

RESOLUTION NUMBER 10-2324

ADJUSTING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE FALLBROOK UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT TRUSTEE AREAS

RECITALS

- A. Members of the Board of Trustees of the Fallbrook Union High School District of San Diego County, California ("District"), are elected in a "by-trustee area" election system, established in accordance and in compliance with all applicable laws;
- B. In February 2022, the District redrew trustee areas following the 2020 decennial census as required by law;
- C. During the November 2022 election, no candidates filed to run for office in Trustee Area 2;
- D. The District attempted to appoint a representative due to a "failure to elect." However, no candidates presented themselves;
- E. In September 2023, the District attempted to fill the seat by a special election. No candidates ran for the position;
- F. The District again attempted to appoint a trustee due to the "failure to elect." However, again, no community member expressed interest in the position;
- G. Education Code section 5019 permits the County Committee on School Organization to rearrange the boundaries of trustee areas upon receipt of a proposal made by resolution from the District's Board of Trustees.
- H. Education Code section 5019 requires that trustee areas comply with the requirements and criteria contained in Elections Code section 21130;
- I. The Board of Trustees retained legal counsel and a demographic consultant to ensure that the trustee areas as adjusted complied with the California Fair Maps Act, the California Voting Rights Act, the federal Voting Rights Act, and other applicable law;
- J. The District established a publicly accessible webpage dedicated to the redistricting process that explains the redistricting process, identifies procedures for the public to provide comment, contains a calendar of workshops and hearings, and contains draft maps and demographic information for community and Board consideration;
- K. The District published demographic information on its website identifying that a trustee area can be created to give a minority group a majority vote;

- L. On February 12, 2024, the District held a community workshop regarding the redistricting process to solicit input regarding the composition of the District's neighborhoods, communities of interest and election districts. The District gave notice of the first workshop on February 9, 2024;
- M. On February 28, 2024, the District held a second community workshop regarding the redistricting process to solicit input regarding the composition of the District's neighborhoods, communities of interest and election districts. The District gave notice of the second workshop on February 24, 2024;
- N. The Board of Trustees held three public hearings concerning possible adjustments to the trustee area boundaries at duly noticed Board meetings on March 5, March 13, and April 1, 2024. In the hour before each meeting, the Board solicited community input regarding the draft maps and made District counsel and/or the demographic consultant available to the community to answer questions and assist in proposing alternative draft maps;
- O. The Board of Trustees considered all public comments submitted via email, at the community workshops held on February 12 and 28, 2028, at the community forums held on March 5, March 13, and April 1, 2024, and during the map hearings held on March 5, March 13, and April 1, 2024;
- P. The Board of Trustees considered nine options prepared by its demographer, called Map 1, Map 2, Map 3, Map 4, Map 5, Map 6, Map 7, Map 8 and Map 9, for the purpose of redrawing the trustee areas to help ensure the filling of the current vacancy in Trustee Area 2 will be filled while continuing to comply with the California Fair Maps Act, the California Voting Rights Act, the federal Voting Rights Act, and other applicable laws;
- Q. The Board of Trustees requested that the demographer create Maps 4 through 9 in response to the public input received during the community meetings and forums; and
- R. The Board of Trustees held a final public hearing in connection with adoption of this resolution Adjusting the Boundaries of the Fallbrook Union High School District Trustee Areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. The Board of Trustees hereby approves the map entitled Map 9, a copy of which, together with the associated data sheet, is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference, as its trustee area boundaries for use at the District's November 2024 and subsequent governing board elections until a review and possible realignment of the trustee area boundaries are required pursuant to Education Code section 5019.5, following the release of the 2030 Census, or as otherwise permitted by law.

3. The Superintendent is authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to facilitate implementation of Exhibit A, including presenting this resolution to the San Diego County Committee on School Organization for review and approval and to the San Diego County Registrar of Voters for implementation for Board of Trustee elections.
4. In the event now-unforeseen technical adjustments are necessary to implement the trustee area boundaries contained in Exhibit A, the Superintendent is authorized to work with the San Diego County Committee on School Organization and the San Diego County Registrar of Voters and to consult with the District's demographic expert and legal counsel to implement any needed technical adjustments, provided such technical adjustments do not materially affect the demographics or intent of Exhibit A. Any such technical adjustments shall immediately be reported to the Board of Trustees.
5. The Superintendent shall consult with legal counsel to resolve all legal issues necessary to give effect to this Resolution.

