## **Guidelines for Home Use of Low Incidence Equipment**

- 1. Provisions to use school equipment at home:
  - The student must qualify as a student with a low incidence handicapping condition.
  - The IEP team must determine that the student requires the use of the equipment at home in order for the student to benefit from his/her educational program. This is documented in the IEP.
- 2. District of Special Education Accountability (DSEA) will be responsible for the loss or damage of equipment if the loss or damage through normal use. Districts will be responsible for tracking the location of the equipment.
- 3. The DSEA or the repair of the equipment.
- 4. Equipment will be returned to the district when the district is not in session for the school year and extended school year.
- 5. Parents/Guardians will agree in writing to:
  - secure the equipment and supervise proper use
  - provide necessary and safe transportation of the equipment between home and school
  - acknowledge that the equipment was purchased for district use with state funds
  - assume responsibility for the loss or damage of equipment if the loss or damage occurs through negligence or misuse of publicly owned equipment used at home or in other non-school related activities or settings.
  - receive training in the use of the equipment before it can be sent home
  - return the equipment to the district should they move out of the Marin SELPA.
