WHEREAS, the voters of Seaford Union Free School District, in the County of Nassau, New York (the "District") have heretofore on December 4, 2007, approved the expenditure of not to exceed \$21,577,404 for the construction of a building addition to the Seaford High School and alterations and improvements to all District school buildings and the sites thereof; and thereafter the Board of Education (the "Board") authorized the levy and collection of \$21,577,404 taxes therefore; and

WHEREAS, the Board has now determined that such building additions, alterations and improvements will be accomplished at a cost of not to exceed \$21,041,530, which will result in a savings of approximately \$535,874; and

WHEREAS, the Board has now further determined that it is necessary to construct a new access road at the Seaford Harbor Elementary School, which can be accomplished at a cost of not to exceed said \$535,874 savings.

RESOLVED:

(a) That the Board is hereby authorized to construct a new access road at the Seaford Harbor Elementary School on land to be acquired by the District, and to expend for such purpose \$535,874; (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the amount of not to exceed \$535,874 to pay such cost, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education; and (c) that bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of not to exceed \$535,874, and a tax is hereby authorized to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.
