TAX ANTICIPATION NOTE RESOLUTION OF SEAFORD UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, NEW YORK, ADOPTED JUNE 5, 2014, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$9,000,000 TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE RECEIPT OF TAXES TO BE LEVIED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2015.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SEAFORD UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF NASSAU, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Tax Anticipation Notes (herein called "Notes") of Seaford Union Free School District, in the County of Nassau, New York (herein called "District"), in the principal amount of not to exceed \$9,000,000, and any notes in renewal thereof, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of Sections 24.00 and 39.00 of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law").

RESOLUTION – TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES

TANS RESOLUTION (cont'd)

Section 2. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

(a) The Notes shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of real estate taxes to be levied for school purposes for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, and the proceeds of the Notes shall be used only for the purposes for which said taxes are levied.

(b) The Notes shall mature within the period of one year from the date of their issuance.

(c) The Notes are not issued in renewal of other notes.

(d) The total amount of such taxes remains uncollected at the date of adoption of this resolution.

Section 3. The Notes hereby authorized shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and shall be general obligations of the District, and the faith and credit of the District are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes and unless the Notes are otherwise paid or payment provided for, an amount sufficient for such payment shall be inserted in the budget of the District and a tax sufficient to provide for the payment thereof shall be levied and collected.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and the Law, and pursuant to Sections 50.00, 56.00, 60.00 and 61.00 of the Law, the power to sell and issue the Notes authorized pursuant hereto, or any renewals thereof, and to determine the terms, form and contents, including the manner of execution, of such Notes, and to execute arbitrage certifications relative thereto, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 5. The Notes shall be executed in the name of the District by the manual signature of the President of the Board of Education, the Vice President of the Board of Education, the District Treasurer, the District Clerk, or such other officer of the District as shall be designated by the chief fiscal officer of the District, and shall have the corporate seal of the District impressed or imprinted thereon which corporate seal may be attested by the manual signature of the District Clerk.

Section 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

DISCUSSION TOPIC:

Areas covered in the discussion on the Seaford Avenue School Zoning Vote by the Town of Hempstead – Fran Radman from Ingerman, Smith:

Mr. Conboy advised that the builder, BK at Seaford, originally envisioned a Golden Age Community 62 and above with a waiver for people who are 55 and above with 112 condo units

- No children; No rental properties; No abatements

At Town of Hempstead on May 20th Kate Murray asked attorney for Town to speak

- He advised that there had been a public hearing in early February
- Builder had removed their waiver seeking 55 and over and was now seeking 62 and over

After vote Mr. Conboy advised the Board of the outcome and asked District's attorney to do research on what happened and give legal opinion

- Still seeking documents from the Town of Hempstead
- Opinions still being developed.

Mr. Kahn advised that it was his understanding the builder was always applying for a Golden Age but with an exception from the Golden Age that allows it to go down to 55

- Builder pulled that request for the exception the morning of the vote

Attorneys Frances Radman and Christopher Venator spoke about:

- District's contract of sale with the builder
- Restrictive covenants with that contract and requirements of the Town of Hempstead
- Vote for the sale of the property
- Covenants and restrictions which run with the land, covenants and certain conditions survive delivery of a deed
- Town of Hempstead covenants and restrictions which they require Have contacted the Town Attorney's office and awaiting their response Understanding is that Town will not put resolution formally into writing until they receive the signed restrictive covenant from the District Trying to get more information from the attorney

Mr. Fagan clarified that the original contract and amendments and covenant have never been amended. This additional process is required by the Town of Hempstead.

Mr. Venator advised that the initial covenant is between the owner (Seaford) and the builder. The covenant the Town is now requesting is between the District and the Town of Hempstead. The covenants are not contradictory and will both be in effect.

Mr. Kahn asked about the provisions of Amendment Four holding and asked Mr. Venator to review that Amendment for the next discussion on this matter

Mr. Fagan verified with Mr. Venator that the Board could expect a complete legal opinion on this matter by the next meeting.

Superintendent Brian Conboy briefly explained the survey process to determine the need for a breakfast program for the 2014/2015 school year. He advised that the survey is done every year. He stated that the result of this year's survey determined no need for a breakfast program for the 2014/2015 school year. An opportunity was given to residents to ask questions concerning the survey process and/or the school district's decision to waive participation in the New York State Education Department's breakfast program. There were no questions.

Comments, Questions and/or Concerns Raised by the Public included:

- Why don't you just give kids breakfast; If somebody needs breakfast give it to them – don't have a vote
- Never seen a contract of sale as poorly drafted as this one Any covenants or amendments should be included with contract Developer did not request 62 age with modifications; said was going to be a 55 and over Board should get familiar with those things included in Golden Age zoning; Housing and Urban Development Section 8 is definitely part of it
- Did it cross anybody's mind that they wouldn't get a really representative vote when people were out of their homes 6 weeks after Hurricane Sandy
- It be in everyone's best interest to hold it to 55+ development CA zoned community

Developer would not apply for HUD Funds; would not include development in pending lawsuit

If you let the developer add the Town to the covenant the next move for the Town to toss the covenant restrictions out the window – not more 55 plus, not more children under 18 excluded and allows the developer to use HUD funds

Town of Hempstead BZO - Article 12 Section 121.1

- Should request CA zoning
- Should get a second opinion as to what as to what this community understood

Option from tax attorney as to what the tax impact will be from change to 62 and over

Attorney versed with Town of Hempstead zoning

Board/Attorneys:

- Town of Hempstead is in charge of zoning provisions Town is requesting the covenant
- Lawsuit has nothing to with this case; builder is not seeking HUD funds for this development
- Golden Age no children under 18 years of age
- Vote was 55 or older
- Zoning is 62 and over; builder was trying to get an exemption for 55 and over
- There will be no change in tax revenues
- Community did not want this opened zone did not want burden of additional children under 18 years of age

Request from some residents at Town hearing was for 62 and over
