Framework & Process

- Superintendent and leadership team develop an educational plan to meet the needs of all students
 - Plan constrained by limits on local decision-making, due to mandated tax levy cap
 - Challenging to:
 - Address growing enrollment
 - Create long-term plans that address student needs
 - Introduce program improvements
- Superintendent and BOE sub-committee work with Citizens Budget Advisory
- Superintendent presents proposed budget to Board of Education for adoption,
- Budget referendum presented to community for voter approval

Systemic Priorities

Advance the District's strategic vision for a rigorous, accessible, personalized approach to learning:

- Strengthen alignment/coherence of content and skills
- Maintain a highly trained faculty & workforce
- Use of multiple measures of assessment
- Build/Develop Thinking IB Learning Traits:
 Inquirers, Knowledgeable, Thinkers, Communicators, Principled,
 Open-minded, Caring, Risk-takers, Balanced, Reflective
- Develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect (IB)

Provide a rigorous, research-based, personalized learning experience for every student is reflected in long term budget priorities over time.







Budget Priorities & Challenges



Budget Priorities

- Maintain class sizes and program choices amidst increasing enrollment & participation.
- Create an additional special education class at HHS (PACE Program) & Kindergarten CD at Parsons
- Finalize International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (PYP)
 - Introduce Elementary World Languages
- Strengthen instructional coherence K-12
- Maintain professional development to ensure highly trained faculty & workforce
- Sustain International Baccalaureate Programme & Middle Years Program (MYP)
- Continue to fund IB and AP testing fees for all students at HHS
- Maintain summer programs for students with academic needs and high participation extension courses - College Essay Writing, Reading with the Huskies
- Scale back summer enrichment & curiosity camps; federal funding expires in 2024
- Continue health and safety improvements districtwide



Budget Challenges

- Significant enrollment growth ahead of demographic projections
- Operational Expenses and Employee Benefits outpacing local and national inflation figures:
 - Largest increase in health insurance costs in over a decade
 - Second consecutive year of increased transportation costs
 - Steady increase in utility costs and property insurance
- National Inflation Metrics
 - o 22/23 4.7%
 - 0 23/24 8.0%
 - 24/25 4.12%
- State Foundation Aid remains flat
- Tax cap limited to lesser of CPI or 2%
- Over the last nine years the average tax levy has been 1.94%, while inflation averaged 2.59%

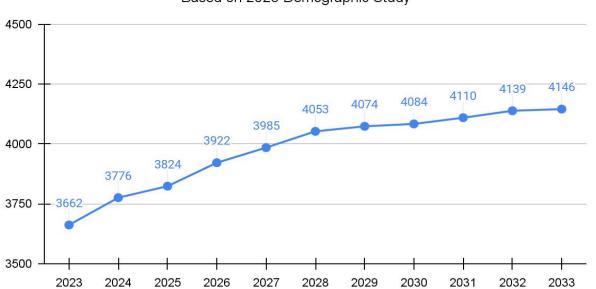

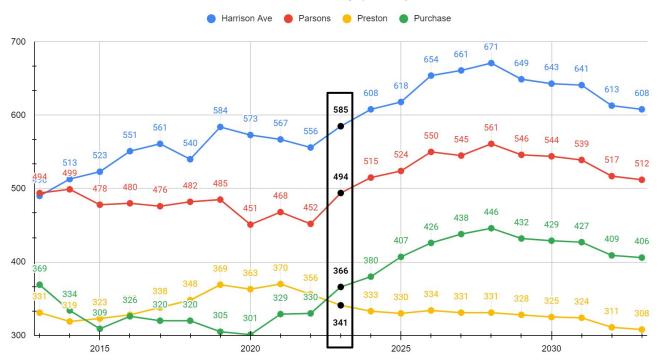




Historic & Projected School Enrollment

Historic & Projected School Enrollment

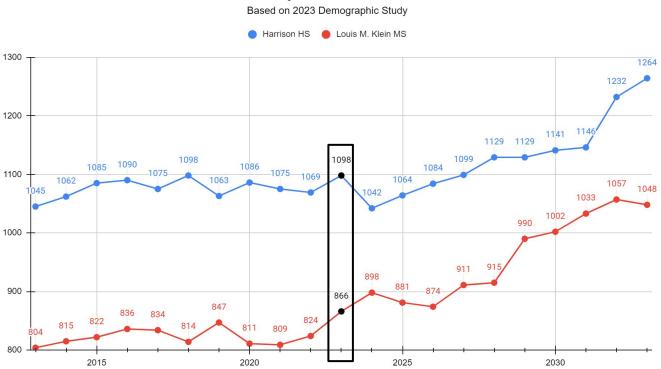

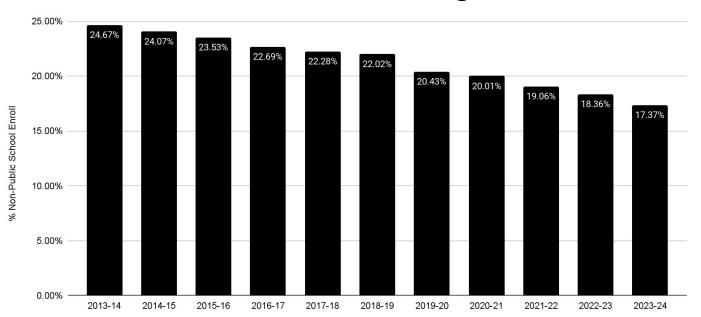

Budget Priorities: Staffing Needs K-12

2023-24 Unbudgeted Positions Due to Increased Enrollment

- 2 FTE Elementary Teachers
- 5 FTE Teacher Aides

2024-25 New Positions Due to Increased Enrollment & Program Improvements

- 3 FTE Elementary/Special Education
- 2 FTE Elementary World Language
- 0.5 FTE Psychologist
- 0.4 FTE Science Research
- 2 FTE Special Education Teaching Assistants

Total New Positions for 2024-25 Budget: 14.9 FTE

Bond Update

Phase II (Summer 2025 - 2027)

- All elementary schools receive new main offices and more secure entrances
- Purchase classroom and cafeteria addition
- Parsons 3rd floor renovation & handicap access
- Harrison Ave classrooms, library, music rooms
- Preston classrooms, music rooms & handicap access
- Harrison High School: Classroom additions, turf field, fitness center, STEM center

Newly established capital reserve fund offsets some Bond capital costs to taxpayers.

Budget Challenges: Cost Drivers

Employee Costs

- Salary Costs \$2.5M
 - (Inclusive of 14.9FTE in New Positions)
- Teacher & Employee Retirement
 Plans \$667,334 (9%)
- Health Insurance \$1,925,000 (10%)
- Retiree Medicare \$105,000 (6%)

Operational Costs

- Transportation \$417,386 (4.8%)
- Electricity, Natural Gas, Water, Sewer
 \$250,615 (18%)
- Liability/Property Insurance \$69,950
 (16%)
