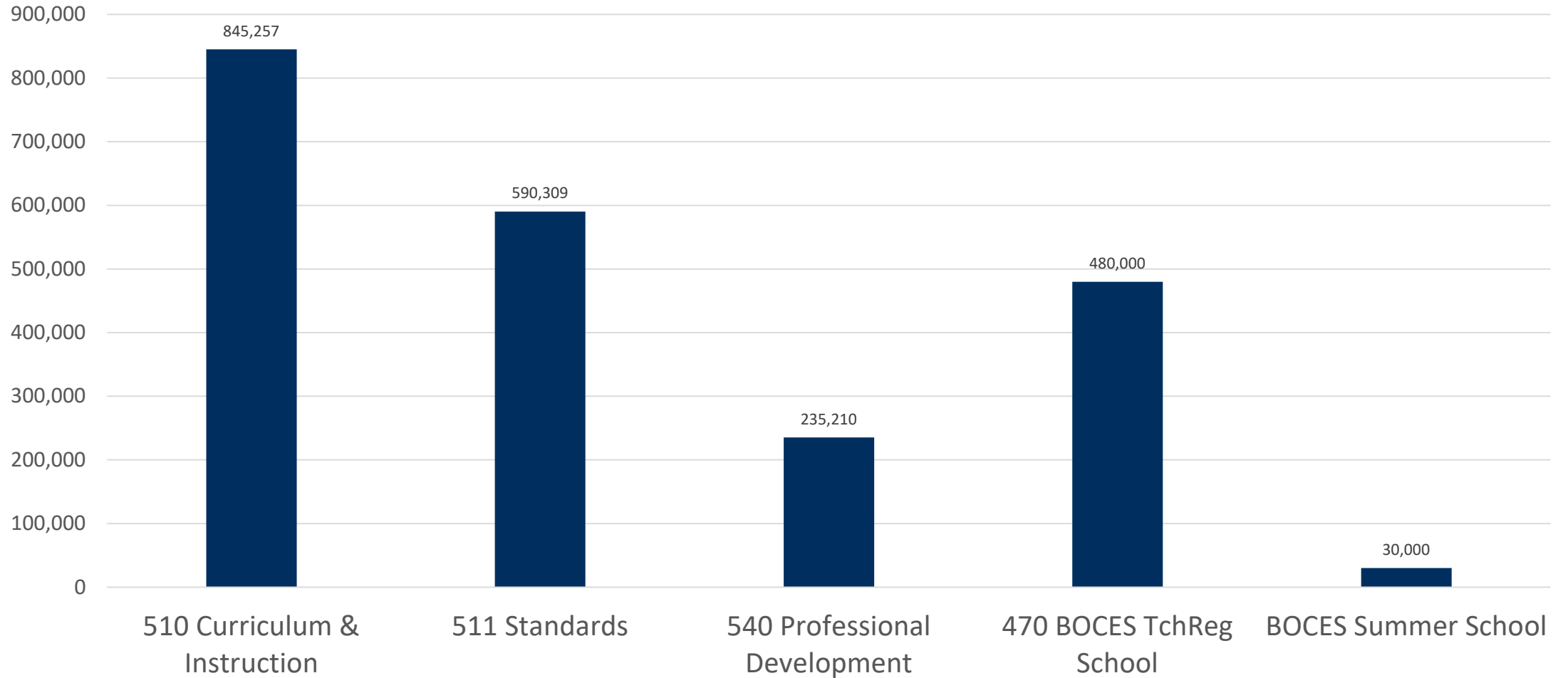
Celebrations

- Students and teachers have embraced **instructional technology tools** and are using them effectively to support teaching and learning
 - Most notably, the success of our one-to-one laptop initiative for grades 6-9
- **Multiple platforms for professional learning** (in person, synchronous, asynchronous, blended) have been well received and allowed more teachers to access critical learning in a format, and at a time, that best meets their needs
- **Critical conversations** taking place regarding assessments, enrollment in honor/AP level courses, and instructional models that reflect our commitment to **equity**.

Planning forward

- Continued work on **English/Language Arts and Social Studies Curriculum** to align with the NYS CR-SE Framework and our commitment to equity
 - Social Studies Inquiry Units
 - Integration of supplementary resources
 - Diversification of texts
- Continued work to understand and integrate **SEL Benchmarks and Computer Science/Digital Fluency Standards** K-12, all disciplines
- Growth of our **one-to-one laptop initiative** to include additional grade levels
- Professional learning opportunities focused on **culturally responsive pedagogy**
- Professional learning to support the embedding of **Tier I interventions and differentiation** into course work at all levels
- **Instructional responses** to lingering Covid related learning gaps
- **Social/emotional and mental health support** for students and staff

