Board President Bruce Kahn asked if Patrick Rail was present so he could introduce himself. Mr. Rail was not in attendance. Mr. Kahn thanked the Board and Administration for all their work on the budget. It was decided that no recess was necessary and they would go directly into the Regular Meeting.

Nassau-Suffolk School Boards Association Update - Brian Fagan

Board Vice President Brian Fagan spoke about the Nassau Suffolk School Boards Association and his involvement with the Association and the work they do.