The foregoing Resolution was ADOPTED at the regular meeting of the Board of Education of the Fallbrook Union High School District on the 17th day of April, 2024.

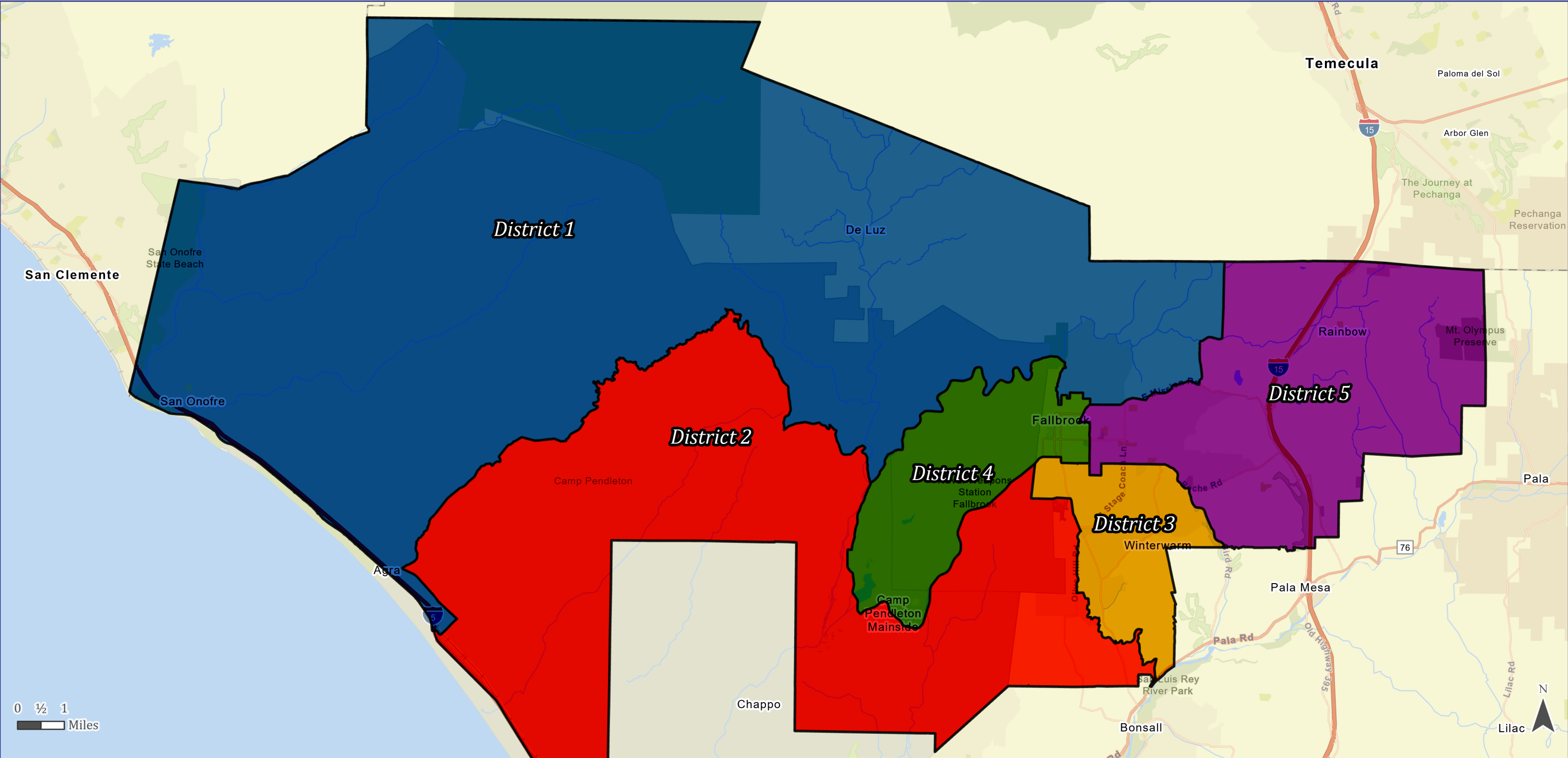

Disclaimer
Of necessity, the outer jurisdictional district boundaries shown here are based on Census block geography (rather than Fallbrook UHSD geography) and are approximations of the boundaries as implemented by election officials.

A Census block is the smallest geographic census unit. Blocks can be bounded by visible features such as streets, roads, streams, and railroad tracks, and by nonvisible boundaries, such as selected property lines and city, township, school district, and county limits. Census blocks change every decade.