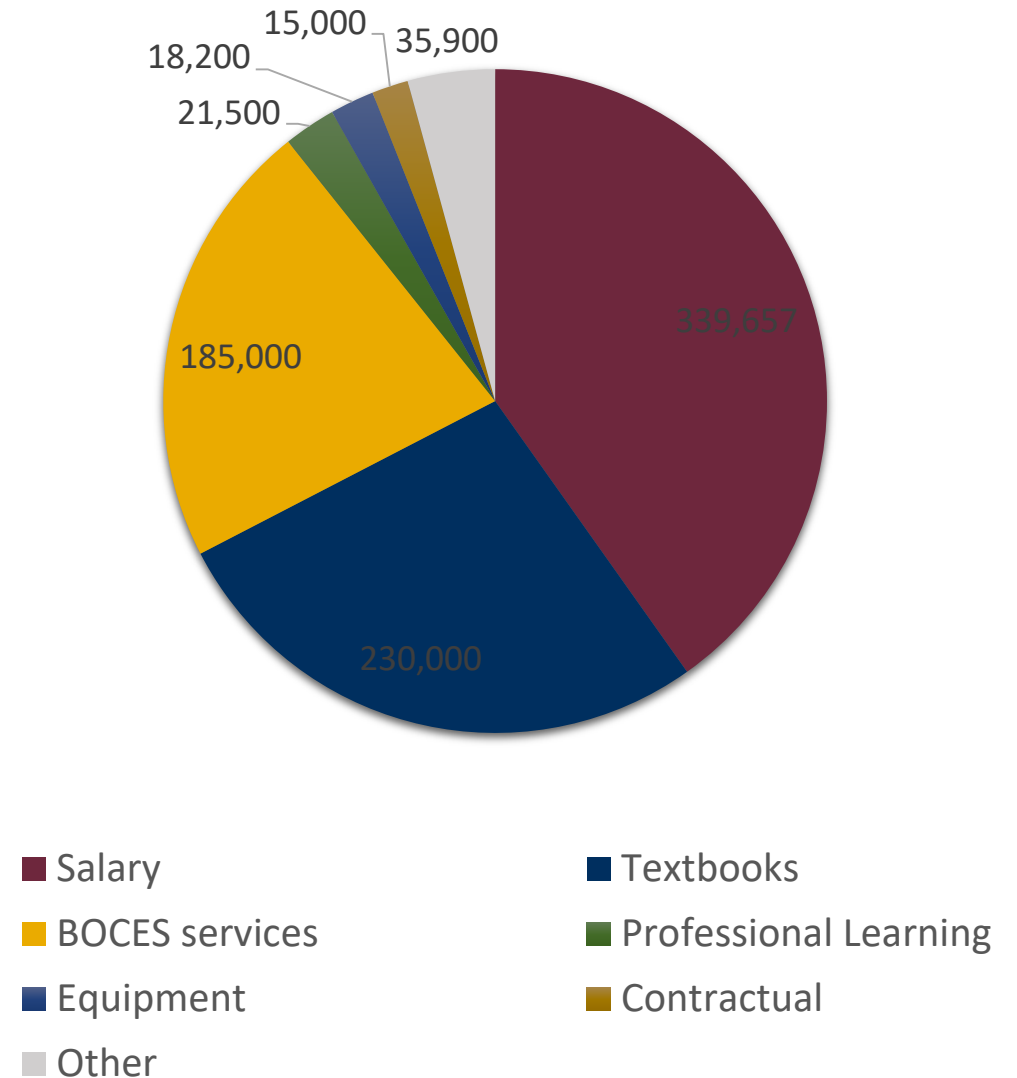
2022-2023 Proposed Budget

Total \$845,257; \$153 Per Pupil

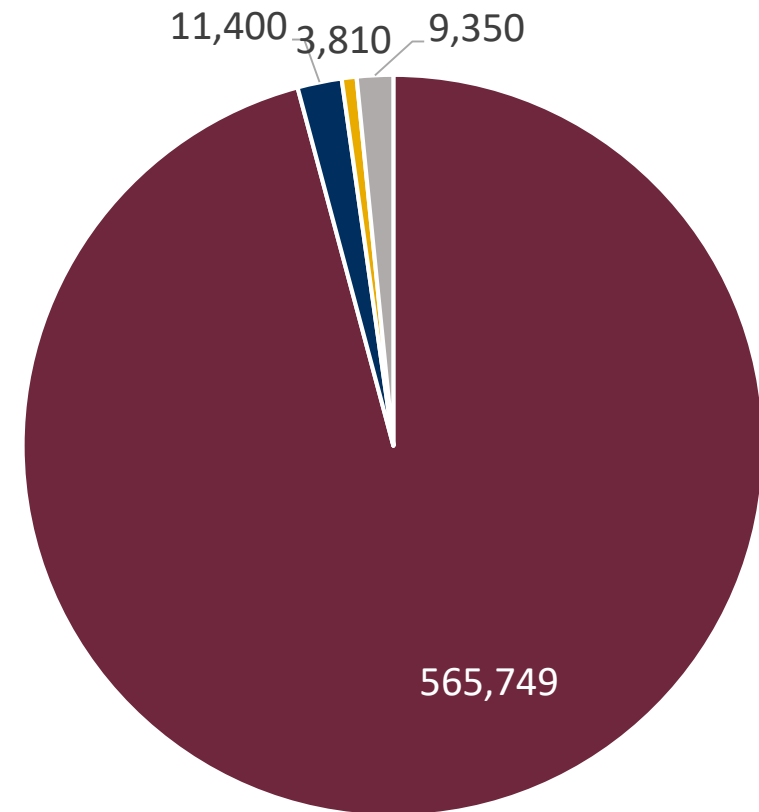
- **Salary** – Admin and Clerk salaries; Curriculum Development and Steering Payments; Admin and Teacher in-service payments
- **Textbooks** – Textbooks, consumable workbooks, and subscriptions to online resources essential to the delivery of curricular standards
- **Professional Learning** – Travel and Conference, consultants
- **Equipment** – Music equipment and repairs
- **Contractual** – Rentals, services
- **Other** – Paper, printing, membership, mileage



511 – Standards Proposed Budget by Category

Total \$590,309; \$107 Per Pupil

- **96%** of the budget code is allocated to standards leaders salaries, stipends, and summer work days
- **Standards Leaders** are teacher leaders who oversee curriculum and assessment development, support the implementation of best instructional practices, and offer embedded as well as formalized professional learning opportunities for teachers.
